It was decided by Burton Wright that the Junior Comet Class be eliminated due to lack of participation and that all Comets will be sailed together as one class. This Class to be sailed in P.M.

It was decided by Burton Wright that the Blue Jay Class be sailed in the A.M.

It was decided by Burton Wright that the Finn Class be sailed in the P.M.

Discussion by Robert West. Mr. West suggests that no restrictions be placed on "M' Class racing. He recommended that all boats desiring to race, be allowed to.

Discussion by Burton Wright. Fleet Captain Wright recommended that the "BBYRA" Races be sailed as the "Championship" series, with the more experienced skippers and that the local Club races be used for the "free-for all" series.

Discussion by Ward Wright. Mr. Wright stated the the "M-16" Class is the fastest growing Class on the Bay and that they recognize the problems being created. He further stated that the Class is trying to straighten out their problems without restricting the Class growth.

Motion: Commodore Summerill made motion that the "M-16" Fleet be devided into two (2) racing in the A.M. and one (1) racing in the P.M.
Motion seconded by F. Thompson Brooks. Motion carried.

Motion: William Connolly made motion that the "M-16" skippers should register prior to the 1st race and designate the Fleet In which they plan to compete. The skippers will endeavor to keep the fleets equal. The boats which sail in the P.M. series must have skippers other than those who skippered in the A.M. Motion seconded by Burton Wright. Motion carried.

Motion: F. Thompson Brooks made motion that the "M-16" fleet should follow the 1968 regulations thru the 1969 series. Motion seconded by Samuel Garrigus. Motion withdrawn.

Motion: William Connolly made motion which would apply to a new scoring system for the "M-16" fleet only. It was proposed that the low point scoring system be used, ie. 3/4 point for 1st, 2 points for 2nd, 3points for 3rd, etc. If in the event a boat was "disq." or "DNF", total points would be awarded, plus one (1) additional. The "M-16" fleet will keep own results in order to have a two series race during the BBYRA summer series. They will allow one cut in each series. They will allow one "drop" in each series. The actual number of races sailed will be scored. If a race is cancelled, this will by used as a "drop" race. This would allow 2 "drops" in nine (9) races. No drop allowed in last race.

Motion seconded by Burton Wright. Motion carried.

Motion. Commodore Summerill made motion to table the preceeding Motion.

Motion seconded by John Papp. Roll call vote called for.

Affirm. 2: Negat. 9: Motion not carried.

-It was announced that Fred Radcliff will replace Samuel Garrigus on the Safety Patrol.

Commodore Summerill appointed the following to study a new format for Bay Racing:

- 5. Burton Wright

Discussion: It was recommended that in order to promote a larger participation in the Sears and Midget elimination races, that these classes first sail in a "round robin" series in their local clubs. The qualifiers will then go to the district eliminations, from there to the finals.

Commodore Summerill requested that there be a method provided to allow for the cancellation of seperate classes due to adverse conditions. Also provision for other classes to be allowed to continue sailing. Á

Motion: William Connolly made motion that the BBYRA adopt the same Internation Signal Flag system used by NAYRU, to advise of Classes sailing. Motion seconded by F. Thompson Brooks. Motion carried.

Discussion: A suggested rewording of the Entrance Fee was submitted as follows:

An entrance fee of Three Dollars (\$3.00) will be charged in each race of the championship series for all classes except Junior Classes, in which case a fee of Two Dollars (\$2.00) will be charged. Junior Classes are "B" Sneakboxes, Junior Penguins, Intermediate Penguins. One Dollar (\$1.00) of each of the above entrance fees shall be turned over to the boat club as reimbursement for the participants lunches.

Motion: F. Thompson Brooks made motion that we adopt new wording for Entrance Fees.

Motion seconded by Burton Wright. Motion carried.

Discussion: A suggested rewording in the sailing instructions pertaining to Safety Equipment, was submitted as follows:

It shall be the sole responsibility of the skipper of eachyacht to decide whether or not to start or continue to race. All yachts must carry safety equipment as specified by their class, which shall include not less than a paddle, but for orpump, anchor and line, and one U.S.C.G. approved life preserver for each member of the crew. In the event that such U.S.C.G. life preserver is not a vest-type non-inflatable life jacket for each member of the crew shall be required as additional safety equipment.

It shall be the responsibility of the skipper and crew of each yacht to wear vest-type non-inflatable life jackets whenever conditions warrant. When Code Flag "D" (yellow with blue bar) is displayed with two guns or horn blasts prier to the warning signal of at any mark of the course, desired the party, theskippers and crews of all yachts shall wear vest-type non-inflatable life jackets so long as such signal is displayed.

- All yachts are subject to inspection and disqualification for failure to carry specific safety equipment or to comply with the above requirements upon the display of Code Flag "D".
