Mantoloking Offers 3 Bay Trophies

MANTOLOKING — The Mantoloking Yacht Club will offer trophies for three races tomorrow when it hosts the third Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association regatta.

B Sneakboxes will race for the Yachtman's Cup, E Sloops for the Bilgeboard Trophy and A Sneakboxes for the David Beaton Trophy.

A large number of skippers in the 15 classes have picked up a single win in the last two regattas for the season's championship points. However three of them have substantial leads toward bay championships. Sam Fortenbaugh Jr. of the Bay Head club out-sailed the Sr. Comet pack in the Bay Head race and in the regular and extra races at Island Heights. Mike Spark of Beachwood took the A Sneakbox race and the Orchard Trophy at Bay Head and last week's race as well. Pete Jones of Bay Head slipped past the Sr. Jets competition to win the regular and the extra race at Island Heights.

The Mantoloking club will host three open races, not included for BBYRA points, Sunday at 2:30 p.m. Prizes are the Chance Challenge Cup for E Sloops, the Carl Ill Memorial Trophy for

Sneakboxes, and the Challenge Cup for Bullseyes.

Sail Instructions

Sailing instruction programs for youngsters from 8 to 15 are conducted by most of the bay clubs. All are under way and seem to be off for a banner year. Larger classes and more interclub racing are noticeable each year.
