MINUTES

The Delegates Meeting was called to order at 1330 by Commodore Harry Foote. Roll call was taken by Secretary Betty Jane France. All thirteen clubs were represented. A motion was made, seconded, and passed to accept the 4/28/01 minutes as written and mailed. Letters were received from Winslow Miller, Commodore of MRYC and P/C Job Gash.

OFFICER REPORTS:

Commodore

Commodore Harry Foote thanked the members of Normandy Beach Yacht Club for their Commodores Ball donation of \$1,200 to the BBYRA.

He thanked Metedeconk River and Toms River Yacht Clubs for supplying club boats many Saturdays. Harry also thanked the officers and committee chairs for their support and for jobs well done.

Vice Commodore

Vice Commodore Patricia Applegate thanked the Regatta Committee for rising to the challenge and doing what had to be done this past summer.

New in 2002 -

Season registration was required for championship scoring with only two complaining.

St. Pete low point scoring system was used successfully. The program, however, did not handle abandoned or canceled races and qualifiers had to be done by hand.

Double races were held with rave reports. It is anticipated that there will be more requests for double days next year with two race committee boats in the 30 foot range required.

A make-up race was scheduled, instituted by the fleet, with the unanimous consent of the fleet.

Rear Commodore

Rear Commodore Richard Sayers reported that Bill and Johanna Studdiford will again handle the radios and bags over the winter.

The trailer is in good shape at Job Gash's.

Fleet Captain

Fleet Captain John Heacock reported that inspections, this past summer, were successful.

The defibrillator was on board the committee boat each Saturday. Six Regatta Committee members took the required training.

Webmaster

Webmaster Jack Heacock reported that the webpage has been a tremendous hit!

Scores were posted by Saturday evening the last half of the summer.

The only problem existed when information was not supplied.

A new format was circulated, for comment, with a frame around information.

Measurer

Measurer James Carson reported that he received up-dated information from the E-Sloop, Laser, Lightning, and Sunfish Classes.

The A-Cat Class is currently working on up-dated plans and specifications.

He is aware of sail measurement by the Sanderling Class and boat weighing by the Lightning Class. No measurement problems have been referred to Jim.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

BBYRA Representative to US Sailing

BBYRA Representative to US Sailing, P/C Roger Brown was not present.

Junior Sailing

Chairwoman Evelyn Seymour reported a successful summer with 850 kids instructed in BBYRA member clubs' junior sailing programs. Approximately 500 were 1/2 day and 300 were whole day. Unfortunately, the quality of instructors is declining.

Vanguard ran a fabulous clinic at Mantoloking Yacht Club for instructors; they also spoke to coordinators. A one day seminar will be held next spring.

70 clubs received junior packets which contained information including regatta registrations. Interclubs, under auspices of BBYRA, were successful with down-bay awarding decals to qualifiers. Many clubs were represented in the Duck Boat Worlds and received money for their programs.

The Byte and 420 Classes are growing.

Junior interest in BBYRA sailing is limited because kids sail so much during the week. Since the new starting system is being used more, Evelyn will buy 2 sets of flags which will be passed around.

Membership

Membership Chairman Mike Corbett was not present. He sent word that BBYRA has 1800 members plus BHYC members. It was speculated that if all member clubs had entire membership join BBYRA, as many do, perhaps the \$200 club dues could be dropped.

General Programs and Services

General Programs and Services Chairman, P/C Don McNeil was not present.

Historical

Historical Chairman Donald Bottomley was not present.

Scorer

Scorer Harold Lewry reported that all scores are final and that the number of boats and registrations has increased; 219 boats registered of which 170 were seasonal registrants.

There were 116 qualifiers.

A total of 1003 boats were scored.

The new scoring program worked well, making scoring easier and faster.

Utilization of a laptop on board the Committee Boat was a success.

The Provisional Sunfish Class was successful with 8 qualifiers.

The Laser Class had the fewest qualifiers with 4; some juniors will be encouraged to move from Radials to full rigged next season.

No fleet is in danger of not sailing in 2002.

REPORT of the Scorer for the 2001 REGATTA SEASON

THE 2001 BBYRA REGATTA Season has been completed.

All scores posted September 10,2001 are final.

The number of boats, and registrations has increased. For the 2001 season there was a total of 219 boats registered of which 170 were seasonal registrants. There were 116 qualifiers. For the 10 regatta series we scored a total of 1003 boats. A summary of the 2001Regatta Season is appended to this report.

All protests and requests for redress have been successfully concluded. The results of the decisions are reflected in the final scores. There were 0 disqualifications.

The change in the scoring program has made the actual scoring much easier and faster. The utilization of a laptop computer on board the Committee Boat was a success, including the calculation of the series results at Seaside Park however some of the other information required for the end of season qualifier presentations has become more time consuming. I will attempt to address these problems during the coming winter months.

I would like to thank all of the members of the Regatta committee for their assistance in recording finishes, accounting for boats in the starting area and for contacting your skippers when needed. In addition I would like to thank Jack Heacock & Betty Jane France, as well as the Commodore, Vice Commodore, Rear Commodore, for their help and support during the season, especially during the period that I could not be at the Regattas.

Suggested Items to Be Investigated 2001

- 1: It is suggested that in the in the BBYRA booklet, that the Sailing Instructions, and sailing rules be checked and that they be edited so that these areas read the same and agree wit the information published on the web sight.
- 2. It is suggested that for races abandoned after the start of the race for any reason, over time limit or weather conditions, etc., that all boats on the course be scored DNF (Did not finish).
- 3. Changing the wording of paragraph 4 in the Administrative Rules section in the Racing Rules to read "All scores should be considered final eight days after they are posted on the official BBYRA web site."
