BBYRA Delegates Meeting Minutes October 7, 1995 13:30 at BHYC

Meeting called to order by Commodore Wedam at 1340. Roll call of the clubs indicated that all clubs were present. The proposed agenda and minutes of the May, 1995 meeting were approved.

- letter from Sperry topsider for advertising to Patty Applegate.
- letter from David Applegate wants five item for discussion regarding regatta operations put under new business

Committee Reports

- Regatta Committee Report from Don McNeil, VC. thank past commodore for help in running the bridge. Change in starting sequence for Sandpiper Class seemed to work will this past year. Thanks to Dave loughran for his help in selecting courses.
- Class Liaison Committee Hank Waite Recommendation for courses for each class seemed to work well.
- Safety Committee Report from Harry Foote Thank able assistance of the two Charlie's for help on inspections. The patrol boat training course had low attendance discussion of holding a patrol boat briefing before each race for all of the patrol skippers. Request for the regatta Committee to look into ways of informing the clubs of the safety status of the racing. Discussion of the problems of the patrol boats following the fleet versus reporting the first boat rounding the mark.
- Protest Committee Report by Dave Loughran protest hearing generally went smoothly, need new
 people to gain experience in hearing protest, discussion of spectators at the hearing.
- US Sailing National Cup Events Committee Patty Applegate Thank SP and TR clubs for their hosting events this summer.
- Appeals Committee Roger Brown Appeal in the Blue Jay fleet has reversed the decision of the protest committee resulting in a change in the scoring.
- Scoring Committee Harold Lewry the decrease in the boats registered has leveled off for the 95 season, 285 total boats registered with 239 season registrations. A total of 1635 boats were scored in the season. There were 9 protest, 3 request for redress, and 2 appeals filed. A new Packerd Bell computer was purchased and used for the second half of the season. Harold has a list of minor changes to the racing rules to be discussed under new business. Recommendation from Werner on ways of creating a budget item to create an escrow account for replacing major equipment without requiring a special meeting of the delegates.
- Measurer, Class eligibility and Course Committee report from Jim Carson. No problems reported
 to the measurer. Class eligibility all current classes have met requirement for inclusion in the 97
 schedule, there are no request for new classes. Courses need feedback on desired courses for the 97
 season, need courses to vary by wind velocity.
- Junior Sailing Committee Pat Dunn. no report.
- Training Committee Hank Waite problem of how to interest the Jrs in attending a training course for them the early season seminar had poor attendance. There is a perceived need for a race management training for the bay clubs and people to help on the regatta committee.
- General Programs and Services Roger Brown Roger will be attending the US Sailing meeting and
 will apply for the Coast Guard permits. All insurance will be handled by the Paterson agency to have a

- single point of contact. Blue Gavel has part of the responsibility for the Commodores ball, next year is June 15 at Toms River Yacht Club (This is a change in date from the year book). Total income from the Commodores ball was about \$2200.
- Booklet Paul Brown offered to handle the entire activity what we ended up with was a supprise the
 cost of the book was substancely above last years cost. Motion to appoint a committee to review the
 year book and set advertising policy to achieve a break even cost on the book, including advertising on
 the inside front and/or back covers. Motion made/seconded/passed.
- Membership Committee Werner Wedam Werner will continue next year, will count on many helpers. Total of 2267 members. Request to the delegates to prepare an electronic list of the members.
- Finance Committee, Annual Report Ann Attridge report handed out giving status as of the meeting, this is an interim report we expect to break even for the year ending after December.

Minutes of Junior BBYRA Committee Meeting November 4, 1995 - Bay Head Yacht Club

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Meeting called to order by Chairperson Pat Dunn at 9:45 a.m. Attendance was taken and all clubs were represented except Manasquan River, Normandy Beach, and Pine Beach.

The agenda consisted of Calendar events, Regatta costs for Juniors, Instructors qualifications and hiring, and BBYRA races.

- 1. Calendar: All regattas for the summer of 1996 have been tentatively scheduled. Both Up-Bay and Down-Bay interclubs met to co-ordinate their individual race dates, and discuss concerns over scoring.
- 2. Regatta Costs: After reviewing last year's fees, it was again mentioned that the Junior Regattas should not be used as fund raisers for individual clubs and that the costs should be kept down to merely "break even".
- 3. Instructors: It was again stressed that all instructors should be USSA qualified and that the head instructors should have the Level II certification. Dates for these were also set.
- 4. BBYRA Races: The main concern was on how to get more Juniors to participate and to keep the ones involved that were already there. Suggestions: Shorter courses for Juniors;

separate courses for Juniors with perhaps 2-3 shorter races; Junior picnic after races by host clubs; reconsider time frame vs. shortening courses in light air.

The other concern was obtaining a starting time for the 420's. At this time 3 clubs have several that wish to participate in the BBYRA.

5. Additional topics; Clinics offered; Opti fleets; Juniors crewing for BBYRA skippers; Jr. BBYRA Fun Day; Computer scoring from Joni Palmer; invite BBYRA to next meeting.

PRESIDENT IRISH ANNOUNCED AT THE B.O.D. MEETING ON OCT. 19th THAT THE HER-RESHOFF TROPHY WILL BE AWARDED TO CY GILLETTE DURING THE MEETING ON SATURDAY. JOINING IN THE AWARD WAS OUR OWN SAM MERRICK, FORMER RECIPIENT.

THE ST. PETERSBURG TROPHY WAS AWARDED TO THE CLEVELAND YACHTING CLUB FOR THE THISTLE 50th ANNIVERSARY REGATIA.

ADAMS CUP COMMITTEE:

EFFECTIVE 1/1/96 WHILE RACING, COMPETITORS AT ALL LEVELS OF THE ADAMS CHAMPIONSHIPS SHALL WEAR COAST GUARD APPROVED PFD'S WITH WHISTLE ATTACHED. THE ADAMS CUP FOR 1996 AND 1997 BE CLASSIFIED AS A CATEGORY B EVENT, IN ACCORDANCE WITH RULE 18 AND APPENDIX A3; EXCLUDING PARAGRAPHS 4.1 (b), (c) AND (d). - 11.52 Lifesling (R) without a drogue, equipped with a self-igniting light within easy reach of the helmsman and ready for instant use. (See Appendix V). Cats 0123
- 11.53 In addition to 11.52, one Lifebuoy within easy reach of the helmsman and ready for instant use, equipped with a whistle, drogue, a self-igniting light and a pole and flag, the pole shall be either permanently extended or Cats 012
- 11.54 Certificate. An inflatable Lifebuoy shall have a current valid certificate from the manufacturer or an approved servicing agent certifying that it has been inspected and that it complies with the above requirements. The certificate, or a copy, shall be carried on the yacht. (Cat 01234)
- 10.31 Add: "For yachts which are normally steered by any means other than a tiller fitted directly to the rudder stock," an emergency tiller Cats 0123
- 10.21.1 Add to end of first sentence ", capable of being attached to the mast."

- a. A storm trysail as in 10.21.1; or
- b. Mainsail reefing to reduce the luff by at least 40 %
- 6.62 Add "and shall be of the same construction and general arrangements as required for the upper."

REPORT OF THE CLASS ELIGIBILITY COMMITTEE for REGATTA COMMITTEE MEETING, November 18, 1995

The Class Eligibility Committee is charged with reviewing the performance of classes participating in the regattas of the BBYRA as well as investigating the qualifications of new classes proposed for inclusion. A review indicates all current classes have met the requirements for inclusion on the 1976 schedule. There was a slight increase in the number of qualifiers and participants per race in 1975 reversing a downward decline seen in 1973 and 1974. Notably the Flying Scot Class has had a big increase and the junior classes continue to decline. A resume is attached. There are no current requests for new classes.

There were no course changes made for the 1995 season. The course selection committee on the boat was provided with a course selection guide showing class preference for type of course, course length and maximum wind velocity.
