

Barnegat Bay Races Bring Out Fast Yachts

Half Dozen Clubs Have Entries in Event Over the Bay- head Course

BAYHEAD, July 2.—Canvas was shaken out and set to the Barnegat Bay breezes to-day when the first races of the Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association were held over the course of the Bayhead Yacht Club. Fast boats from half a dozen clubs on the Barnegat Bay shore participated in the events, which included sneak box races for both men and women.

The clubs represented included Bayhead, Mantoloking, Seaside Park, Lavalette and Island Heights. The Arran and the Ripple, owned by Orton Dale and Robert B. Hance, respectively, flew the Bayhead pennant in to-day's race for men, and the club's only entry in the women's event was Commodore J. Dugald White's trim little boat, the White Lamb, which was sailed by Miss Joclyn Bronson. On Monday the Bayhead boats will go down to Seaside Park, where the association's holiday events are to be sailed.

A new fleet of one design sneakboxes has been added to the Bayhead fleet and a series of afternoon races for the junior members of the club will be sailed.
