

Horrocks, Magno, Lookup earn trophies

Kept from victory in the rough waters of last week's season-opening Mantoloking Yacht Club races, Carl Horrocks of the Lavallette Yacht Club began Week 2 of the Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association season in fine form.

Horrocks captured the Wana-maker Trophy in Saturday's first E Scow race by navigating the course of the same name in the season's first down bay races, hosted by the Island Beach Yacht Club.

Small Trophy last week, Lavallette Yacht Club's Dave Magno won the afternoon session's first E Scow race on Saturday to claim the Atkinson Trophy.

While conditions were satisfactory throughout most of the day, the second Ensign class race was abandoned due to a light wind.

For the second straight week, Andy Lookup, representing the Pine Beach Yacht Club, dominated the Sunfish races, coming out on top in three of the four competitions.

Other trophies awarded were the J. Willard Morgan Cup (A Cat class) to Austin Fragomen; the Charles Franksen Trophy (Ensign class, first race) to Thomas Healey of Island

Heights Yacht Club, and the Ernest D. Hangarter Trophy (Laser Radial Junior) to Pine Beach Yacht Club's A.J. Roselli III.

The Slack Bowl went un-awarded with the cancellation of the second Ensign class race.

The BBYRA season continues July 9 when Mantoloking and Manasquan River yacht clubs co-host Week 3 action on the Green Island Course.

The Lightning class makes its BBYRA debut with a pair of afternoon races. The Sandpipers are scheduled to race twice in the morning; both the A Cats and Sanderlings have two afternoon races scheduled, and the E Scow fleet goes off four times — twice in the morning and the

afternoon.

The Laser full-rigs, Sunfish and Ensign classes are not scheduled.

There are seven trophy races: Mantoloking Yacht Club will award the Louise Edgar Colie Trophy to the winner of the second A Cat race; O'Malley trophies to the winners of the first morning E Scow race and the M Scow race; the Bilgeboard Trophy to the winner of the first afternoon E Scow race; the William O. Price Trophy to the winner of the first afternoon Sanderling race, and the David Beaton Trophy will be awarded to the Sneakbox class winner.

The Sneakbox winner also earns Manasquan River Yacht Club's Challenge Cup.
