

CATBOATS COMPETE FOR SEWELL PRIZE

Barnegat Competition Today
Attracts Members of Bay
Racing Group.

WOLSTENHOLME TROPHY FOR CLASS E VICTOR

SEASIDE PARK, Aug. 9.—The Wolstenholme trophy and the Sewell cup, second oldest cup on the bay, attracted club members of the Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing association today for competition in races sponsored by the Seaside Park Yacht club. The Sewell cup dance was held last night and was attended by members from all clubs represented in today's races. The T. M. Chance cup offered 13 foot catboats augmented the entry list in that class.

The Wolstenholme trophy offered to the winner of the class "E" sloop contest is unique among bay awards. It is a silver galley, a reproduction of the craft used in the 15th century, and is mounted on a silver pedestal in the form of a wave. Every detail of the reproduction is executed with amazing fidelity making this trophy one of the most coveted awards of the season.

The Sewell cup donated by former Senator Sewell, is the second oldest cup to be sailed for on Barnegat. Its only predecessor is the Toms River challenge cup first offered in 1878. This cup offered in the class "A" catboat race is now held by Island Heights club. The winner is allowed to retain the cup for one year but must return it before the race the following season.

Races in all six of the classes sponsored by the bay association including, Class A and B sneakboxes, class A and B, catboats, class "E" sloops and 18 foot catboats will be followed by the races of the Star class.

In addition to the featured trophies the Seaside Park Yacht club is offering 16 cups in the classes having no first award and as second and third place awards in those groups.

The racing will be followed in this evening by the annual Seaside Park Yacht club cabaret for which, the committee reports, 180 reservations have already been made. Entertainment will include dancing by groups of club members who have been studying, dancing under the direction of Miss Virginia Eden, a dance instructor at the club.
