1. BBYRA Questionnaire: Please call and remind each BBYRA Sailor in your club to return survey

BBYRA SEMINAR: Regatta Reps are available to run pre-season seminars on Bay rules, procedures, courses, scoring, etc. If your Club Rep is unwilling or unable, please contact me and I can arrange a substitute.

2. USYRU ACTIVITIES:

✓ Eliminations:

Motion #1: Any sailor who enters the USYRU ladder elimination at the Bay Level must agree to go on to the next level if he/she is declared the winner.

vote: 8 yes' 1 no

Motion #2: The elimination should be open to more than one competitor from each YC. A signature and/or recommendation from the Sailing Coordinator, along with the Regatta Rep, should be mandatory for each entrant..

vote: 9 yes' 0 no

→ USYRU Committee Chairperson

Motion #3: If for any reason, the Bay Elimination Winner does not "go on", then the entrant who does "go on" shall be declared the "winner" and receive the flag and the trophy.

vote: 9 yes' 0 no

USYRU CLINICS:

Program Director Clinic: Friday evening Mar 8, Mar 9, Mar 10
Cost: \$250 including Modular Planner \$215 w/out MP
Application, etc. to follow

Level I Clinic: IHYC May 31, June 1,2,3 - Application included in packet-Duplicate as many as you need.

Level II Clinic: MYC June 4,5,6 - Application included in packet-Duplicate as many as needed

Level I Clinic: LEHYC June 10, 11, 12, 13

Follow directions on Applications.

First Aide and CPR are mandatory for each level.
Confirmation of place and time will follow.

TO BE INCLUDED IN THE DUTIES OF SAILING INSTRUCTORS:

Supervising and escorting participants to regattas is a paid workday for instructors. Instructors should report to the organizing authority for a specific assignment. If there is no specific assignment, the instructors should remain available and in radio contact to assist when called upon.

ESCALATING COSTS, NO. OF REGATTAS, CALENDAR:

Summary: There have been many complaints about the increasing number of Regattas, the cost of regattas, the time taken away from sailing lessons, etc. Roy Kraus and John Petrillo from TRYC prepared a proposal to combine a number of regattas into the same time frame, making it a shared cooperative experience between a group of Yacht Clubs. The Down-Bay Clubs were used as an example. There was much vocal opposition to this proposal and although the need exists to solve the problem of crowded calendars, etc, a shared cooperative experience does not seem to be the solution at this time.

However, agreement was reached regarding individual Club Series and/or point races. These will be held on Wednesdays during the 1991 Summer Season and you are asked not to hold a Regatta on this day. (BH Race Week and the Van Duyne and Crabbe Seminars being the only notable exceptions)

Participants and parents should choose the number of Regattas carefully, not only to control costs, but to make sure that adequate time is being spent in lessons. The selected regatta's should be appropriate for the participants age-level and ability.

It is neither necessary and/or appropriate for participants to attend every regatta on the schedule.

THINK ABOUT:

1. Changing age requirement for Laser Radial for Jr. Events only.
2. Finalizing calendar of events: classes to be sailed, times, age limits, etc.
3. A local job bank -- many clubs may not hire club members as instructors and need instructors, along with the reverse situation. Clubs would like to help place their "program graduates" in local sailing positions.
4. Two-person boat for older Juniors.
