

# Bay Head Club Holds Final Regatta of Summer Today

The Sewell cup will be awarded to the winner in the "A" cats; the Stanger trophy will go to the "E" sloop winner and the 17-foot cats will race for the Thatcher cup. The starting gun for "B" sneakboxes will be at 10:30 a.m., this class to be followed at five-minute intervals by the snipes, 17-foot cats, "A" sneaks, junior comets and moths. The afternoon races will get under way at 2:20 p.m. These races will include those for "E" sloops, stars, "A" cats, lightnings, "G" sloops and comets.

Richard Diamond, commodore of the Seaside Park Yacht club, and Rowland Hazard, commodore of the B.B.Y.R.A., will serve on the race committee. All season championship trophies will be presented at the close of the regatta on a basis of points for the season. The George R. Powell trophy for outstanding sportsmanship for juniors will also be presented and the Chance challenge trophy will be awarded to the 17-foot cat champion. At the Bay Head Yacht club, the season's yacht racing will be brought to a close at the club dinner Labor day night with the awarding of the season trophies to winners in all classes. The final races in the club championship series for "G" boats and lightnings will be raced tomorrow afternoon and on Labor day there will be the annual all-class club regatta, followed by the evening program. Duckboats, sneaks, junior comets, and junior lightnings will race in the morning and "G" class and lightnings in the afternoon. The ocean yachts will also have their final ocean race Labor day afternoon.
