

## **DELEGATES MEETING**

Bay Head Yacht Club October 3, 1998

### **MINUTES**

The Delegates Meeting was called to order at 1330 by Commodore Henry Waite. Roll call was taken by Secretary Betty Jane France. All clubs were represented with the exception of Beachwood Yacht Club.

A motion was made, seconded, and passed to accept the minutes as written. There was no correspondence.

## **OFFICER REPORTS:**

## Commodore

Commodore Henry Waite welcomed those present.

He reported that the Executive Committee had met at 1130 with greater attendance and a more lengthy meeting than usual. They passed all issues that will be brought before this meeting. The Working Committee will continue to meet over the winter and will address many areas.

### Vice Commodore

Vice Commodore Harry Foote thanked all who made the season a success.

Race management is moving forward.

## Rear Commodore

Rear Commodore Patricia Applegate thanked P/C Job Gash for procuring marks and transporting the trailer each week. She also thanked Charles Logan for acquiring new flag bags, her husband John Applegate for splicing line, and GPU.

Plexiglass placards are needed for next season.

The Liaison Meeting will be held at 1000 on November 21 at Toms River Yacht Club followed by the Regatta Committee Meeting at 1330.

#### Fleet Captain

Fleet Captain John Heacock reported that major problems were avoided in the safety area. 166 boats were inspected with 8 failing.

#### Measurer

Measurer James Carson reported that there are no measurement problems.

#### **Treasurer**

Treasurer Anne Attridge presented the Treasurer's Report which was accepted for file.

The Treasurer's goal is to have one year's operating expenses in reserve.

### **COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

### BBYRA Representative to US Sailing

P/C Roger Brown reported that there will be a meeting in three weeks.

The cost of running ladder events is being evaluated to justify US Sailing still conducting them. Entry fees are being looked at as they are considered to be too expensive.

## Junior Sailing

Chair Evelyn Seymour reported a successful summer. Two fun days were held.

Down Bay Interclubs were held on five days with 255 sailors registered.

Up Bay Interclubs were hosted by Shore Acres Yacht Club for the first time.

There is interest in building the 420 Fleet; questions are being raised relative to crew age.

There is confusion concerning qualifiers for the Midgets.

The question was raised regarding junior instructors who do not belong to a member club or the BBYRA racing on Saturdays. It was explained that five instructors raced this past season; letters must be sent to the BBYRA.

Evelyn met with many club instructors at IHYC and "picked their brains". They requested instructional clinics and a weekly race series for instructors.

The BBYRA is concerned about junior sailor participation dropping on Saturdays.

Various suggestions relative to increasing junior participation were mentioned and will be addressed over the winter.

Membership

Chair P/C Werner Wedam announced that he will not be chairperson in 1999 but will assist the new chair who should be computer literate, have adequate equipment, and have sufficient time. Decals for 1999 have been purchased.

1998 saw an increase of greater than 300 members compared to 1997.

Werner will send flowers to Carol LaPier from the BBYRA to thank her for her hours of work.

General Programs and Services

Chair P/C T. Donald McNeil reported that pictures of trophies have been taken.

The Commodores' Ball and fund raising will be addressed with the suggestion being made to consult a tax attorney concerning fund raising.

Historical

No report.

Scorer

Chair Harold Lewry reported that all scores posted September 5, 1998 are final. The number of boats scored, season registrations, and qualifiers have once again dropped off.

Harold noted that the Late Registration boat was not always on station prior to the warning for the first race.

He requested better accountability of boats in the starting area by recording those boats who decide not to race prior to their prep signal and those who decide not to race after their prep signal.

Percentage penalties need to be dropped from the scoring sheets; they have been officially dropped but not eliminated from the computer program.

## **OLD BUSINESS:**

BBYRA Bylaws Change

Chair P/C David Loughran addressed the Bylaws changes.

Article Eleven, paragraph 7, second sentence, was passed with a roll call vote to read, "It shall consist of the Past Commodores of the BBYRA (who, collectively, shall have one vote), the Vice Commodore of the BBYRA who shall act as chairperson, the Rear Commodore who shall act as vice chairperson, the Treasurer, the Secretary, the Fleet Captain and the Measurer (all of whom shall have no vote, unless they are also representing their clubs; in the event of a tie vote, the Vice Commodore, and in his absence, the Rear Commodore may vote); and one Representative and one Alternate Representative designated by each Active and Associate Member Club."

Article Eleven, paragraph 17, add a third sentence, was passed with a roll call vote to read, "The General Programs and Services Committee shall develop a Policies and Procedure Manual for the conduct of any fund raising activities to be undertaken by or on behalf of the Association, by any of its Active or Associate Member Clubs, or Individual Members. Said manual shall deal explicitly with fiscal responsibility for such activities."

## Trophies and Insurance

Chair P/C T. Donald McNeil reported that plaques for this year were an overwhelming success. We will alternate back to bowls next year.

Insurance

Don explained that Patterson McKenna assured him that we are well covered by three companies and that any future increase we might incur will be slight. Officers and chairpersons are covered relative to BBYRA activities.

Deeds of Gift: Funds and Trophies

Commodore Waite and P/C McNeil are working on deeds of gift.

P/C William Studdiford has copies of the deeds of gift which he will make available.

BBYRA Video

P/C McNeil reported for Greg Parmele that hopefully the video will be ready for the 1999 Commodores Ball. Greg is looking for very old and current photographs.

BBYRA Website

The website is nonexistent but Jack Heacock will continue to pursue it.

Commodores' Ball Raffle

P/C David Loughran reported that the Commodores' Ball raffle, run by District 22 International Order of the Blue Gavel, realized a net profit of \$1725 which was contributed to the BBYRA Edward W. Feirer Memorial Fund.

He reported that the bridge of District 22, IOBG, voted not to conduct a raffle at the 1999 Commodores' Ball and not to become involved directly, as an organization, in the conduct of the 1999 Ball.

Commodore Waite expressed his appreciation to Dave and to IOBG for their past efforts.

### **NEW BUSINESS:**

Proposed 1999 Budget

Treasurer Anne Attridge presented the 1999 Budget; After three changes were made, a motion was made, seconded, and passed to approve the \$23,400 budget.

Commodore Waite urged those present to see that the information sheets from their respective clubs are returned to the secretary as promptly as possible.

#### REPORT of the Scorer for the 1998 REGATTA SEASON

THE 1998 BBYRA REGATTA Season has been successfully completed.

All scores posted September 5,1998 are final.

The number of boats scored, season registrations, and qualifiers have once again dropped off. For the 1998 season there was a total of 229 boats registered of which 134 were seasonal registrants. There were 124 qualifiers of which 107 were seasonally registered. For the 10 regatta series we scored a total of 1170 boats. It should be noted that although the total number of boats increased a little, the total number scored for the 10-race regatta decreased by about 200. For the last regatta at Seaside Park we had a total of 12 single day sailors. A summary of the 1998 Regatta Season is appended to this report.

There were 4 protests and 2 requests for redress. All were successfully concluded and the results of the decisions are reflected in the final scores.

The Club 420 class qualified 3 out of 9 boats from 4 clubs. It should be noted that in the Special Series only 2 boats qualified of the 7 that registered and that for one half of the season only 1 or 2 boats appeared. In the Special Radial Class only 2 boats sailed 1 race and 1 boat sailed 2 races. No boats qualified.

## 1998 ITEMS SUGGESTED To Be Investigated

It is requested that provisions be made to obtain better accountability of boats starting a race. Several times this year, boats were listed as CUT that had decided not to race within their prep. Our sailing rules state that boats that come to the starting line will rank as a starter. (Section E, Paragraph 5). While the Sailing Instructions Paragraph 5.2 state "Any registered boat sailing in the starting area between her preparatory and starting signals will be considered a starter". This information should be reported to the Bridge as soon as practical, so that it may be entered on the count sheet along with the time of withdrawal (Prior to or after the PREP signal).

It was noted that the Late Registration boat was not always on station prior to the warning for the first race. One time the Late Registration Boat did not appear until the start of the second class in the afternoon. Since this boat is listed as being the official accountability unit, an effort should be made to ensure its being on station well in advance of the first warning gun for both the morning and afternoon races.

It is also requested that permission be granted to delete the 40%, 60%, and 80% penalties from the scoring system. The letter "o" will thus be freed up so that we may use it to record boats on the course side (OCS) of the starting line at their start. This may take a year to implement since several sections of the program must be rewritten.
