HISTORY

For many years prior to the inception of the Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association, yacht racing was the popular sport on the Bay. Commodore Herman Muller of the Seaside Park Yacht Club invited members of local yacht clubs to meet with him on February 11, 1914 to discuss the advisability of forming an association to foster and unify yacht racing on Barnegat Bay. Four clubs were represented at this meeting, Bay Head, Island Heights, Ocean Gate and Seaside Park. After agreement as to the name and purpose of the Association, Commodore J.V.A. Cattus of the Bay Head Yacht Club was unanimously elected Chairman and to serve with him, Commodore E. A. Lloyd, Jr., as Vice Chairman, Commodore Herman Muller, Secretary and Mr. M.R.H. Crowell, Treasurer. The first regular meeting was held March 11, 1914 at the Bellevue-Stratford Hotel, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, at which time the original Bylaws were adopted and a racing schedule formulated, the first race being held at the Seaside Park Yacht Club on July 4 of that year. At this first meeting, the Association was enlarged by the election of the Mantoloking Yacht Club into its membership.

The first season's championships awarded by this new organization was in 1914. The first annual meeting was held on October 21 of that year and by this time, membership had grown to six Clubs by the addition of the Lavallette Yacht Club and an official Regatta Committee was appointed then known as "The Racing Commission." In 1922, the Toms River Yacht Club was elected to membership. The following Clubs were subsequently elected to Membership: Shore Acres Yacht Club (1941), Beachwood Yacht Club (1946), Metedeconk River Yacht Club (1946), Normandy Beach Yacht Club (1947), Manasquan River Yacht Club (1962), and Pine Beach Yacht Club (1979).

The development of this Association has been gradual but sound, and each and every group of officers have contributed their time and energy to bring about an institution that should continue to prosper as long as the tide ebbs and flows on Barnegat Bay.

US SAILING EVENTS GENERAL INFORMATION

- All entrants (skippers and crew) must be members of the BBYRA and US SAILING. Proof of membership must be demonstrated at registration. (Membership forms available at registration)
- 2. All entries must be forwarded by their respective REGATTA COMMITTEE REPRESENTATIVES on forms provided. NO ENTRY WILL BE ACCEPTED WITHOUT A PROPERLY COMPLETED FORM. Regatta Committee Representatives are reminded of the Delegates action. "It will be the duty of each Club Representative to provide a yacht in racing condition of the class designated when he forwards his Club's entry in BBYRA Eliminations for National Cup Events." Entries must reach the Chairman by July 5, 1994 for the Sears, Bemis, Smythe, Adams, and Mallory events. Late entries will not be accepted.
- One crew from each Club will be accepted in each category as follows for BBYRA Elimination. The O'Day and Junior Events have no limits as to number of entrants for BBYRA Elimination.
- 4. Definition of Age/Sex Requirements are as follows:

Juniors: Boys and Girls who have reached their thirteenth but not their nineteenth birthday during the Calendar Year.

Adams: Women only - skipper and crew must be eighteen, one crew member may be fifteen.

- 5. BBYRA Perpetual Trophies for US Sailing Events shall be awarded to the winner of the BBYRA eliminations when there are two or more registrants and a sail-off occurs. In the event that only one competitor enters the BBYRA elimination and represents the BBYRA in the Area C Semi-Finals the Championship Flag shall be awarded. If no one enters the BBYRA elimination, then no trophy or flag shall be awarded.
- 6. In the event that there is no BBYRA Elimination scheduled for a US Sailing event, the BBYRA Perpetual Trophy and Flag shall be awarded to the top BBYRA competitor in the Area C Semi-Final, provided the Area C Semi-Finals are sailed on Barnegat Bay.

THE MIDDLE ATLANTIC MIDGET CHAMPIONSHIP

- 1. The Middle Atlantic Midget Championship is open to amateurs. Members of each crew may be boys or girls who will not reach their fifteenth birthday during the calendar year in which they compete.
- 2. All members of each crew must be themselves, or their parents or guardians must be, members of the same yacht club; the club must be a member in good standing on one of the following US SAILING Associations: Eastern Connecticut Yacht Racing Association, Hudson River Yacht Racing Association, Great South Bay Yacht Racing Association, Eastern Long Island Yacht Racing Association, North Jersey Yacht Racing Association, Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association, South Jersey Yacht Racing Association, or Chesapeake Bay Yacht Racing Association.
- 3. No crew or helmsman after participating or being entered in the midget elimination series for one Middle Atlantic Midget Championship Association (including a yacht club elimination series) can be a member of a crew from another club for the Championship Association in any one year.
- 4. A club can enter a crew in only one Association or group elimination. Individuals who belong to more than one yacht Club may represent only one yacht club in these races.

BBYRA ELIMINATION

- 1. Entry fee is \$10.00 per person. All entrants must complete registration form (US SAILING ELIMINATION FORM), and demonstrate membership in the BBYRA and US SAILING (membership card accepted at registration or membership fees may be paid at registration).
- 2. Each entrant must provide a boat and proper safety equipment.
- 3. A club may enter more than one competing yacht in each division.

PRIZES

Trophies listed above will be awarded at Regatta Headquarters at the conclusion of the morning and afternoon races.

All season championship flags and trophies will be presented on the last day on the basis of B.B.Y.R.A. points for the season. A small B.B.Y.R.A. Flag similar to but smaller than the championship flag will be awarded to all qualifying yachts. Individual place pennants will be awarded for each regatta of the championship series. The B.B.Y.R.A., may suspend the awards for a class's season champion ship series if the final outcome of its series is dependent on the outcome of an appeal.

First place individual regatta pennants (a small rooster Flag) will be awarded for each race of the championship series. Second place pennants (red swallow-tailed pennant with host clubs' letters and year) will be awarded to yachts in each race of the championship series when there are at least 4 starters. Third place pennants (white swallow-tailed pennant with the host clubs' letters and year) will be awarded in each race of the championship series when there are 7 or more starters.

Season championship flags and trophies will be awarded to the winning yacht in each class. Second place trophies will be awarded where there are at least 4 qualifiers, third place trophies will be awarded when there are at least 7 qualifiers, fourth place trophies will be awarded when there are at least 18 qualifiers, and fifth place trophies will be awarded when there are at least 28 qualifiers.

SPECIAL AWARDS

The O.G. Dale Memorial Trophy (BBYRA): "Awarded for a period of one year in recognition of outstanding sportsmanship in the Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association." This award recognizes outstanding sportsmanship and conduct. Any sailor, skipper or crew, Senior or Junior is eligible to be nominated for this award.

"If no one's name readily comes to mind during the racing season, there is no need to make the award."

- The George Roth Powell, Jr. Trophy (SPYC) reads "In memory of George Roth Powell, Jr.; an annual award to the outstanding Junior of Barnegat Bay for character and American sportsmanship."
- The B.B.Y.R.A. Past Commodores Trophy will be presented to the member Yacht Club fostering the greatest participation in yacht racing on Barnegat Bay.
- The B.B.Y.R.A. Race Management Trophy maybe awarded as provided in its deed of gift. Eligibility requirements available upon request.

SCORING

Scoring for the BBYRA Championship will be in accordance with Section E. of the Racing Rules of the Association. For 1992 all classes will be scored in accordance with paragraphs 5 and 6 except A CAT and LASER II which will be scored in accordance with paragraph 7 and E SLOOP which, contrary to paragraph 3, must be classified as a starter in all but two races of those started for that class.

SAFETY

All yachts must carry equipment specified by her class rules, the U.S.C.G. and such additional equipment as specified in Appendix 1 to the Racing Rules of the Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association. The Race Committee may at any time request a yacht to display her safety equipment, and any yacht found not to be carrying her required safety equipment shall be disqualified from the race just completed.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS

AGE LIMIT: " A contestant will be considered eligible when his or her age-limit will not have been reached on the last day of the calendar year."

Blue Jay: 18 years and younger

Laser Radial Junior Division: 16 years and younger-can not turn 17 during

the calendar year

Laser Master: (provisional class) 45 years of age or older

SANDERLING CLASS: 18 ft. Marshall Sanderlings.

The Racing Rules & Sailing Instructions which follow are current as of the date of publication of this book. Changes made after publication will be published in the official Rules & Sailing Instructions available at Regatta Headquarters and the Late Entry Boat or posted on the Official Notice Board located in the vicinity of the registration desk.

RACING RULES OF THE BARNEGAT BAY YACHT RACING ASSOCIATION

A. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. All races held under the jurisdiction of the Association shall be sailed under the rules of the IYRU, the prescriptions of the US_SAILING, the Sailing Instructions and these Rules. In as much as no Rules can be devised to cover every situation, it shall be the duty of the Regatta Committee to decide all questions which may arise. In deciding such questions the Regatta Committee shall not act before satisfying itself that its action is as equitable as possible to all yachts concerned.
- All races held under the jurisdiction of the Association shall be conducted by a Race Committee appointed by the Regatta Committee of the Association and chaired by the Vice Commodore.
- Each year Regatta Committee shall adopt Sailing instructions which shall be
 provided to all entrants. The Regatta Committee should also cause appropriate
 race information not contained in these Rules and required by IYRR II Part 2,
 "Notice of Race," to be published in the Annual Regatta Schedule. (See
 Championship Regattas in this Handbook)

B. ELIGIBILITY

- 1. A yacht entered for a race must be a bona fide property of a recognized yacht club or of the person in whose name she is entered, who must be a member of a yacht club of the Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association. A member chartering a yacht shall be deemed the owner provided said yacht has been chartered in good faith for a period of not less than thirty days.
- 2. Any class qualifying three or more yachts in the previous years series will be eligible for competition. Additional classes may be considered upon written petition to the Regatta Committee by at least six skippers representing a minimum of three member clubs. Such petition shall include a commitment from each skipper stating his/her intention to qualify for the championship. Those classes eligible for competition each year shall be designated by the Regatta Committee and published in the Annual Regatta Schedule.
- In junior classes with an age limit, a contestant will be considered eligible when his age limit birthday will not have been reached on the last day of the calendar year.

4. Skippers/Helmsmen are required to be members of the BBYRA, a member Club of said Association, and their respective class organizations. Class Representatives must furnish the Regatta Committee with a list of eligible skippers.

C. ENTRIES

- A member of the Regatta Committee shall supervise the receipt of entries and fees in all classes.
- 2. Entries shall be made as required by the Regatta Committee.
- An entry fee will be charged for the season or each race of the championship series for all classes at rates established by the BBYRA. "Entry Fees are Nonrefundable."

D. RACING TRIM

- 1. All one-design and restricted classes must file with the Association Measurer a copy of their class rules and regulations which shall include restrictions, measurements and designations pertaining to the hull, mast, rigging, sails, and crew limitations as to weight and number, not later than two weeks prior to the date of the first championship regatta. These will remain frozen through the current Regatta season. No yacht will be entitled to start in any race unless the yacht meets the above mentioned requirements and conforms to the racing rules and regulations of the Association.
- A record of class restrictions and designations including sails, crew limitations, equipment, etc., will be maintained by the Association Measurer.
- All yachts must carry safety equipment as specified by their class, as may be required by the USCG and as set forth in Appendix 1. Deviations for any class may be granted by the Regatta Committee.

E. SCORING

- Each season the Association will award the championship to the yacht in each class making the best score according to the method outlined below. The BBYRA may act to suspend the awards of a class's season championship series if the final outcome of its series is dependent on the outcome of an appeal.
- Only those races designated for points in the championship series will be considered in computing the record of each yacht. No new class shall be added to the race program for championship purposes after the issuance of the Annual Regatta Schedule.
- 3. In order to qualify for the championship a yacht must be classified as a starter in all but three races of those started for her class except as indicated in the Annual Regatta Schedule.
- 4. A yacht shall rank as a starter if she has entered in accordance with Section C. of these rules and conforms to IYRR Rule 74.5 (a). No race shall be declared official unless there are two or more starters.
- The championship record of a qualified yacht will be her total score divided by the number of points she would have received had she finished first in every race she ranked as a starter. The highest score wins.

- 6. A yacht shall score one point for finishing plus one point for each yacht beaten. All other yachts, including a yacht which finishes and thereafter retires or is disqualified, shall score 0 points except as otherwise provided in these Rules. All yachts ranking as starters shall be considered beaten whether or not they start, finish, or are disqualified. Yachts not starting or ranking as starters will not be scored.
- Notwithstanding paragraphs 5 and 6, any class which so requests prior to March 15th, may be scored in accordance with IYRR Appendix B2A, The low point averaged scoring system, except as modified by E.3 & E.9 of these rules.
- A yacht receiving a Scoring Penalty shall be scored in accordance with IYRR Appendix B1, Scoring Penalty.
- A yacht which ranks as a starter in more than the minimum number of races required to qualify shall have that race most detrimental to her record excluded.
- Points shall be awarded to a yacht and may not be transferred except by specific written permission of the Regatta Committee.
- 11. If two or more yachts tie in a race, the total points for the positions involved shall be divided equally between them.
- 12. If two or more yachts tie for first place in a race involving a trophy, the Regatta Committee may order a resail if possible, otherwise the trophy will be awarded to each yacht to be held an equal length of time.
- 13. In the event that two or more yachts tie in the final championship standings, the yacht that has finished ahead of the other yacht the greater number of times in the championship shall be considered the winner. If this does not break the tie the yacht with the most firsts, then seconds, etc shall be declared the winner.
- 14. A report of each championship race giving the identification of all yachts registered therein, their order of finish, together with the entry sheets, shall be filed with the Scorer of the Regatta Committee and kept for two years.
- 15. A suitable Point Accumulation Sheet will be maintained by the scorer showing in detail the record of each yacht's activity for the current racing season. All scores shall be considered final fifteen days after they are published except as indicated in the Sailing Instructions or where a decision on a valid protest is pending. Final Point Accumulation Sheets shall be filed with the Secretary at the conclusion of each season.
- 16. First place individual regatta pennants will be awarded for each race of the championship series. Second place pennants will be awarded when there are between 4 and 6 starters, and third place pennants awarded when there are more than 6 starters.
- 17. Season championship flags and trophies will be awarded to the winning yacht in each class. Second place trophies will be awarded when there are between 4 and 6 qualifiers; third place when there are between 7 and 17 qualifiers; fourth place when there are between 18 and 27 qualifiers; and fifth place when there are more than 27 qualifiers
- 18. Races not started and deemed "abandoned, not to be sailed," shall not be scored. The total number of races in the series shall be reduced by the number of "abandoned, not to be sailed, races."

F. PROTESTS, DISQUALIFICATIONS & APPEALS

- Protests and Hearings shall be in accordance with current US SAILING Procedures except as modified in the Sailing Instructions.
- 2. All decisions upon written protests shall be in writing and filed with the Scorer along with the original protest papers. The Scorer, after noting any adjustments to the scores of the yacht(s) involved, shall forward the original protest, decision and pertinent papers to the Secretary of the Association who shall keep them on the file for a period of two years.
- 3. An owner or his representative or the Race Committee wishing to appeal the decision of the protest committee must signify that by filing a written appeal, postmarked not later than 15 days following receipt of the written decision, which shall be sent to the Scorer with copies to the chairman of the Appeals Committee and the chairman of the Regatta Committee of the BBYRA. A copy shall also be sent to the other yacht(s) involved, who appeared or were entitled to appear at the protest hearing. The written appeal shall contain the grounds for the appeal. Appeals to the Appeals Committee of the Association shall be limited to interpretation of the rules.
- The Appeals Committee of the Association may affirm or reverse the decision of the Protest Committee.
- Decisions of the Appeals Committee shall be in writing and the grounds of each decision shall be specified therein. Copies thereof shall be sent to all parties to the infringement and appeal.
- The Appeals Committee prescribes that anyone submitting an Appeal shall include payment of \$10.00.

BARNEGAT BAY YACHT RACING ASSOCIATION 1994 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS - UPPER BAY TOMS RIVER SEASIDE PARK

1. RULES

Races will be governed by the IYRU, the prescriptions of US SAILING, the Racing Rules of the BBYRA and by these Sailing Instructions.

2. NOTICE TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located in the vicinity of the registration desk at the regatta headquarters.

3. CHANGES IN SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change in the sailing instructions will be posted at least one hour prior to the scheduled AM or PM Warning Signal.

4. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

Signals made ashore will be displayed at the regatta headquarters.

5. ACCOUNTABILITY

- 5.1 Changes of registered skipper or sail number must be submitted in writing at the registration desk or late entry boat.
- 5.2 Yachts intending to race shall pass close by the late entry boat so that their sail numbers can be properly recorded. Any registered yacht sailing in the starting area between her preparatory and starting signals will be considered a starter. (See IYRR 74.5).
- 5.3 The committee will endeavor to account for all entered yachts. If a yacht does not start or fails to finish, the skipper shall report to the Regatta Committee or Patrol Boat flying a numbered patrol flag before leaving the course. Any yacht withdrawing from the race without prompt notice may be disqualified for the next two races.

6. CLASS SIGNALS & STARTING TIME

7. THE COURSE

- 7.1 The course chart shows the approximate location of marks, the order in which marks are to be rounded or passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.
- 7.2 The Class designation and number of course to be sailed by that Class will be displayed, contrary to IYRR 5.1, at its Preparatory Signal and remain until its starting signal.
- 7.3 The Race Committee may signal a windward-leeward course by display of "W" followed by a numeral indicating the number of laps. Rounding marks will be special yellow inflatables. All marks will be left to port."
- 7.4 The race Committee may elect to establish a special turning market for the "E" Sloop Class near the final turning marker of the course. In such case this marker will be an orange cylinder carrying an "E" flag.
- 7.5 Any special course will be posted on the Official Bulletin Board at least one hour prior to the scheduled Warning Signal.

8. MARKS

Marks will be drums painted orange and white with identifying letters painted in black, except as noted.

9. THE START

- 9.1 Races will be started in accordance with IYRR 4.3(a), System 2(ii) with classes starting at 5 minute intervals in the order shown under Class Signals and Starting Times.
- 9.2(a) The starting line for the "E" Sloop, Laser, Laser Radial and Sanderling Classes will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the committee boat at the starboard end and an orange cylinder with the letter "L" painted on the side at the port end. A midline marker, which will be an orange ball, may be placed as a reference only. It is not a mark of the course and may not be exactly on the line.
- 9.2(b) The starting line for all other classes will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the committee boat at the starboard end and an orange ball at the port end.
- 9.3 An orange ball attached to the Committee Boat is considered a part of the mark.
- 9.4 Yachts not starting, finishing, or on a leg of the course must not interfere with yachts starting and finishing, and may be subject to disqualification for failure to comply with this instruction.
- 9.5 Yachts may not cross the start of finish line except to start or finish.

10. RECALLS

- 10.1 Individual recalls will be signaled in accordance with IYRR 7.1. In addition, the Race Committee may attempt tohail each yacht that has not started correctly. Failure to make or hear such hail will not be ground for redress."
- 10.2 Modifying IYRR 7.2, a general recall will be signaled by display of the first substitute over a blue shape (preparatory signal) with a sound signal. Means: "The class is recalled for a new start. This signal will be lowered four minutes after the aborted start with a sound signal. This will be one minute before the restart signal".
- 10.3 When a general recall has been signaled, starts for the succeeding classes will be postponed accordingly.

11. THE FINISH

- 11.1 The Race Committee will attempt to establish a windward finish for the first class to finish. Failure to do so will not be grounds for redress.
- 11.2 The finishing line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on a race committee boat at the starboard end and an orange cylinder with an "L" painted on the side at the port end.

12. TIME LIMIT

The time limit will be 2 1/2 hours for AM classes and 3 hours for PM classes. A yacht finishing more than 30 minutes after the first yacht of her class finishes or after the time limit, whichever is later, will be scored "Did not finish."

13. PROTESTS

- 13.1 The BBYRA prescribes the following modification of IYRR 68.3(a): A protesting yacht must fly Code Flag "B" or a red rectangular flag no smaller than 6 inches by 8 inches in order to signify her intent to protest.
- 13.2 Contrary to IYRR 68.3(c) (ii), a yacht sailed single-handed must keep the protest flag displayed until she has finished and been acknowledged by the Race Committee.
- 13.3 Protests shall be written on forms available at the regatta headquarters or late registration boat and lodged in accordance with IYRR 68.6.
- 13.4 Protests not disposed of on a race day will be heard at Regatta Headquarters commencing at 0730 on the next scheduled race day.

14. ALTERNATIVE PENALTIES

14.1 The 720 Degree Turns Penalty, Appendix B1 of the Racing Rules will apply with the additional provision that when an infringing yacht has its spinnaker drawing at the time of the infringement, drops it completely while taking her penalty and resets it and has it drawing after the penalty, the penalty is one full turn or 360 degrees instead of two full turns.

- 14.2 Notwithstanding paragraph 14.1, a yacht may elect to accept a Scoring Penalty, Appendix B1 of the Racing Rules.
- 14.3 Contrary to IYRR Appendix B1.2.1(b) a yacht sailed single-handed must keep the acknowledge infringement flag displayed until she has finished and been acknowledged by the Race Committee.
- 14.4 All alternative penalties taken shall be reported to the Regatta Committee immediately after finishing.

15. SAFETY

- 15.1 All Junior class competitors (Junior Laser Radial & Blue Jay) shall wear life jackets or other adequate personal buoyancy as specified in IYRR 60 at all times while racing.
- 15.2 When Code Flag "F" is flown by the Race Committee, "E" sloops shall deploy main sail flotation. Main sail flotation shall also be deployed whenever Code Flag "Y" (Life Jacket Signal) is displayed prior to the Warning Signal.
- 15.3 Safety inspections will be conducted at the discretion of the committee. Code flag "L" and a class signal displayed at the finish line will indicate a mandatory inspection. Yachts are required to respond by checking in with a safety patrol boat flying code flag "L" and the class signal while laying at anchor to windward of the finish line. All yachts must be acknowledged."

16. POSTPONEMENT SIGNAL ("AP"", Answering Pennant)

16.1 Modifying IYRR 4.1, the Warning or Preparatory signal will be made one minute after this signal is lowered. This signal made before 1:15 PM does not refer to afternoon races.

17. COME WITHIN HAIL SIGNAL (Code Flag "L")

Modifying IYRR 4.1, Code Flag "L" when displayed affoat to indicate "Come with hail," is mandatory. Failure to respond will be ground for disqualification.

18. MARK MISSING (M) MODIFYING IYRR 4.2, SOUND SIGNALS while displaying "M" MAY BE OMITTED.

19. ABANDONMENT SIGNALS ("N" & "N" over "H")

- 19.1 Modifying IYRR 4.1, when "N" is displayed over a class flag, the Warning or Preparatory signal for that class will be made one minute after this signal is lowered.
- 19.2 Modifying IYRR 4.1, "N" over "H" means, "All races including those not started are abandoned and will not be sailed." This signal made before 1:15 PM does not refer to afternoon races.

20. SHORTEN COURSE SIGNAL (Code Flag "S")

Modifying IYRR 4.1, this signal displayed at a rounding mark means: "Finish between the rounding mark and the boat displaying this signal."

21. RADIO COMMUNICATION

"A yacht shall neither make, receive, nor monitor radio communications while racing."



NAME

No. 1

The name of this organization shall be the Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association.

OBJECTS No. 2

The objects of this Association shall be to encourage sail boat racing on Barnegat Bay; to supervise the racing; to establish uniform rules for the government of open races; to approve the Courses selected by the various member Clubs; to adopt a fair and consistent system of measuring boats; to measure the courses and recommend an intelligent system of marking same; to recommend a system of Club lights whereby the various Clubs and docks may be immediately recognized by yachtsmen; to assist in obtaining better general conditions for pleasure boating on the Bay by untiring efforts with the Federal, State and Municipal authorities; to consider and settle by means hereinafter mentioned, all disputes arising between Clubs in connection with open or inter-Club races; to sanction open and inter-Club races and allot dates for the holding of such events.

MEMBERSHIPS No. 3

Any Yacht Club located between Manasquan Inlet and Little Egg Harbor Inlet or waters tributary thereto, shall be eligible for membership in the Association.

Membership shall be in three classes: Active, Associate and Individual Contributing.

Individual Contributing Members are those individuals who belong to member clubs of the Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association and desire to assist in supporting the objects of the Association. Such membership does not grant the right to vote or hold office.

Active membership shall be composed of the Clubs herein listed as members of the B.B.Y.R.A. and Associate Clubs that may be elected at a future date to active membership by three fourths vote of the Executive Committee. No Clubs shall be elected to Active Membership unless it has been an Associate member for at least two years immediately preceding the application.

Associate membership will be those Clubs that are elected to this class by a threefourths vote of the Executive Committee of the B.B.Y.R.A.

To be eligible for Associate membership, a Club must present to the Secretary of the Association a written application stating that it has at least five yachts of a class or classes now scheduled in the Association regattas. It shall be signed by an elected officer of the applicant Club and also by an officer of an active Club in the Association.

Yachts of Associate member Clubs will have all the rights and privileges of yachts of Active member Clubs and will be represented on the Regatta Committee of the Association in the same manner as provided for in the Active membership.

Associate member Clubs will not be required to sponsor a Regatta.

REPRESENTATION

No. 4

Section 1. Each Club in the active membership of the Association shall be entitled to three delegates of whom the Commodore or Vice Commodore shall be one. Past Commodores of the Association shall be delegates at large. The names and addresses of those delegates who will represent the Club must be sent to the Secretary of the Association not later than January 1 of each year.

Section 2. Each Associate member Club shall be entitled to one delegate. The name and address of this delegate, who will represent the Club at the annual meeting must be sent to the Secretary of the Association no later than September 15th of each year.

OFFICERS No. 5

Section 1. The officers of the Association shall be Commodore, Vice-Commodore, Rear Commodore, Secretary, Treasurer and Measurer. They shall be elected at the annual meeting of the delegates. The Commodore. Vice-Commodore and Rear Commodore, shall be elected from the delegates; the Secretary, Treasurer and Measurer may be elected from the membership of any Club belonging to this Association. A Fleet Captain shall be appointed by the Commodore, to function as an executive assistant and may be selected from the membership of any of the Association's Member Clubs.

Section 2. There shall be an Executive Committee comprised of the elected officers of the Association, the Commodore (or his designate) from each member Club, and the past Commodores of the Association.

DUTIES OF OFFICERS

No. 6

Section 1. The Commodore shall preside at all meetings of this Association and shall be ex-officio member of all Committees.

Section 2. The Vice-Commodore shall assist the Commodore and preside in his absence.

Section 3. The Rear Commodore shall assist the Commodore and the Vice-Commodore and shall preside in the absence of both.

Section 4. The Secretary shall keep a correct roll of the members and complete records of each meeting; promptly notify Clubs of their election to membership and perform the usual duties of such office. In addition, he will maintain the permanent record of all meetings and final point accumulation sheets and such other records required.

Section 5. The Treasurer shall collect all monies due the Association and have custody of all Association funds, pay all just obligations of the Association

which have been duly authorized by the delegates; or by the Executive Committee between meetings of the delegates; keep a correct account of all receipts and disbursements of the Association; and make a complete report of the financial condition of the Association at the annual meeting, or at such other times as the Executive Committee may request. His accounts shall be audited prior to the annual meeting.

Section 6. The Association Measurer shall receive and keep a record of all yachts as measured by the Fleet Measurers, and maintain a record of all class restrictions and designators. He shall receive appeals from the decision of any Fleet Measurer, his decision to be final.

Section 7. The Executive Committee shall have general executive powers between meetings of the Association. It shall approve or reject applications of Clubs for membership. No change in the racing rules of the Association shall be submitted to the delegates until it has first been approved by the Executive Committee. It shall perform such other duties as are assigned to it herein.

MEETINGS No. 7

Section 1. The Commodore shall call the annual meeting of the Association, to be held on the first Saturday in October. In the event of failure to elect officers at such meeting, a special meeting for this purpose shall be called by the Commodore and held within one month thereafter. He shall also call a Spring meeting of the Delegates which shall be held prior to the first Association Regatta of the season.

Section 2. The Commodore may at his discretion call a special meeting of the delegates and/or of the Executive Committee and he shall call a special meeting at any time upon the request of the delegates of two active member Clubs.

Section 3. A quorum shall consist of twelve (12) delegates; provided they shall represent eight (8) active member Clubs.

Section 4. At least fifteen (15) days notice of all meetings of the Association shall be given in writing to each delegate and all others whose attendance is required.

VOTING No. 8

Section 1. The Commodore shall appoint at the Spring meeting of the Delegates, a nominating committee composed of Past Commodores of the Association which shall submit a slate of nominees for Officers and Executive Committee to the Secretary at least 15 days before the annual meeting of the Association. The Chairman of this committee shall be the most recent Past Commodore of the Association available. Delegates may submit nominations in writing, with the written consent of the candidate, to the Secretary at least 15 days before the annual meeting. The Secretary shall notify Delegates of all such nominations at least 7 days before the annual meeting.

Delegates of all such nominations at least 7 days before the annual meeting. No other nominations shall be accepted at the annual meeting except by unanimous consent.

Section 2. Each Club shall be entitled to one vote. Voting may be done by proxy. Section 3. A majority shall determine all questions, except as otherwise provided herein.

Section 4. All officers shall be elected by ballot.

DUES No. 9

Section 1. The dues for active members shall be determined by the Association from time to time.

Section 2. The dues for Associate Member Clubs shall be determined by the Association from time to time.

Section 3. The Treasurer of the Association will bill each Club prior to May 1st, on which date all dues are payable.

Section 4. If dues of any Club remain unpaid for a period of thirty (30) days after same shall become due, the Treasurer shall so notify the Club in writing; if such Club shall fail to pay its dues within a further period of thirty (30) days, it shall stand suspended until restored to membership by the Executive Committee.

Section 5. The dues for Contributing Memberships shall be determined by the Association on an annual basis.

WITHDRAWALS AND SUSPENSION

No. 10

Section 1. Any Club may withdraw from the Association after the payment of all indebtedness to the Association by giving written notice to the Secretary.

Section 2. A Club may be suspended for cause by a two-thirds vote of the delegates, provided such Club shall have at least thirty (30) days notice in writing and an opportunity to be heard.

Section 3. When a Club has been suspended, either for cause or non-payment of dues, it shall forfeit all rights of membership until restored by payment of the dues and upon action of the Executive Committee.

Section 1. There shall be a Standing Committee known as the Regatta Committee of the Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association, appointed by the Commodore of the Association within one month after the annual meeting. It shall consist of the Past Commodores of the Association who shall act as chairman and the Rear Commodore of the Association who shall act as vice-chairman, and who, unless they are also representing their clubs, shall have no vote, except in case of a tie; and one representative from each Club. Such representative may or may not be a delegate to the Association; but he must be a member of the Club he represents. The Commodore of the Association shall also appoint one alternate from each Club, who will act only in the absence of the original representative.

Section 2. The Regatta Committee of the Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association shall have entire control of inter-club racing on Barnegat Bay. It shall receive and pass on all requests for allotment of racing dates, sanction of races, and submit at the annual meeting a schedule of races for the following season for approval. Not later than March 15 of each year it shall issue a final schedule for the ensuing season. It shall have charge of the actual operation of the races, the selection of the courses and the official scoring. It shall decide all questions referring to course charts, signals, marks, measurements and allied subjects. Association Regatta Committee membership representing 8 active member clubs shall constitute a quorum.

Section 3. An official Scorer and one or more assistants shall be appointed each year by the Commodore of the Association within one month after the annual meeting. They may be appointed from the membership of any Club belonging to the Association and may or may not be members of other Committees, but shall work under the jurisdiction of the Regatta Committee of the Association. They will receive the complete record of each Regatta and compute the championship score therefrom. The official scorer may appoint additional associates as required.

Section 4. Protest Committee shall be appointed by the Vice Commodore of the Association for each regatta, comprised of three members. This committee shall decide all protests. Appeals from its decisions may be made to the Appeals Committee. The Appeals Committee shall be appointed by the Commodore of the Association not later than March first of each year and shall consist of a Chairman and four members, each of whom shall represent a different active member club. Its decisions shall be subject to review by the Association Regatta Committee and may be changed by a two-thirds vote of that committee.

HOST CLUBS

No. 12


Section 1. The Club(s) hosting a regatta shall have charge of entries and shall insure the proper condition and location of each mark on its course chart


immediately prior to the regatta. It shall provide suitable committee and auxiliary boats manned by qualified crews, course charts, starting signals, signal gun with shells and all other facilities and equipment required for the operation of the races as defined by the Regatta Committee from time to time.

AMENDMENTS No. 13


