HISTORY

For many years prior to the inception of the Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association, yacht racing was the popular sport on the Bay. Commodore Herman Muller of the Seaside Park Yacht Club invited members of local yacht clubs to meet with him on February 11, 1914 to discuss the advisability of forming an association to foster and unify yacht racing on Barnegat Bay. Four clubs were represented at this meeting, Bay Head, Island Heights, Ocean Gate and Seaside Park. After agreement as to the name and purpose of the Association, Commodore J.V.A. Cattus of the Bay Head Yacht Club was unanimously elected Chairman and to serve with him, Commodore E. A. Lloyd, Jr., as Vice Chairman, Commodore Herman Muller, Secretary and Mr. M.R.H. Crowell, Treasurer. The first regular meeting was held March 11, 1914 at the Bellevue-Stratford Hotel, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, at which time the original Bylaws were adopted and a racing schedule formulated, the first race being held at the Seaside Park Yacht Club on July 4 of that year. At this first meeting, the Association was enlarged by the election of the Mantoloking Yacht Club into its membership.

The first season's championships awarded by this new organization was in 1914. The first annual meeting was held on October 21 of that year and by this time, membership had grown to six Clubs by the addition of the Lavallette Yacht Club and an official Regatta Committee was appointed then known as "The Racing Commission." In 1922, the Toms River Yacht Club was elected to membership. The following Clubs were subsequently elected to Membership: Shore Acres Yacht Club (1941), Beachwood Yacht Club (1946), Metedeconk River Yacht Club (1946), Normandy Beach Yacht Club (1947), Manasquan River Yacht Club (1962), and Pine Beach Yacht Club (1979).

The development of this Association has been gradual but sound, and each and every group of officers have contributed their time and energy to bring about an institution that should continue to prosper as long as the tide ebbs and flows on Barnegat Bay.

US SAILING EVENTS GENERAL INFORMATION

- All entrants (skippers and crew) must be members of the BBYRA and US SAILING. Proof of membership must be demonstrated at registration. (Membership forms available at registration)
- 2. All entries must be forwarded by their respective REGATTA COMMITTEE REPRESENTATIVES on forms provided. NO ENTRY WILL BE ACCEPTED WITHOUT A PROPERLY COMPLETED FORM. Regatta Committee Representatives are reminded of the Delegates action. "It will be the duty of each Club Representative to provide a yacht in racing condition of the class designated when he forwards his Club's entry in BBYRA Eliminations for National Cup Events." Entries must reach the Chairman by July 11, 1998 for the Sears, Bemis, Smythe, Adams, and Mallory events. Late entries will not be accepted.
- One crew from each Club will be accepted in each category for BBYRA Elimination. The O'Day and Junior Events have no limits as to number of entrants for BBYRA Elimination.
- 4. Definition of Age/Sex Requirements are as follows:

Juniors: Boys and Girls who have reached their thirteenth but not their nineteenth birthday during the Calendar Year.

Adams: Women only - skipper and crew must be eighteen, one crew member may be fifteen.

- 5. BBYRA Perpetual Trophies for US Sailing Events shall be awarded to the winner of the BBYRA eliminations when there are two or more registrants and a sail-off occurs. In the event that only one competitor enters the BBYRA elimination and represents the BBYRA in the Area C Semi-Finals the Championship Flag shall be awarded. If no one enters the BBYRA elimination, then no trophy or flag shall be awarded.
- 6. In the event that there is no BBYRA Elimination scheduled for a US Sailing event, the BBYRA Perpetual Trophy and Flag shall be awarded to the top BBYRA competitor in the Area C Semi-Final, provided the Area C Semi-Finals are sailed on Barnegat Bay.

THE MIDDLE ATLANTIC MIDGET CHAMPIONSHIP

- The Middle Atlantic Midget Championship is open to amateurs. Members of each crew may be boys or girls who will not reach their fifteenth birthday during the calendar year in which they compete.
- 2. All members of each crew must be themselves, or their parents or guardians must be, members of the same yacht club; the club must be a member in good standing on one of the following US SAILING Associations: Eastern Connecticut Yacht Racing Association, Hudson River Yacht Racing Association, Great South Bay Yacht Racing Association, Eastern Long Island Yacht Racing Association, North Jersey Yacht Racing Association, Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association, South Jersey Yacht Racing Association, or Chesapeake Bay Yacht Racing Association.
- 3. No crew or helmsman after participating or being entered in the midget elimination series for one Middle Atlantic Midget Championship Association (including a yacht club elimination series) can be a member of a crew from another club for the Championship Association in any one year.
- A club can enter a crew in only one Association or group elimination. Individuals
 who belong to more than one yacht Club may represent only one yacht club in
 these races.

BBYRA ELIMINATION

- Entry fee is \$10.00 per person. All entrants must submit completed registration form no later than July 19, 1996.
- Each entrant must be a current BBYRA member.

PRIZES

Trophies listed above will be awarded at Regatta Headquarters at the conclusion of the morning and afternoon races.

First place individual regatta pennants (a small rooster Flag) will be awarded for each race of the championship series. Second place pennants (red swallow-tailed pennant with host clubs' letters and year) will be awarded to yachts in each race of the championship series when there are at least 4 starters. Third place pennants (white swallow-tailed pennant with the host clubs' letters and year) will be awarded in each race of the championship series when there are at least 7 or more starters.

Season championship flags and trophies will be awarded to the winning yacht in each class. Second place trophies will be awarded where there are at least 4 qualifiers, third place trophies will be awarded when there are at least 7 qualifiers, fourth place trophies will be awarded when there are at least 18 qualifiers, and fifth place trophies will be awarded when there are at least 28 qualifiers.

A small B.B.Y.R.A. flag will be awarded to all qualifying yachts. The B.B.Y.R.A. reserves the right to suspend the daily or seasonal awards if the award is dependant on the result of a protest or appeal.

SPECIAL AWARDS

The O.G. Dale Memorial Trophy (BBYRA): "Awarded for a period of one year in recognition of outstanding sportsmanship in the Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association." This award recognizes outstanding sportsmanship and conduct. Any sailor, skipper or crew, Senior or Junior is eligible to be nominated for this award.

"If no one's name readily comes to mind during the racing season, there is no need to make the award."

(Excerpts from the Deed of Gift)

The George Roth Powell, Jr. Trophy (SPYC) reads "In memory of George Roth Powell, Jr.; an annual award to the outstanding Junior of Barnegat Bay for character and American sportsmanship."

The B.B.Y.R.A. Past Commodores Trophy will be presented to the member Yacht Club fostering the greatest participation in yacht racing on Barnegat Bay.

The B.B.Y.R.A. Race Management Trophy may be awarded as provided in its deed of gift. Eligibility requirements available upon request.

The Rae Theodore LaPier Memorial Trophy - The Trophy shall be awarded annually to that representative of BBYRA or one of its member clubs who has demonstrated outstanding achievement in the fostering and management of sailing on Barnegat Bay, New Jersey.

SCORING

Scoring for the BBYRA Championship will be in accordance with Section E. of the Racing Rules of the Association. For 1998 all classes will be scored in accordance with paragraphs 5 and 6 except A CAT which will be scored in accordance with paragraph 7 and E SLOOP which, contrary to paragraph 3, must be classified as a starter in all but **two** races of those started for that class.

SAFETY

All boats must carry equipment specified by her class rules, the U.S.C.G. and such additional equipment as specified in Appendix 1 to the Racing Rules of the Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association. The Race Committee may at any time request a boat to display her safety equipment, and any yacht found not to be carrying her required safety equipment shall be disqualified from the race just completed.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS

AGE LIMIT: "A contestant will be considered eligible when his or her age-limit will not have been reached on the last day of the calendar year."

Blue Jay: 18 years and younger; cannot turn 19 during the calendar year

Flying Scot: "Challenger Division": open to any Flying Scot competitor not qualifying in the top ten during the preceding year.

Laser Radial Junior Division: 16 years and younger - cannot turn 17 during the calendar year

Laser Master: (class subdivision) 45 years of age or older

Club 420: Skipper, 21 years and younger; cannot turn 22 in the calendar year;

Crew: No age limit

The Racing Rules & Sailing Instructions which follow are current as of the date of publication of this book. Changes made after publication will be published in the official Rules & Sailing Instructions available at Regatta Headquarters and the Late Entry Boat or posted on the Official Notice Board located in the vicinity of the registration desk.

RACING RULES OF THE BARNEGAT BAY YACHT RACING ASSOCIATION

A. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. All races held under the jurisdiction of the Association shall be sailed under the rules of the IYRU, the prescriptions of the US SAILING, the Sailing Instructions and these Rules. In as much as no Rules can be devised to cover every situation, it shall be the duty of the Regatta Committee to decide all questions which may arise. In deciding such questions the Regatta Committee shall not act before satisfying itself that its action is as equitable as possible to all boats concerned.
- All races held under the jurisdiction of the Association shall be conducted by a Race Committee appointed by the Regatta Committee of the Association and chaired by the Vice Commodore.
- Each year Regatta Committee shall adopt Sailing instructions which shall be provided to all entrants. The Regatta Committee should also cause appropriate race information not contained in these Rules and required by IYRR II Part 2, "Notice of Race," to be published in the Annual Regatta Schedule. (See Championship Regattas in this Handbook)

B. ELIGIBILITY

- 1. A boat entered for a race must be a bona fide property of a recognized yacht club or of the person in whose name she is entered, who must be a member of a yacht club of the Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association. A member chartering a boat shall be deemed the owner provided said boat has been chartered in good faith for a period of not less than thirty days.
- 2. Any class qualifying three or more boats in the previous year's series will be eligible for competition. Additional classes may be considered upon written petition to the Regatta Committee by at least six skippers representing a minimum of three member clubs. Such petition shall include a commitment from each skipper stating his/her intention to qualify for the championship. Any new class accepted shall be considered "provisional" for a period of at least one year. Provisional classes are not eligible for championship or race awards. Those classes eligible for competition each year shall be designated by the Regatta Committee and published in the Annual Regatta Schedule.
- In junior classes with an age limit, a contestant will be considered eligible when his age limit birthday will not have been reached on the last day of the calendar year.
- 4. Skippers/Helmsmen are required to be members of the BBYRA, a member Club of said Association, and their respective class organizations. Member Clubs are expected to furnish the Regatta Committee with a membership list and a list of BBYRA contributing members prior to June 15th of each year.

C. ENTRIES

- A member of the Regatta Committee shall supervise the receipt of entries and fees in all classes.
- 2. Entries shall be made as required by the Regatta Committee.
- An entry fee will be charged for the season or each race of the championship series for all classes at rates established by the BBYRA. "Entry Fees are Nonrefundable."

D. RACING TRIM

- 1. All one-design and restricted classes must file with the Association Measurer a copy of their class rules and regulations which shall include restrictions, measurements and designations pertaining to the hull, mast, rigging, sails, and crew limitations as to weight and number, not later than two weeks prior to the date of the first championship regatta. These will remain frozen through the current Regatta season. No boat will be entitled to start in any race unless the boat meets the above mentioned requirements and conforms to the racing rules and regulations of the Association.
- A record of class restrictions and designations including sails, crew limitations, equipment, etc., will be maintained by the Association Measurer.
- All boats must carry safety equipment as specified by their class, as may be required by the USCG and as set forth in Appendix 1. Deviations for any class may be granted by the Regatta Committee.

E. SCORING

GENERAL CONDITIONS

- Each season the Association will award the championship to the boat in each class making the best score according to the method outlined below. The BBYRA may act to suspend the awards of a class's season championship series if the final outcome of its series is dependent on the outcome of an appeal.
- Only those races designated for points in the championship series will be considered in computing the record of each boat. No new class shall be added to the race program for championship purposes after the issuance of the Annual Regatta Schedule.
- In order to qualify for the championship a boat must be classified as a starter in all but three races of those started for her class except as indicated in the Annual Regatta Schedule.
- Points shall be awarded to a boat and may not be transferred except by specific written permission of the Regatta Committee.
- 5. A boat shall rank as a starter if she has entered in accordance with Section C of these rules and comes to the starting line. No race shall be declared official unless there are two or more starters. Boats not ranking as starters will not be scored.

RACE SCORES

6. a) Each boat starting and finishing in a race, and not thereafter retiring or being disqualified, shall score one point for finishing plus one point for each boat beaten. All other boats which rank as starters shall score 0 points except as otherwise provided in these Rules. All boats ranking as starters shall be considered beaten whether or not they start, finish, retire, or are disqualified.

- b) Notwithstanding paragraph a, any class which so requests prior to March 15th, may be scored in accordance with RRS A2.2, Low Point System, modified so that all boats ranking as starters that do not start, finish, retire, or are disqualified will be scored points for the finishing place one more than the total number of starters. When such request is granted, it shall remain in effect until a new request is received.
- A boat taking a Scoring Penalty shall be scored in accordance with RRS 44.3, Scoring Penalty.
- Races not started and deemed "abandoned, not to be sailed", shall not be scored. The total number of races in the series shall be reduced by the number of "abandoned, not to be sailed" races.
- When a race is sailed and subsequently "abandoned, not to be sailed", only boats ranking as starters will be entered for purposes of qualification in accordance with Par. E3 & E11.

SERIES SCORES

- 10. The championship record of a qualified boat will be her total score divided by the number of points she would have received had she finished first in every race she ranked as a starter except as modified by Paragraphs E3 & E11 of these Rules. When scored in accordance with 6.a), highest score wins; with 6.b) lowest score wins.
- A boat which ranks as a starter in more than the minimum number of races required to qualify shall have that race most detrimental to her record excluded.

TIES

- 12. a) Modifying RRS A1.4 a), if two or more boats tie for first place in a race involving a trophy, the Regatta Committee may order a resail if possible, otherwise the trophy will be awarded to each boat to be held an equal length of time.
 - b) Modifying RRS A1.4 b) and A2.3, in the event that two or more boats tie in the final championship standings, the boat that has finished ahead of the other the greatest number of times in the championship shall be considered the winner. If this does not break the tie, RRS A2.3 will apply.

ADMINISTRATIVE RULES

- 13. A report of each championship race giving the identification of all boats registered therein and their order of finish shall be filed with the Scorer of the Regatta Committee and kept for two years.
- 14. A suitable Point Accumulation Sheet will be maintained by the scorer showing in detail the record of each boat's activity for the current racing season. All scores shall be considered final eight days after they are posted on the official notice board except that they shall be considered final at 0830 on the day of the final regatta and unless a decision on a valid protest or appeal is pending.
- 15. First place individual regatta pennants will be awarded for each race of the championship series. Second place pennants will be awarded when there are at least four starters and third place when there are at least seven starters.
- 16. Season championship flags and trophies will be awarded to the winning boat in each class. Second place trophies will be awarded when there are at least four qualifiers; third place when there are at least seven qualifiers; fourth place when there are at least 18 qualifiers and fifth place when there are at least 28 qualifiers.

F. PROTESTS, DISQUALIFICATIONS & APPEALS

- Protests and Hearings shall be in accordance with current US SAILING Procedures except as modified in the Sailing Instructions.
- 2. All decisions upon written protests shall be in writing and filed with the Scorer along with the original protest papers. The Scorer, after noting any adjustments to the scores of the boat(s) involved, shall forward the original protest, decision and pertinent papers to the Secretary of the Association who shall keep them on the file for a period of two years.
- 3. An owner or his representative or the Race Committee wishing to appeal the decision of the protest committee must signify that by filing a written appeal, postmarked not later than 15 days following receipt of the written decision, which shall be sent to the Scorer with copies to the chairman of the Appeals Committee and the chairman of the Regatta Committee of the BBYRA. A copy shall also be sent to the other boat(s) involved, who appeared or were entitled to appear at the protest hearing. The written appeal shall contain the grounds for the appeal. Appeals to the Appeals Committee of the Association shall be limited to interpretation of the rules.
- The Appeals Committee of the Association may affirm or reverse the decision of the Protest Committee.
- Decisions of the Appeals Committee shall be in writing and the grounds of each decision shall be specified therein. Copies thereof shall be sent to all parties to the infringement and appeal.
- The Appeals Committee prescribes that anyone submitting an Appeal shall include payment of \$10.00.

BARNEGAT BAY YACHT RACING ASSOCIATION 1998 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS - UPPER BAY TOMS RIVER SEASIDE PARK

1. RULES

Races will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), the prescriptions of US SAILING, the Racing Rules of the BBYRA and by these Sailing Instructions.

2. NOTICE TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located in the vicinity of the registration desk at the regatta headquarters.

3. CHANGES IN SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change in the sailing instructions will be posted at least one hour prior to the scheduled AM or PM Warning Signal.

4. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

Signals made ashore will be displayed at the regatta headquarters.

5. ACCOUNTABILITY

- 5.1 Changes of registered skipper or sail number must be submitted in writing at the registration desk or late entry boat.
- 5.2 Onus for being counted as a starter or non-starter rests with each boat. Boats intending to race should pass close by the late entry boat, hail class and sail number, and receive acknowledgement. A boat which comes to the starting line and elects not to race must so advise the late entry boat before her preparatory signal. Any registered boat sailing in the starting area between her preparatory and starting signals will be considered a starter.
- 5.3 The committee will endeavor to account for all entered boats. If a boat does not start or fails to finish, the skipper shall report to the Regatta Committee or Patrol Boat flying a numbered patrol flag before leaving the course. Any boat withdrawing from the race without prompt notice may be disqualified for the next two races.

6. CLASS SIGNALS & STARTING TIME

7. THE COURSE

- 7.1 The course chart shows the approximate location of marks, the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.
- 7.2 The Class designation and number of course to be sailed by that Class will be displayed, contrary to RRS 27.1, at its Preparatory Signal and remain until its starting signal.
- 7.3 When courses 90 through 97 are signaled, the PORTABLE MARK COURSE ADDENDUM will apply.
- 7.4 The race Committee may elect to establish a special turning marker for the "E" Sloop Class near the final turning marker of the course. In such case this marker will be an orange cylinder carrying flag E.
- 7.5 Any special course will be posted on the Official Notice Board at least one hour prior to the scheduled Warning Signal.

8. MARKS

Marks will be drums painted orange and white with identifying letters painted in black, except as noted.

9. THE START

- 9.1 Races will be started in accordance with RRS 26, System 2 with classes starting at intervals and in the order shown under Class Signals and Starting Times.
- 9.2 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the committee boat as the starboard end and an orange cylinder with the letter "L" painted on the side at the port end.
- 9.3 An orange ball attached to the Committee Boat is considered a part of the mark.
- 9.4 Boats sailing on a leg of the course may not cross the start or finish line except to start, finish or if the start of finish mark is a rounding mark.
- 9.5 A boat shall not start more than four minutes after her starting signal.

10. RECALLS

- 10.1 Individual recalls will be signaled in accordance with RRS 29.2. In addition, the Race Committee may attempt to hail each boat that has not started correctly. Failure to make or hear such hail will not be ground for redress.
- 10.2 Modifying RRS 29.3, a general recall will be signaled by display of the first substitute over a blue shape (preparatory signal) with a sound signal. Means: "The class is recalled for a new start. This signal will be lowered four minutes after the aborted start with a sound signal. This will be one minute before the restart signal".

10.3 When a general recall has been signaled, starts for the succeeding classes will be postponed accordingly.

11. THE FINISH

- 11.1 The Race Committee will attempt to establish a windward finish for the first class to finish. Failure to do so will not be grounds for redress.
- 11.2 The finish line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the race committee boat and an orange cylinder with an "L" painted on the side, except as indicated in the PORTABLE MARK COURSE ADDENDUM.

12. TIME LIMIT

The time limit will be 2 1/2 hours for AM classes and 3 hours for PM classes. A boat finishing more than 30 minutes after the first boat of her class finishes or after the time limit, whichever is later, will be scored "Did not finish."

13. PROTESTS

- 13.1 The BBYRA prescribes the following modification of RRS 61.1: (a): A protesting boat must fly Code Flag "B" or a red rectangular flag no smaller than 6 inches by 8 inches in order to signify her intent to protest.
- 13.2 Protests shall be written on forms available at the regatta headquarters or late registration boat and lodged in accordance with RRS 61.3.
- 13.3 Protests not disposed of on race day will be heard at Regatta Headquarters commencing at 0730 on the next scheduled race day.

14. PENALTIES

- 14.1 The 720 Degree Turns Penalty, RRS 44.2 will apply with the additional provision that when a boat breaks a rule with spinnaker drawing, drops it completely while taking her penalty and resets it and has it drawing after the penalty, the penalty is one full turn or 360 degrees instead of two full turns.
- 14.2 Notwithstanding paragraph 14.1, a boat may elect to accept a Scoring Penalty, RRS 44.3.
- 14.4 All penalties taken shall be reported to the Regatta Committee immediately after finishing.

15. SAFETY

- 15.1 All Junior class competitors (Junior Laser Radial Club 420 & Blue Jay) shall wear life jackets or other adequate personal buoyancy as specified in Rules 1.2 and 40 at all times while racing.
- 15.2 "E" sloops shall deploy mainsail flotation at all times while racing.

15.3 Safety inspections will be conducted at the discretion of the committee. Flag "L" and a class signal displayed at the finish line will indicate a mandatory inspection. Boats are required to respond by checking in with a safety patrol boat flying flag "L" and the class signal while laying at anchor to windward of the finish line. All boats must be acknowledged.

16. POSTPONEMENT SIGNAL ("AP", Answering Pennant)

Modifying Race Signals, this signal made before 1:15 PM does not refer to afternoon races.

17. COME WITHIN HAIL SIGNAL (Flag "L")

With respect to Race Signals, flag L, when displayed afloat to indicate "Come within hail", is mandatory. Failure to respond will be grounds for disqualification.

18. MARK MISSING (Flag M) MODIFYING Race Signals, sound signals while displaying flag M may be omitted.

19. ABANDONMENT SIGNALS (Flags N & N over H)

Modifying Race Signals, Flag "N" over "H" means, "All races including those not started are abandoned and will not be sailed." This signal made before 1:15 PM does not refer to afternoon races.

20. SHORTEN COURSE SIGNAL (Flag "S")

Modifying Race Signals, this signal displayed at a rounding mark means "All classes finish between the rounding mark and this boat." When this signal is displayed over one or more class flags it pertains to those classes only.

21. RADIO COMMUNICATION

A boat shall neither make, receive, nor monitor radio communications while racing.

22. SIGNALS

The following signals will be used in accordance with RACE SIGNALS shown in the Racing Rules of Sailing, except as modified in these Sailing Instructions:



Marks will be yellow inflatables. New marks, as provided in instruction 25, Change of Course after the Start, will be orange inflatables.

25. CHANGE OF COURSE AFTER THE START

A change of course after the start will be signaled before the leading boat has begun the leg, although the new mark may not be in position. Any mark to be rounded after rounding the new mark may be relocated to maintain the original course configuation. When in a subsequent change of course a new mark is replaced, it will be replaced with an original mark.

26. THE FINISH

The finishing line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on a race committee boat displaying the flag/flags designating the class/classes using this finish line and the nearby mark.

BBYRA BYLAWS

Adopted October 1, 1994

ARTICLE ONE - NAME

The name of this Corporation is the Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association.

(hereinafter BBYRA)

ARTICLE TWO - PURPOSE

The BBYRA is organized exclusively to foster amateur sailboat racing competition in yachts on Barnegat Bay and on a national and international level and to support and develop amateur athletes for the sport of sailboat racing, including for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations under Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (or corresponding section of any future tax code). It may provide training for candidates and their crews by organizing and/or holding competitive events and holding of meetings in the nature of seminars. The proscriptions of the United States Sailing Association, Inc., (hereinafter USSAILING) with respect to matters of race, color, religion, age, sex or national origin shall apply to the BBYRA.

ARTICLE THREE - MEMBERSHIP

- Membership in the BBYRA shall consist of three classes: Active, Associate and Individual.
- a) The active Membership class consists of Yacht Clubs, represented by delegates hereinafter described, and presently consists of: Bayhead Yacht Club; Beachwood Yacht Club; Island Heights Yacht Club; Lavallette Yacht Club; Manasquan River Yacht Club; Mantoloking Yacht Club; Metedeconk River Yacht Club; Normandy Beach Yacht Club; Ocean Gate Yacht Club; Pine Beach Yacht Club; Seaside Park Yacht Club; Shore Acres Yacht Club; and Toms River Yacht Club; and such additional yacht clubs located between Manasquan Inlet and Little Egg Harbor Inlet or waters tributary thereto as may be hereafter elected to membership as an Active member. No club shall be elected to Active Membership unless it has been an Associate Member for at least two years immediately preceding its application.
- b) The Associate Membership class shall consist of Yacht Clubs which have been elected by three-fourths vote of the Executive Committee of the BBYRA, after submittal of a written application signed by an elected officer of the Club and by an elected officer of an Active club, which certifies the applicant has at least five yachts of a class or classes presently scheduled in the BBYRA Regattas. Yachts of Associate Member Clubs shall enjoy rights and privileges of yachts of Active Member Clubs, including representation on the Regatta Committee of the BBYRA. Associate Member Clubs will not be required to sponsor a Regatta. An Associate Member Club may apply for Active membership after two consecutive years of Associate Membership immediately prior to its application for Active membership. Associate Member Clubs shall not have voting rights.
- c) The Individual Membership class consists of persons who belong to Active or Associate member Clubs of the BBYRA, and desire to assist in supporting the objects and purposes of the BBYRA by payment of the annual dues established by the Delegates each year for such class of membership.

- 2. All members shall have the privilege of attending or being represented at all annual and special meetings of the BBYRA. All members shall receive such BBYRA publications as the Delegates shall from time to time prescribe.
- 3. Individual Members shall be eligible to hold office and serve on committees.
- The Delegates shall establish a schedule of annual dues to be paid by each class of membership.
- The membership of any member may be declared forfeit by the Delegates for nonpayment of dues.

ARTICLE FOUR - MEETINGS

- 1. The annual meetings of the BBYRA shall be held on the first Saturday in October and notice shall be sent to each Active and Associate Member Club at least 30 days prior to such date. When practicable, the time and place of all routinely scheduled meetings will be published in the BBYRA's year book
- A quorum shall consist of twelve (12) delegates, provided they shall represent eight (8) Active Member Clubs.
- At least (15) days notice of all meetings of the BBYRA shall be given, in writing, to each delegate and all others whose attendance is required.
- Special meetings of the BBYRA or its Executive Committee may be held at the call
 of the Commodore, or upon request of the delegates of two (2) Active Member Clubs.
- 5. The delegates or any committee of the BBYRA may act without a meeting if, before or after the action, each delegate or committee member shall consent, in writing, to the action. The written consents shall be filed with the minutes of the meeting.

ARTICLE FIVE - VOTE

- 1. Active Member Clubs shall be represented at meetings by Delegates, who shall be Individual Members, and may be three (3) in number, one of whom shall be the Active Member Club's Commodore or Vice Commodore. The names and addresses of those delegates who shall represent the Club must be sent to the Secretary of the BBYRA not later than January 1 of each year. Delegates shall be equivalent to "Board" as defined in New Jersey Statutes Annotated (N.J.S.A.) 15A: 1-2b.*
- " ['Board means the board of trustees or the group of persons vested with management of the business and affairs of the corporation irrespective of the name by which the group is designated; "entire board" means all the trustees then in office. "L. 1983, c. 127, Section 15A: 1-2b, eff. Oct. 1, 1983]
- Each Associate Member Club shall be represented by one of its members, who shall be an individual Member of the BBYRA. Said representative will not be entitled to vote, but his or her views on any topic shall be given a reasonable opportunity to be aired.
- Each Active Member Club shall be entitled to one vote. Voting may be done by proxy, which shall be filed with the recording secretary at the meeting.
- A majority of those present in person and by proxy shall determine all questions, except as may be otherwise provided herein.

ARTICLE SIX - OFFICERS

1. The BBYRA shall have the following officers: Commodore (who shall be President

for purposes of the New Jersey Nonprofit Corporation Act), Vice Commodore (who shall be Vice-President for purposes of the New Jersey Nonprofit Corporation Act), Rear Commodore, Fleet Captain, Secretary, Treasurer, and Measurer, all of whom shall be elected at the annual meeting. The Commodore, Vice Commodore and Rear Commodore shall be elected from the Delegates; the Fleet Captain, Secretary, Treasurer, and Measurer may be elected from the Individual Members of any Active Member Club.

The BBYRA'S Representative to the Council of Sailing Associations of the USSAILING., shall be appointed by the Commodore from the past or present officers of the BBYRA, and shall be a current Individual Member.

ARTICLE SEVEN - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

- 1. Commodore (President): The Commodore shall preside at all meetings of the BBYRA and perform such other duties as may be delegated from time to time by the Delegates. The Commodore shall be an ex-official member of all Committees. The Commodore shall be the chief executive officer of the BBYRA and shall have general charge and supervision over and responsibility for the affairs of the BBYRA. The Commodore may enter into and execute, in the name of the BBYRA, contracts or other instruments not in the regular course of business which are authorized, either generally or specifically, by the Delegates. The Commodore shall have the general powers and duties of management usually vested in the office of president of a corporation. From time to time the Commodore may delegate to any other officer any or all of these duties and authority.
- 2. Vice Commodore (Vice President): The Vice Commodore shall be responsible for the BBYRA's Regatta Program and shall assist the Commodore and preside in the absence of the Commodore. The Vice Commodore shall have duties and possess authority as may be delegated to the Vice Commodore by the Commodore.
- 3. Rear Commodore: The Rear Commodore shall be responsible for the equipment of the BBYRA and shall assist the Commodore and Vice Commodore, and preside in the absence of both and have the duties and possess the authority as may be delegated to the Rear Commodore by the Commodore.
- 4. Fleet Captain: The Fleet Captain shall function as an administrative assistant to the Commodore, shall be responsible for the Safety program of the BBYRA and shall cause random safety equipment checks to be made of competitor's yachts during the BBYRA's summer Regatta season, reporting the results thereof to the Chairperson of the Regatta Committee and to the Scorer.
- 5. Secretary: The Secretary shall keep a record of all meetings of the Delegates, the Executive Committee, and the Officers, and shall keep an accurate roll of an Active, Associate, and Individual Members, and of any written proxies of same. The Secretary shall conduct the official correspondence of the BBYRA, send out all notices and perform such other duties as pertain to the position of Secretary. The Secretary shall keep all delivered reports of the Scorer for two (2) years and then turn same over to the Historian. The Secretary shall keep copies of all delivered committee reports and turn same over to the Historian upon relinquishment of office. The Secretary shall have charge of the seal of the BBYRA.
- 6. Treasurer: The Treasurer shall have custody of all the funds and securities of the BBYRA and shall keep or cause to be kept regular books of account for the BBYRA. The Treasurer shall perform other duties and possess other powers that are incident to the office or that shall be assigned by the Commodore.

- 7. Measurer: The Measurer shall receive and keep a record of all yachts as may be required to have measurement certificates by their fleet measurers, and maintain copies of each classes current scantlings as required by such classes association, if any.
- 8. Yacht Racing Association Representative: The Yacht Racing Association Representative of the BBYRA shall represent the BBYRA on USSAILING's "Council of Sailing Associations" (CSA); shall report to the Delegates at the annual meeting; and shall be reimbursed for duties performed as a member of the CSA while representing the BBYRA, and upon the presentation of a voucher to the Treasurer, approved by the Commodore.
- 9. All elected officers shall make or cause to be made, at the annual meeting of the BBYRA, and at such other times as the Delegates may direct, a written report of their activities and the condition of the affairs of the BBYRA with which they are charged, and coordinate the submission of budgets of committees over which they have appointing power, for the following year of the BBYRA.
- The officers of the BBYRA, by virtue of their office shall be members of the Executive Committee.
- 11. No officer or member of the Delegates may receive a salary or compensation from the BBYRA, but nothing contained herein shall be construed to prevent reimbursement for expenses incurred for and on behalf of the BBYRA.

ARTICLE EIGHT - DELEGATES

- 1. The Delegates are the equivalent of the "Board" as defined in NJSA 15A:1-2*, and shall consist of the following: Three (3) delegates (one of whom shall be the Commodore or Vice Commodore) from each Active Member Club, which Club, through those persons shall have one vote. *(See Article Five, 1.)
- 2. The Delegates shall have general control and management of the affairs, funds and property of the BBYRA. As a body, they shall have full power and it shall be their duty to carry out the purposes of the BBYRA according to law and as provided in these By-Laws and the Certificate of Incorporation.
- The Commodore shall preside at all meetings of the Delegates and in the absence of the Commodore, the Vice Commodore shall preside.
- 4. The presence of twelve (12) Delegates, representing at least eight (8) Active Member Clubs shall constitute a quorum and a vote by a majority of those present at any meeting at which a quorum is present shall be necessary for the transaction of its business.
- 5. Without in any way limiting the general powers of the Delegates, they shall, among other things: a) consider and act upon applications for membership in the BBYRA; b) approve dates and formulate arrangements for various championship events, with the advice and consent of the Regatta Committee; c) elect the officers of the BBYRA; and, d) adopt such regulations governing policy, organization, and procedural matters as they deem appropriate.

ARTICLE NINE - DUES

 The Delegates shall fix the dues for each class of membership and direct the Treasurer and/or Chairperson of the Membership Committee to issue receipts and/ or membership cards to those making payment.

- 2. The dues of Active and Associate Member Clubs are due on or before May 1st of each year. Upon any such dues remaining unpaid as of May 31st in any year, written notice thereof shall be sent by the Treasurer. If such dues remain unpaid as of June 30th then said delinquent Club(s) shall stand suspended until restored to membership by the Executive Committee.
- Non-payment of dues by an Individual Member who wishes to be a competitor in any BBYRA championship series shall bar such person from being scored and receiving any award for said series.

ARTICLE TEN - TERMINATION OF MEMBERSHIP

- 1. The Delegates may expel or suspend any member of the BBYRA by a two-thirds vote of the entire Delegates for any violation of the By-Laws or for any conduct which in the opinion of the Delegates is improper and prejudicial to the welfare, reputation or best interests of the BBYRA. No member shall be expelled or suspended without having been given written answer to such charges. A proceeding similar to that contained in Article Fourteen of the By-Laws of USSAILING, shall be followed by the BBYRA in the resolution of grievances.
- 2. Any Club may withdraw from the BBYRA by giving written notice to the Secretary.

ARTICLE ELEVEN - COMMITTEES

- There shall be the following standing committees of the BBYRA: Executive, Nominating, Regatta, Financial, Appeals, Protest, Scoring, Class Liaison, Junior Sailing, Membership, Class Eligibility, Sailing Instructions, General Programs and Services, Safety, Historical, and US Sailing Cup Events.
- All Committees and their chairperson shall be appointed and their duties delineated as herein provided.
- Each committee shall be authorized to prescribe rules and procedures for the direction of the activities assigned to it, including budget preparation.
- All committee chairpersons appointed by the Commodore or Vice Commodore, shall serve for a term of one year.
- 5. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Executive Committee which shall be comprised of the following: The Officers; Past Commodores of the BBYRA; and the incumbent Commodore (or designee of said Commodore) of each Active Member Club. This committee shall have general executive powers of the BBYRA between meetings of the Delegates and shall be responsible for executing the policies set by the Delegates. It shall be presided over by the Commodore, and carry out such other duties as may be specifically set forth in these By-Laws. It may appoint such ad hoc committees (e.g., Finance), as may be necessary in the performance of its duties. It shall normally carry out its duties by telephone, correspondence or meetings as determined by the Commodore. It shall report all of its decisions to the next meeting of the Delegates for their review and ratification.
- 6. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Nominating Committee, appointed by the Commodore at the Spring Meeting of the Delegates, and consisting of the Past Commodores of the BBYRA. It shall be chaired by the most recent available Past Commodore. The committee shall propose a slate of nominees for Officers to the Secretary at least fifteen (15) days before the annual meeting of the BBYRA. Additional nominations may be submitted in writing by Delegates,

- provided the nominees also consent, in writing, to the Secretary at least fifteen (15) days before said annual meeting, and the Secretary shall notify all Delegates of such nomination(s) at least seven (7) days before said annual meeting. No other nominations shall be accepted at the annual meeting except by unanimous consent of those present and entitled to vote at said meeting.
- 7. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Regatta Committee, which shall be appointed by the Commodore within one month after the annual meeting. It shall consist of the Past Commodores of the BBYRA, the Vice Commodore of the BBYRA, who shall act as chairperson, and the Rear Commodore who shall act as vice chairperson, (both of who shall have no vote, unless they are also representing their clubs, or in case of a tie); and one Representative and one Alternate Representative designated by each Active and Associate Member Club. The Regatta Committee shall have entire control of all BBYRA sponsored racing on Barnegat Bay. It shall receive and pass upon requests for allotment of racing dates; sanction races; submit for approval, a schedule of proposed races for the next season at the annual meeting of the Delegates, which schedule shall be finalized no later than March 15 of each year for the ensuing season. It shall decide all questions relating to sailing instructions, courses, charts, signals, marks, measurements and allied subjects. It shall have charge of the actual conduct of the races and the selection of courses and the official scoring. It shall recommend changes in the racing rules governing BBYRA sponsored regattas which shall first be submitted to the Executive Committee for review and approval before submission to the Delegates for final action. BBYRA Regatta Committee membership representing eight (8) Active Member Clubs shall constitute a quorum. The Regatta Committee shall receive reports from the Protest, Scoring, Sailing Instructions, Safety and Class Eligibility Committees and the Vice Commodore will report important matters to the Delegates, without the need for debate and duplication of said committees reports by both the Regatta Committee and the Delegates.
- 8. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Financial Committee, chaired by the Treasurer, which shall include the Commodore, Vice Commodore, Rear Commodore and immediate Past Commodore. This committee shall be responsible for combining all budgets prepared by individual committees into an annual budget for presentation to and approval by the Delegates at the annual meeting. This committee shall monitor the financial condition of the BBYRA throughout the year and review and approve all expenditures within the budget of the BBYRA as approved at the annual meeting. This committee shall also be responsible for seeing that the financial condition of the BBYRA is in conformity with the guidelines of the Section 501 (c) (3) status under the Internal Revenue Code.
- 9. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Appeals Committee, whose members shall be appointed by the Commodore not later than March 1st each year and shall consist of a chairperson and at least four (4) members, all of whom shall be Individual Members in good standing, and preferably shall hold certification as a USSAILING Certified Judge. The committee shall elect, from its membership, a secretary, who shall serve for a term of one (1) year or until a successor is elected. Should the committee adopt any procedural rules which are not proscribed by the Racing Rules approved by USSAILING, said rules shall be published in the BBYRA's Year Book, and/or be posted upon the official bulletin board maintained by the Regatta Committee and displayed at each race day during the BBYRA's series of championship regattas. In addition, the secretary of the committee shall cause to be mailed to each Active and Associate Member Club's Regatta Committee representative, a true copy of any such procedural rules. Said

representative shall be responsible for the appropriate display or distribution of such rules to his/her club.

- 10. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Protest Committee, whose chairperson shall be appointed by the Vice Commodore within one month after the annual meeting of the BBYRA. The chairperson shall form a suitable composition of the committee from amongst the members of the Regatta Committee. Written results of protest hearing shall be delivered to the scorer. The Vice Commodore will be advised of the results of hearings. It shall be the responsibility of skippers or their representatives to be present at said time and place designated for the hearing of a protest. When possible, the chairperson of the Protest Committee hearing panel on a given race day shall cause said hearing(s) to be held on the date of the race out of which a protest arises.
- 11. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Scoring Committee, whose chairperson shall be appointed by the Commodore within one month after the annual meeting, and whose title shall be Scorer. The Commodore may appoint one or more assistant scorers. Both the Scorer and any assistants shall be Individual Members in good standing, and they may be members of other committees. It shall be responsibility of this committee to maintain the BBYRA's computer and related software; to develop a suitable system of records for each of the championship series' regattas; to complete and receive the records of each such regatta and compute the championship score therefrom. The committee shall cause to be printed and distributed to each Active and Associate Member Club, either directly or through said Clubs' Regatta Committee representative or alternate, a copy of the cumulative record of each classes competitors and their current standing in their respective classes championship series. It shall be the responsibility of each Active or Associate Member Club to see to the posting or other suitable distribution of said results so that each competitor is able to learn or his/her current standing in the championship series of his/her class. All issues related to a particular competitor's standing should be directed to the Scorer through the competitor's club representative or alternate representative to the Regatta Committee.
- 12. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Class Liaison Committee, chaired by the Rear Commodore, which shall meet at least once a year with the representatives of each of the classes then being sailed in the championship series. The committee will receive the recommendations of the class representatives and report to the Regatta Committee their suggestions for the improvement of racing on Barnegat Bay, and other matters within the purview of the BBYRA's racing activities. The representatives of the classes may appoint, by majority vote, a person to attend at meeting of the Regatta Committee as an observer.
- 13. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Junior Sailing Committee, whose chairperson shall be appointed by the Commodore within one month of the annual meeting. Said chairperson shall be appointed from a list of persons recommended by the BBYRA's incumbent chairperson of the Junior Sailing Committee, and shall not be an Active or Associate Member Club's junior sailing coordinator for the ensuing sailing year; shall have prior junior sailing administrative experience and be a current Individual Member of the BBYRA. The chairperson may appoint assistants, with the advice and consent of the Commodore, who shall be Individual Members of the BBYRA during their tenure. The chairperson shall: preside at all meetings of the committee; represent the BBYRA at US SAILING Junior activities; coordinate the BBYRA's and Area "C" calendars in cooperation with the BBYRA's chairperson of BBYRA sponsored US SAILING National Cup Events, e.g., O'Day, Sears, Bemis/Smythe, etc; report upon the junior sailing activities of the

BBYRA to the Delegates at their annual and spring meetings; appoint a co-chair for the purpose of recording minutes and assisting the Treasurer in maintaining financial records of the activities of the junior sailing programs; develop programs for fundraising activities by the committee in coordination with the Treasurer of the BBYRA and with the approval of the Executive Committee; and carry out such further activities in furtherance of the purposes of the BBYRA as the Delegates may deem appropriate.

- 14. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA, known as the Membership Committee, whose chairperson shall be appointed by the Commodore within one month of the annual meeting. This committee shall be responsible for promotion of the membership in the BBYRA of the class known as Individual Member.
- 15. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA, known as the Sailing Instructions Committee, charged with the responsibility to annually update, as required, the published sailing instructions, and charts, to be proposed to the Regatta Committee, and published in the BBYRA's year Book. The chairperson shall be appointed by the Commodore within one month of the annual meeting, and he/she shall work in cooperation with the Class Liaison Committee and the Vice Commodore, in their race management functions.
- 16. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Class Eligibility Committee, whose chairperson shall be appointed by the Vice Commodore within one month of the annual meeting. The committee shall recommend and maintain guidelines for series eligibility, review the annual performance of each class and investigate the credentials of applicant classes. It shall make recommendations concerning old and new class eligibility to the Regatta Committee.
- 17. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the General Programs and Services Committee, consisting of at least three Individual Members, one of whom shall be a Past Commodore, all of whom, including a chairperson, shall be appointed by the Commodore within one month of the annual meeting. It shall be the responsibility of the committee to develop insurance programs for the BBYRA and its members, including coordination of the BBYRA's insurance programs and that of its Member Clubs, Delegates and Committees, with those services provided by USSAILING, and other organizations; to develop programs for the solicitation of funds for effecting the purposes of the BBYRA as spelled out in its BY-Laws, Constitution, and Exemption Letter dated February 28, 1992 from the Internal Revenue Service of the United States Department of the Treasury, determining the BBYRA's exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) and 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code: to solicit invitations from the various Active Member Clubs to host the annual fund raising Commodores' Ball, and to schedule the dates for future conduct of same; to develop a schedule of advertising fees for space in the BBYRA's Year Book, and to coordinate efforts with the Regatta Committee, Sailing Instructions Committee and Executive Committee for the publication of said Year Book; and to be responsible for the public relations of the BBYRA.
- 18. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Safety Committee, chaired by the Fleet Captain. It shall be the function of the Safety Committee to implement an on-water and off-water safety program for regatta competitors and personnel. The Safety Committee shall be responsible for obtaining appropriate annual "Permit for Marine Event" from the Coast Guard and any permits required by the State of New Jersey.
- 19. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the US SAILING National Cup Events Committee, charged with the coordination of the BBYRA's

elimination series for the US SAILING National Cup Events. The chairperson shall be appointed by the Commodore within one month of the annual meeting, and shall report to the Vice Commodore of the BBYRA on the progress of the US SAILING events BBYRA eliminations, and make recommendations for the improvement thereof.

20. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Historical Committee, charged with the preservation of the records and memorabilia of the Association and its members. It's chairperson, appointed by the Commodore within one month of the annual meeting, shall be known as the BBYRA Historian. The Historian shall submit a written report of the committee activities to date in the current calendar year.

ARTICLE TWELVE - PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

The rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order shall govern the BBYRA in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these By-Laws and any special rules of order the BBYRA may adopt.


ARTICLE THIRTEEN - INDEMNIFICATION


- 1. The BBYRA shall indemnify all corporate agents against all expenses and liabilities in connection with any proceeding involving the corporate agent by reason of his or her having been such a corporate agent other than a proceeding by or in the right of the BBYRA if: a) such corporate agent acted in good faith in a manner he or she reasonably believed to be not opposed to the best interests of the BBYRA; and b) with respect to any criminal proceeding, such corporate agent had no reasonable cause to believe his or her conduct was unlawful.
- 2. All terms used herein shall have the meanings attributed to such terms as set forth in NJSA 15A:3-4(a).
- 3. It is intended that the rights of indemnification provided hereunder shall be as broad as permitted under the laws of the State of New Jersey. Without limiting the foregoing, the BBYRA herewith adopts the provision of NJSA 15A:3-4 as though fully herein set forth; whenever said statute permits the Association to provide indemnification this By-Law shall be deemed to require such indemnification to be provided by the BBYRA.

ARTICLE FOURTEEN - AMENDMENTS


Any amendment in the Bylaws may be initiated by any Individual Member, circulated to the members of the Executive Committee.
