BBYRA Junior Sailing Committee Report April 10, 2009

As Chair of the Junior Sailing Committee, I repot to the Officers and Delegates' the following:

1. The Junior Sailing Coordinators from each of the 14 BBYRA clubs met collectively in September, November, 2009 and February 2010. Thank you to Lavallette, Ocean Gate and Tom River for extending your hospitality to the coordinators Our next scheduled meeting is the annual June "packet" meeting will be June 14, at Mantoloking followed by CPR recertification for instructors.

2. US Sailing Level 1 Instructor Training is scheduled to be held once again over Memorial Day weekend at Ocean Gate Yacht Club. After many hours on the phone, pleading with Instructor Trainers in Houston, and help from Harry Foote US Sailing has agreed to host a double session, up to 24 participants. Both sessions will be held at Ocean Gate and our two instructors, Steve Gay and Ed Owen, will be housed in style at PC Foote's home.

3. Permits for all junior sailing have been submitted to the Coast Guard. The Coast Guard permitted me to submit only three permits for all 13 clubs' sailing lessons. The Jr. Sailing Coordinators were all notified, at the February meeting that they would have to submit permits to the State Marine Police, for lessons, interclubs and regattas, and the Coast Guard for regattas and interclubs only. Copies of all forms were electronically mailed and hard copies were distributed at the February meeting.

4. In December the Jr. Sailing Coordinators implemented the new Green Fleet Guidelines for Optimist Class. Our intent is to encourage novice sailors and discourage sailors from staying in the green fleet, in order to win races and receive awards. This policy is posted on the BBYRA website and all coordinators were supplied with an electronic copy, 12/10/09 and a hard copy on 2/19/10.

5. We will continue the practice of using the BBYRA website for posting/distribution of Notices of Regatta. NORs are due to the BBYRA webmaster by June 1, 2010. Postcards will also be mailed out in early June 2010 to the 60+ addresses of sailing organizations throughout New Jersey directing them to the BBYRA website for open junior sailing events throughout the BBYRA clubs.

6. Jr. Sailing programs begin on 6/23 for MCYC and on 6/28 for all other clubs ending August 20. The snowy season increased the school calendar for many districts so most programs are beginning a week later than they normally have in prior years

7. Junior Sailing Calendar has been updated and is posted on the website. BBYRA Midget eliminations will be hosted by OCC at IHYC on 7/13/10. Thank you OCC, IHYC and Jim Walsh for hosting and running these eliminations.

8. Downbay Interclub will once again run as a series. All coordinators agreed that using this format was the best for all involved. Each week winners will be awarded a small award, each qualifier, see SIs posted on website, will receive an end of series award and the winners of the overall series will be awarded the perpetual trophies. A special thanks to Peter Sayia for writing the SIs and George Demand who does all the weekly scoring!

9. NJYRA along with the BBYRA will host a seminar on running a good program with featured speaker Kim Hapgood from Sail Newport. This will take place 4/17 at Monmouth Boat Club, see attached flyer.

10. A special thank you to Jack Heacock, without Jack I wouldn't know what was going on when and where.

11. I was fortunate enough to attend the National Sailing Program Symposium in Houston, TX this past February. It was a wonderful experience and I connected with a great number of people from across the country. My report on the symposium is attached. All pertinent information and materials were distributed to the Jr. Coordinators at the February meeting. Thank you for the opportunity to represent the BBYRA and get out of a snow storm!



From Garden State Parkway North: Take Exit 109. After clearing the toll booth make a left onto Monmouth County Route 520 (Newman Springs Road) and follow common directions below.

From Garden State Parkway South: Take Exit 109 and keep right on off ramp to merge onto Monmouth County Route 520 (Newman Springs Road) and follow common directions below.

Common Directions: Follow Monmouth County Route 520 (Newman Springs Road) east till it dead ends. There will be a Dunkin' Doghuts on your right and a set of railroad tracks on your left. Make the left at the light, cross the tracks and go straight onto Broad Street (**DO NOT THE LEFT AFTER CORSSING THE TRACKS!**) Follow Broad Street till the end. Make a right onto Front Street and then make an immediate left onto Wharf Street. Then make the first left onto Union Street and the club is at the base of the hill on your right. Parking meters are not enforced on Saturdays (despite signs). If there is no parking on Union Street go back to the intersection of Union and Wharf Streets and make the left to go down the hill on Wharf and there is additional parking along Wharf and at Marine Park at the base of the hill.

Coming from NJ Route 35 South: Take Route 35 south over the bridge from Middletown into Red Bank. At the light on the Red Bank side proceed straight onto Bridge Street (do not make either the left or the right at the light). Follow Bridge Street to the first light and make a left onto Front Street. Follow Front Street past the traffic light at the intersection with Broad Street, make the left onto Wharf Street and follow directions from Wharf Street as above.

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GREEN FLEET GUIDELINES FOR OPTIMIST CLASS

1. BACKGROUND

The United States Optimist Dinghy Association (USODA) is the national class organization for Optimist sailing in the United States. The USODA defines Green Fleet as a special fleet for beginners. Green fleeters can be any age up to 15. A green fleet might have skippers who are as young as 6 and as old as 15, but sooner or later they'll move into their age-appropriate fleet. A ten year old green fleeter would move into white fleet, a thirteen year old green fleeter would move into red fleet, etc.

The purpose of the green fleet is to encourage novice sailors. To discourage sailors from staying in green fleet, in order to win races and receive awards, USODA's policy is to present "Participation Awards" to all skippers sailing in the green fleet. By not crowning a champion, sailors and their parents, are encouraged to move to the appropriate age fleet as they become more confident of their abilities.

2. THE BBYRA

Consistent with the USODA, the Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association (BBYRA) wants to encourage novice sailors to attend and participate in regattas. We look to avoid "trophy hunting" by experienced Optimist sailors who continue to compete in Green Fleet after having demonstrated they have mastered the skills for higher-level sailing.

3. CONDITONS FOR GREEN FLEET

The Junior Sailing Committee has adopted the following conditions for Green Fleet effective December 15, 2009.

3.1 The top three (3) Green Fleet finishers will be posted and tracked by the Junior Sailing Committee. A sailor who finishes in the top three (3) in any three (3) regattas or interclubs during any two consecutive calendar year period shall move up to their next respective fleet (White, Red, Blue).

3.2 <u>Rookie Regatta at Manasquan River Yacht Club (MRYC)</u> - The Rookie Regatta at MRYC is designed for *First Year Sailors* only. Any child who competed in the prior calendar year shall not be eligible to compete in the Rookie Regatta.

3.3 <u>No Tears Regatta at Toms River Yacht Club (TRYC)</u> - The Beginner (Green) Fleet in the No Tears Regatta at TRYC is designed for <u>*First Year Sailors*</u> only. Any child who competed in the prior calendar year shall not be eligible to compete in the Beginner (Green) Fleet at the No Tears Regatta.

4. PRIZES

The BBYRA encourages Regatta Organizers to:

- a) Post only the race scores of the top three (3) Green Fleet finishers
- b) Present "Participation Awards" to all skippers sailing in the Green Fleet
- c) Awards should be given to Green Fleet sailors in a manner that does not disclose the order of finish (ex. by sail number or name) except for the top three (3) finishers
