

## 40th Annual Regatta Held at Seaside Park

**SEASIDE PARK**—The Seaside Park Yacht Club played host to a fleet of 83 boats which competed here yesterday in the 40th annual Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association Regatta as heavy winds caused many boats to turn over.

Fred Winkleman, Lavallette, won the Middleton Trophy for A Cats in Lotus with Dick Irons, Toms River, skippering Bat, and W. Barr, Lavallette, sailing Spy, trailing in second and third places.

The Wolsenholne Cup for E Sloops went to Complex I with Britt Chance, Mantoloking, at the helm. Second was Vintese, sailed by Ernie Hangartner, Toms River, and third position went to Ed O'Malley, Jr., Mantoloking, in Top Drawer.

### Wright Unbeaten

Dennis Wright, Bay Head, held the honored distinction of racking up an unbeaten slate in the Class B Sneakboxes this season in his boat, Elotoo. The George R. Towell Memorial Trophy for character and sportsmanship was won by Jim Kellogg, of Bay Head.

Opening the morning-afternoon program in the heavy winds were the B Sneakboxes and it was Wright again showing the way to Eleanor Chance, Bay Head, in Wigwam, and John Applegate, Seaside Park, in Friskie.

Ken Mease, Ocean Gate, paced the field in the A Sneakboxes, skippering Tinker Belle home in front of Tern II and Pipe Dream. Charles Marks, Ocean Gate, and Carl Carpenter, Bay Head, were the second and third place skippers.

### Culpepper Wins

In the Junior Comets, Max Culpepper, Island Heights, scored in Silver Mist. Second was Bill Fortenbaugh, Bay Head, in Minymo, and third was W. Cowles, Bay Head, in Flying Cloud II.

The winds caused plenty of spills in the International Moth class racing with only one boat, 8 Ball, finishing. Paul Zybulewski, Lavallette, was the skipper.

The Penguin class had a good deal of trouble with the wind but had three boats cross the finish line. Outsider, skippered by Runyon Colie, Mantoloking was the winner. Second was Dead Beat, piloted by Ed Adams, Jr., of Mantoloking, and third was Andy Schoetelle in Glug.

Class E Sloops started the afternoon program racing for the Wolsenholne Cup, and A Cats followed with the running of the Middleton Trophy race.

### Sindle Scores

Harry Sindler, Lavallette, scored in Gweny in the Lightning races with J. W. Orelup, Bay Head, second in Javelin, and Jim Carson, Metedeconk River, third in Sparks.

Barracudda, sailed by Pete III, Toms River, won the G Sloops race. Bill Fortenbaugh, Bay Head, took second in Fugitive, and third place was held down by Bob Snyder, Island Heights, in Nars II.

The final race of the afternoon found Comets on the waters with Sam Fortenbaugh III, Bay Head,

showing the way in Sad Sam. Bill Shuster, Seaside Park, was second in Schuco, and Fred Griggs, Island Heights, placed third in Encore.

### Final Standings

The final standings of the boats at Barnegat Bay this season in the morning division was exactly the same as the finishes yesterday, but the afternoon division was a bit different.

In the E Sloops, Wigwam II, skippered by Cliff Lewis, Mantoloking, was the season leader followed by Complex I, and Top Drawer.

The standings in the A Cats was the same as the finishes in yesterday's race program. In the lightnings, Sparks was the overall leader. Second was Whirlwind, Marge Adams, Metedeconk River, and third was Javelin.

Fugitive and Barracudda were one-two in the G Sloops followed by Menace, Dennis Wright the skipper.

Sad Sam held first place in the comet class with Aeolus, skippered by Leonard Egee, Island Heights, second, and Rebel, Bill O'Connor the pilot, from Bay Head.
