

Correspondence received from Mr. Walter Smedly, Little Egg Harbor Yacht club, extending an invitation to the "E" Sloops and the "M" Sloops, to attend a regatta on August 1 and Aug. 2. They would in turn, like to sail on the Bay on Aug. 15 and Aug. 16, or Aug. 22 and Aug. 23. Rear Commodore, Norman Brown will firm dates.

CLASS REPORTS
"A" Cat; The "A" Cats would like to set their own line at the race where the start is from anchor. When the regatta is held out of the Mantoloking Yacht Club, they would like to sail in the waters of Shore Acres Yacht Club. Their preference is to 2 cuts and no throw-outs.

Blue Jay; The Blue Jay Class recommends that the scoring be on a $\%$ basis, with a combination of cuts and throw-outs.
"E" Sloop; The "E" Sloops would like there-scoiding system to remain as is ie. 12 races, 3 cuts, 1 throwout. They do not want two races held on opening day. They would rather have the double sailing days at Island Heights and Toms River. Due to shallow water at Lavallette, they only will sail the "Green Island Course". When the starting line in a southerly is at the mouth of Toms River, they would like a longer weather leg. The "E" Sloop fleet would like to eliminate daily registrations and rather, have a seasonal registration. With this system, a participant must cross the starting line to be considered racing. This could be broadened to include the "faring area" after the frap signal.

Jet; The Jet Fleet would like to eliminate the P.M. "back to back" races. Instead, they would like to have their extra races one week apart.

Lightning; The Lightning Fleet prefers 2 cuts and 2 throwouts. They would like to sail extra races at Island Heights and Normandy Beach. However, they would like to firm this after the Lightning Class schedule is out.

M-16; The "M" Fleet favored the, starting boat at the starboard end of the line; windward finishes:-pastponements-to-change starting line after wind shift; scoring sheets showing position; one "off" weekend in mid-season; low point scoring; one drop per season; split of divisions; collecting "Rooster flap" at finish No. of race. They would also like to pres register at the start of the season. They also prefer 2 cuts and 1 drop. Where there is a large fleet, they suggest that the BBYRA increase the number of trophies. They would like a "progress" report during the Spring.

Penguin; The Penguin Fleet would like to combine the Junior and Intermediate fleets into one. The age limit would be 18. It could be possible ti score so that there could be a trophy for the first skipper under 14.

DISCUSSION:
It was generally agreed that as the fleets become larger, it may become necessary to allow. for additional trophies. We Waw hoot could go as high as four or five trophies for larger fleets.

The general opinion was that a scoring system consisting of2 cuts and 1 throw-out would be most satisfactory.

Under the "throw-out" system, a boat being disqualified, would not be allowed to use that race as a "throwout".

Commodore Dennis is examining the possibility of having a longer racing season. This would mean either starting sooner, or finishing later. We believe that an earlier start would be better as most colleges and schools open up soon after Labor Day.

Upon motion, the meeting was adjorned.

The Meeting was a general discussion. Conclusions arrived at:
The Lightning Class would like to hold the Extra races on $7 / 4$ and 7/25. This would be Island Heights and Normandy Beach.

The Sneakbox Class smould be required to "band" the mast, boom and gaff, per plans. Edwin D'malloy, Jr., has the Plans and Specs.
It. is a recommendation that each fleet holds an election for a Representative to the B.B.Y.R.A. At the present, the B.B.Y.R.A. does not know who to contact to represent the Class.

It is a recommendation that the Regatta Schedule be mailod to sach Club Secretary for distribution. as a "throwout".
The M-16 Fleet wishes to include in the original report of Therface November 23, 1969, the additional statement that Trophies
 ie. 3 trophies for 5 boats: 5 trophies for 10 boats, etc.

The general opinion of the Representatives present was that we should go to Seasonal Registration. This must be done prior to the first Regatta. The entry fee would be paid in advance, no refunds for not racing. The contestant, must notify the . Race Committee that he is a "starter".

Commodore" Dennis will investigate the methods used by the Long Island Y.R.A. to pres register their contestants.
