

Besides the motorboat events there will be three contests for the windjammers of the association. The feature of the sailboat competition will be the annual race for the Sewell Cup for catboats. The Romp, owned and sailed by Harry Buxton, of the Bay Head Yacht Club, will defend the trophy. She will endeavor to take the cup home to the club at the northern end of the bay for the fourth consecutive year. She has won it three times straight and is now being put into shape for the event. The other windjammers are being put into first-class trim and there promises to be keen competition for the trophy, emblematic of supremacy in catboat racing. Besides the big sailing event there will be the men's open race for sneak boxes of the one-design type, while the women of the five clubs of the association will compete in a special sailboat contest for sneak boxes.

The regatta will officially open with the start of the cruise of the fleets from the clubs of the South Jersey Yacht Racing Association next Friday. For the last three years the Atlantic City Yacht Club has made the championship races on Barnegat Bay a gala affair and for the first time 1st year, the South Jersey Association was fully represented in the races. This season because the regatta at the Corinthian Yacht Club of Cape May has been called off on account of war activities, the racing boats of South Jersey have had plenty of time to get in trim for the Barnegat Bay regatta and it is expected they will turn out strong for all of the events. On Friday evening the annual Sewell Cup dance will be held at the Seaside Park Yacht Club and an entertainment has been planned for the visiting yachtsmen both from the clubs of South Jersey as well as the organizations from the several sections of Barnegat Bay.
