

Law Wins BBYRA Toms River Cup; Hoover Leads Mallory Cup Series

ISLAND HEIGHTS — Fair skies and a good southwesterly breeze prevailed yesterday as the Toms River Yacht Club hosted the fourth Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association championship regatta from the Island Heights clubhouse. A fleet of 144 participated.

The A Cat Mary Ann skippered by Warren Law of the Lavallette club captured the 93-year-old Toms River Challenge Cup in an easy victory over second place Spy of the Seaside Park club.

Aboard the Mary Ann as a member of the crew was Harry Newman who owned the boat from 1938 to 1948.

The Newmans named their oldest daughter for the boat.

Cliff Campbell of the host club won the E Sloop race for the 40-year-old Horace A. Doan Trophy.

Gary Watson of the Lavallette club outraced five other B Sneakboxes for the Franklin Doan Trophy. The cup was donated by Mrs. Doan in 1952 in memory of her husband who was well known as a skipper of G and E Sloops.

There was no race for the

Flying Dutchman Kirk Trophy. Most of the class skippers took cuts to participate in the Region 2 championship regatta at Spray Beach.

Lightning registration was also small due to participation in the Central Atlantic District championship at Bay Head.

Beachwood Yacht Club sailors captured the first three places in a 35-boat Junior Penguin fleet.
