October 7, 2000

MINUTES

Phyllis Anne Newbert from The Heart Saver Institute discussed the effectiveness of a defibrillator and demonstrated its usage.

P/C Roger Brown presented a defibrillator to Commodore Harry Foote for the BBYRA from the International Order of Blue Gavel.

Roger explained that IOBG has made "safety on the bay" its project. In addition to the BBYRA's defibrillator which will be aboard the committee boat, 200 whistles are now required safety equipment and 10 large first aid kits are carried aboard patrol boats. All have been donated.

The Delegates Meeting was called to order at 1400 by Commodore Harry Foote.

Roll call was taken by Secretary Betty Jane France. All thirteen clubs were represented.

A motion was made, seconded, and passed to accept the minutes as written and mailed.

Letters were received from The United States Coast Guard, Frank Parisi, Britton Tullo, Marlene and Thomas Healey, Reed Johnson, Clay Johnson, Evelyn Seymour on behalf of Junior Sailing Coordinators, and Zoe V. A. Wells and Charles M. Barclay representing Bay Head Yacht Club.

OFFICER REPORTS:

Commodore

Commodore Harry Foote thanked everyone for supporting the BBYRA. The efforts of many are much appreciated.

Vice Commodore

Vice Commodore Patricia Applegate thanked all for support given her. She recognized the Regatta Committee, Art Shearer who is moving from the area for his six years of service, and the host clubs for site, space, patrol boats competently manned, lunch committees, and registration people (especially Fran Lynn and Sharon Bradley from MCYC who handled season registrations the first week). She thanked Peter Chance for rewriting our scoring program, Dave Loughran for distributing the score sheets, and score checkers Dave, Harold Lewry and Jim Carson.

Some changes were made in 2000 -

The Flying Scots and Sanderlings had two double race days and two weeks off; additional warning signals caused problems.

Scoring changes were made; three races could be cut or dropped.

Thirty more boats qualified.

The schedule for next season was distributed.

A letter has been mailed to fleet representatives regarding a Liaison Meeting which will be held on November 11, 2000 at 1000 at MRYC.

Notices of the Regatta Meeting, November 11, 2000 at 1330 at MRYC are being distributed.

Rear Commodore

Rear Commodore Richard Sayers reported that Job Gash has all equipment safely stowed for the winter. The radios, flags, and bags have been winterized and are ready for next season thanks to Bill and Johanna Studdiford.

Fleet Captain

Fleet Captain John Heacock reported that there were no safety problems this summer. He thanked Charles Logan for handling the inspections. Every fleet was inspected at least once. Whistles, which are newly included safety equipment, had to be blown.

Measurer

Measurer James Carson was not present; two reports were distributed and a third read by the Secretary. No measurement problems were brought to his attention. He will request updates of class scantlings and rules in the spring.

Treasurer

Treasurer Anne Attridge presented a Balance Sheet as of September 30, 2000 and a Statement of Activities for the same period. Marlene and Thomas Healey were awarded \$810 from the Feirer Fund.

Commodore Foote commented that Anne has done a wonderful job of being cost conscious and has built up a reserve. He resisted raising racing fees. Through some economy measures, \$3,337 less was spent than budgeted for. A motion was made, seconded, and passed to allocate 50% of this amount to the member clubs. The treasurer requested explicit instructions relative to distribution of this. The checks will go out as soon as practical.

A motion was made, seconded, and passed to accept her report for file.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

BBYRA Representative to US Sailing

BBYRA Representative to US Sailing, P/C Roger Brown commented that the Olympics must have been well attended by those running US Sailing. Minutes and correspondence have not been received.

The US Coast Guard and NJ State Police will be cooperating with each other regarding racing permits. Those requiring permits must apply 45 days prior to event.

Junior Sailing

Chairwoman Evelyn Seymour reported a successful summer with 850 kids instructed in BBYRA member clubs' junior sailing programs; 500 participated in Interclub Regattas.

The retention rate and new prospects look good for next season.

There were no protest problems; there was no word about observers.

There were a few problems which were weather related.

No BBYRA Laser Radial awards were made at SPYC due to a redress request/appeal pending.

The Optimist Pram class experienced painter snapping problems where kids were injured.

Dev Colie has designed a solution which he is offering free of charge to Opti owners.

BYC's Leukemia Regatta raised \$17,000 with 127 participants.

Ten clubs participated in the Island Beach State Park fun day.

Vanguard/Colie Sails ran a very successful instructors clinic which may be expanded next year to include club officials so that they may better understand junior sailing.

Match racing and team racing competition may be expanded.

Membership

Membership Chairman Mike Corbett was not present. He sent word that membership numbers are up slightly; he is happy with the present system.

General Programs and Services

General Programs and Services Chairman, P/C Don McNeil had no report.

Historical

Historical Chairman Donald Bottomley was not present. Call Donald if you desire information regarding past records.

Scorer

Scorer Harold Lewry reported that all scores are final and that the number of boats and registrations has once again dropped.

177 boats registered of which 120 were seasonal registrants.

134 qualified of which 120 were seasonally registered.

A total of 980 boats were scored.

Those present were urged to see that the member club information sheets are returned to Secretary France as soon as possible.

Junior Sailing

Discussion took place concerning fewer juniors sailing Saturdays on BBYRA.

Prior attempts to encourage junior participation include the following:

- 420s and Laser Radials had two years of five two race days.
 - Sunfish and Optimist Prams had two guest days two years ago.
- Neither of these proved successful.

Many feel the following is evident:

Junior coordinators, kids, parents, etc. are not enthusiastic about kids racing BBYRA on Saturdays.

An extra ten week series during the summer cannot fit into the junior schedule.

Interclubs are very successful and are the BBYRA.

Juniors are racing many days a summer in quality races, mostly during the week.

Many are spending more time at regattas than in their club junior program.

During a 40 day summer, many kids spend 22 to 27 days at regattas and 13 to 18 days receiving instruction.

Top kids are sailing locally, nationwide, and worldwide in regattas.

The following was suggested to be explored:

What can we do as an organization to involve juniors?

Many options other than a ten week series need to be explored; it's not all or nothing.

The 18 to 22 year old group is missing.

Wayne Bush is promoting Sunfish petitioning the BBYRA for inclusion in its 2001 schedule.

We need to look over and evaluate all fleets.


BBYRA Yearbook

Vice Commodore Applegate announced that the yearbook chairperson position is open.

Discrepancies in the 2000 book have been noted.

The meeting was adjourned at 1545.

REPORT of the Scorer for the 2000 REGATTA SEASON

THE 2000 BBYRA REGATTA Season has been completed .

All scores posted September 02, 2000 with the exception of the Radial Open and Junior classes are final.


The number of boats, and registrations has once again dropped off. For the 2000 season there was a total of 177 boats registered of which 120 were seasonal registrants. There were 134 qualifiers of which 120 were seasonally registered. For the 10 regatta series we scored a total of 980 boats. A new category has been added, "Total Entrants". This is the combined total of seasonal and daily registrants scored for each of the regattas. A summary of the 2000 Regatta Season is appended to this report.

All protests and requests for redress with the exception of one involving the Radial Fleet were successfully concluded. The results of the decisions are reflected in the final scores. There were 7 disqualifications.

Most of the differences between the scoring program and the announced scoring system have been addressed and corrected. A memo stating the remaining problems needing to be corrected is attached.

I would like to thank all of the members of the Regatta committee for their assistance in recording finishes, accounting for boats in the starting area and for contacting your skippers when needed. In addition I would like to thank Dave Loughran, as well as the Commodore, Vice Commodore, Rear Commodore, and assistant scorers for their help and support during the season.

Suggested Items to Be Investigated

Changes to the Computer Program of the Barneget Bay Yacht Racing Association should be investigated as follows: -

1:- Establish another category in the heading, labeled "Registered Starters". The competing boats including DNS & DNF should be calculated against this number, as stated in the "Racing Rules" of the BBYRA in section E "SCORING", subsection "RACE SCORES", paragraphs 6 a & 6b.

2:- It is suggested that the possibility of changing the program so that for 10 races the worst 3 are dropped, for 8 races the 2 worst are dropped and for 6 races only 1 race be dropped.

It is suggested that in the Sailing Instructions section 12 "TIME LIMIT", a statement be added to the effect, that if the race is abandoned because no boat has finished or will be able to finish within the time limit, that all boats of that class that started the race should be scored DNF", Did not Finish".

In the BBYRA booklet, the information on page 12, paragraphs 2 and 3 under the title "PRIZES" should read the same as paragraphs 15 and 16 on page 17 under "ADMINISTRATIVE RULES". in the Racing Rules.

A statement should be added to the sailing instructions under "SCORING" that in order to qualify a boat must start or compete in 50% of the races scheduled for its class.
