West, Ross Capture BBYRA Trophy Races

BRICK TOWNSHIP — Cindy West of Bay Head Y.C., won the Isaacs Trophy for Junior Penguins and Dr. Ira Ross of Lavallette Y.C., took the Phillips Trophy for Lightnings to feature yesterday's seventh Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association regatta at Normandy Beach Y.C.

An 183-boat fleet sailed in 18 classes. Winds were light to moderate from the northwest.

The fleet was depleted somewhat due to regional regattas for Lightnings, E Scows and Blue Jays in other areas.

Island Heights Y.C., had a big day winning four class titles while the Bay Head and Mantoloking clubs won three apiece.

The Island Heights winners were Had Brick in B Lasers, John Engle in M Scows, B Division; Phil Reynolds in Intermediate Penguins and Jim Schmicker in the syndicated A Cat, Bat.

It was the third straight first for Brick in the B Laser fleet. Engle won the 20-boat M Scow B Division as class leader John Wardell, Bay Head, settled for 10th place.

Reynolds won his third straight Intermediate Penguin race. The Bat continued

its winning ways in its struggle with the Spy for bay honors. Bat now had won four of the last five races.

Bay Head winners included Bill Fortenbaugh in M Scows, C Division, Tav Adams in Senior Penguins and Miss West in Junior Penguins.

Fortenbaugh continued his march to the M Scow 'C' title while Mrs. Adams surprised the Senior Penguin leaders Shawn Kempton and Muz Barton.

Mantoloking winners were Willie De Camp in 'A' Lasers, Jan O'Malley in 470's and John Benedict in B Cats.

DeCamp opened up his class lead in 'A' Lasers as did Mrs. O'Malley over Had Brick in 470's. Benedict sailed Art Simon's Sanderling to victory in the B Cats as class leader Bob-Syia was third.

In other classes, Jeremy Bannister of Beachwood Y.C., won his second race M Scow, A Division race in three starts as Bay Head's Russell Lucas sailed third and drew closer to class leader Scott Callahan.

Betsy Gelentis, Metedeconk River, won Junior Blue Jays and culbmate Jim Wagner won E Scows.

Bob Herbert, Shore Acres, won the 23-boat Hobie 16's as class leader Nick Imperato settled for fourth place. Dr.

Ira Ross was the winner in a close Lightning race as the top three were seconds apart at the finish.

John Applegate, Lavallette, continued to dominate the A Sneakboxes with another first yesterday. George Betz, Ocean Gate, won another Thistle class race to keep the class lead there and Jud Williams, Shore Acres, won in Tornados to edge closer to class leader Jim McKeen.
