Delegates' Meeting

October 5, 1996 - Bay Head Y.C.

MINUTES

The meeting was called to order by Commodore McNeil at 1330.

Roll call was taken by the Secretary, all clubs were represented with the exception of Beachwood and Manasquan.

Previous minutes of March 30 were approved as written.

Secretary requested that 1997 lists of officers, delegates and representatives be returned to her as soon as possible.

Correspondence - none.

OFFICER REPORTS:

Commodore McNeil thanked everyone who participated in this year's program. Weatherwise, it was a difficult year, but it all worked out.

Vice Commodore Waite thanked Jim Carson again for his hours of work, also thanked the scorers for their efficient handling of results, if anything can be improved on in racing, let him know.

Rear Commodore Foote has not received any feedback, good or bad; maybe the November liaison meeting will provide some sort of information.

Fleet Captain Heacock stated that despite so many races being cancelled, all fleets were inspected - thanks to the men who helped.

Protest - Dave Loughran reported only 7 protests, went well.

Scoring - Harold Lewry reported that registration has leveled off; 1996 285 registrations, 167 seasonal; 163 qualifiers, 1557 boats.

Sailing Instructions/Measurer - Jim Carson stated not much feedback yet; thanks for trying windward/leeward course - it was a fiasco but at least it was tried. Was 420's representation enough? Measurer - no problems; one question - bailing equipment for A Cat rules require bucket and hand pump, 2 anchors, length of chain etc. Might want to review and update rules.

Training - Fleet Captain Heacock reported training has been informal unless a specific request is received.

Appeals - Roger Brown reported one appeal was filed but not properly; unless corrected, there is no appeal.

Junior Sailing - no report

USSail General Programs and Services - Roger Brown reported that USSail is considering eliminating "Areas" and making Districts - Areas A, B and C would be merged together to form one district. They are proposing an Olympic Pyramid which would support and fund "talented" sailors to go on to represent the U.S. in the Olympic games. This would eliminate the Sears, Bemis, Adams, Mallory, etc. Exceptional juniors would be chosen and trained and coached by professional trainers. BBYRA delegates unanimously asked that our repesentative, Roger Brown, vote against this plan.

Membership - report submitted by Werner Wedam.

Treasurer Ann Attridge submitted report, still outstanding bills to be paid (approx. \$6,000) - end of year should just about "break even."

Historian - no report

New Business:

Dave Ruiter of MCYC asked if and when BBYRA history would appear on Website - response was that some clubs have their own individual report not active - perhaps each club can gather history and send it to Bernie Biegel; eventually will evolve and maybe scores can be sent in each Saturday after the races. Lewry will work over the winter to try to implement a system - John Heacock will assist.

Elections - Dave Loughran distributed copies of Nominating Committee's recommendations: T. Donald McNeil, Commodore; Henry Waite, V. Commodore; Harry Foote, Rear Commodore; John Heacock, Fleet Captain; James G. Carson, Mearurer; Anne Attridge, Treasurer; Eleanor Gelenitis, Secretary. Nominations closed, unanimous vote.

Commodore McNeil announced that all committees would remain the same as last year and which are published in the annual book.

Budget - reviewed, some figures changed, approved for \$25,800. A committee of Don McNeil, Charlie Logan, and Ann Attridge will look into getting a new vendor to make the burgees awarded to weekly winners; report will be given next meeting.

1997 schedule was reviewed and finalized.

Roger Brown reported that the TRYC had suffered a loss on the Commodores Ball which they graciously absorbed. Roger also reported that theBlue Gavel organization had held the raffle at the Ball and one half of the proceeds were given toward expenses, the remaining one half was kept for their group. Hank Waite expressed a dissenting opinion in that it was inappropriate that the Blue Gavel should raise mon ey at a BBYRA affair and take 1/2 of the proceeds for themselves. A few of the other deegates expressed the same opinion - this question will be discussed in committee

Meeting adjourned at 3 p.m.
