Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association Liaison I Committee Meeting Minutes November 21, 2009 Metedeconk River Yacht Club

<u>Call to Order</u> – Commodore Rich Proko called the Liaison I Committee meeting to order at 10:05 a.m. He thanked MRYC for hosting today's meeting.

<u>Roll Call</u> — All classes were present except Laser & 420 (absent). Also present: BBYRA flag officers (Treasurer Jim Maida & Rear Commodore Bob King came at 11:22), Measurer and Secretary as well as Class Eligibility Chair, and Sailing Instructions Committee Chair and members of various committees.

Commodore Proko discussed that the Delegate Meeting was scheduled for Saturday, April 3, 2010, which is Holy Saturday, the day before Easter. It was decided that the delegate meeting would be held on Saturday, April 10, 2010. The Secretary will send a letter to BHYC requesting to hold the meeting there.

Fleet Reports

A-Cat – Roy Wilkens (for Jim Kellogg) had the following report:

- > Fleet would like to continue the 2nd racing circle at Seaside.
- > Fleet would like to race one weekend up bay with second circle on the Green Island course. Their choice would be LYC.
- > Fleet would like the wind speed to be changes to sustained 20 mph no race begins and races shortened at 22 mph
- > Fleet would like to have two throw outs for the season, no matter how many races are sailed
- > Fleet would like to continue with the anchor start
- > Fleet would supply patrol and support (to move equipment) boats for the second racing circles at Seaside and Green Island
- > There will up one up bay and one down bay Junior day, which will not be part of the race schedule
- > Fleet would like the race schedule to be the same as last year

<u>Ensign</u>—Thom Healy had the following report:

- Fleet asks that their request for only one race on an up bay day be considered. This would be a rule change which would need to be reviewed by the Sailing Instructions and then a recommendation made to the Delegates. Some resistance will be made to this request.
- > See attached schedule request

<u>E-Sloop</u> – Dave Magno had the following report:

> Fleet would like the second race circle on the Seaside course to be permanent

- > Fleet would like a second circle on the Green Island course at LYC to be provisional
- > Fleet reports that there are three new boats
- > They have no wind changes
- > There might be measurement changes to the sails, windows in the A sail
- > See attached schedule request

Measurer – Jim Carson reported that all classes have websites except A-Cat. Roy Wilkens said that he would forward the new A-Cat website to Jim. Hard copies for the following classes are in the file: A-Cat (2007), Ensign (2009), Sanderling (2007) and Sneakbox (2002). Hard copies for Inactive Classes are also on file for the following: Blue Jay, Hobie 18', Laser II, Penguin and Prindle 18'. Jim needs to know if the website is current. When NOR goes out, classes need to let us know if website is current.

Flying Scot – Rich Kerdock had the following report:

The fleet would like two races every weekend with one bye week. Will look at the national calendar and let us know which week they would like the bye week to be

Laser - Absent but Glen Dickson sent the following report in:

- > Thank the committee for a great summer of racing
- > Participation was slightly down form 2008
- ➤ Last year there were two bye weekends to accommodate Laser Nationals and Masters' Worlds, which were sailed on the East Coast. There are no major national Laser regatta nearby this summer, so two races for the first nine weeks and the one race at Seaside.
- > If a bye weekend is needed, a down bay weekend would be the preferred bye week
- ➤ Windward-leewards on the portable courses are preferred. Olympic courses with reaches are fun when the breeze is over 12 knots. If patrol boats are scarce, triangles are the safest option for the big breeze (20+ knots)
- > A new representative for the laser fleet needs to be found

<u>Laser Radial</u> – Nick Rinaldi had the following report:

- > Would like the fleet to continue even though there were no qualifiers last year. The two laser fleets start together but are scored separately.
- > New participants are being sought (at the end of the meeting two names were given to Nick)
- > Two races every weekend with one race at Seaside

<u>Lightning</u> – Jim Carson had the following report:

- > Fleet was happy with the RC administration and excellent sailing
- > Lowest number of qualifiers due to major regattas taking place
- ➤ 2010 should see an improvement with the North American regatta at TRYC and the North American Juniors, Women and Masters regatta at MCYC
- > Continue with the six day double race format
- > See attached schedule request

M-Sloop - Jim Applegate (for Susan Kerr) had the following report:

- Rescind Sailing Instructions 8.5 (recalled fleet will move to the end of the starting order). There were several near-misses between E- and M- scows, especially on leeward mark rounding. Keeping the E-scows at the beginning of the rolling sequence should help alleviate this problem. A lively discussion followed. Morning fleets preferred E-scows to start first so they are not sailing thru the sunfish and 420 fleets. Afternoon fleets preferred them to move to the end of the sequence. A concern with afternoon fleets was having time for their two races if there was light air. Maybe a decision should be made on the race course based on time, wind and how far the fleet traveled.
- ➤ A "Z" flag (used on the Seaside course) or a Black flag should be used. The "Q" flag is not needed. Should flags be used for the starting sequence?
- > Short leeward mark
- Portable marks
- > Rebuilding boats, bringing boats in from the Midwest
- > No change in wind conditions
- A "Z" flag (used on the Seaside course) or a Black flag should be used. The "Q" flag is not needed. Should flags be used for the starting sequence?
- > See attached schedule request

Discussion on Start

- Signal course by flag only and not the "big box"
- ➤ Hold white board for number of rounding ex: 1, 2 or 3 (in rain numbers might wash away)
- Use "G" for gate course and "S" for short leeward mark
- Have gates as long leeward marks
- Use digital box (LYC)
- Use combination of radios (small boats do not carry radios), flags and place cards/whiteboard
- ➤ Initial mark too close to the windward mark. Get rid of it, it does not provide enough separation

Sanderling – Mark Schleckser had the following report:

- ➤ Thank you to the Race Committee
- > No changes for next year
- > See attached schedule request

Sandpiper – Mimi Dimon had the following report:

- > Thank the BBYRA for their efforts this season and wish them good luck in 2010
- ➤ Continue with double races for a total of 15 races, see attached schedule request

- > Fleet is asking for a variety of courses (especially in the second race), not just windward/leeward
- > No change to the maximum wind limits
- > Announce via VHF the finish time of the first boat
- > Fleet wants to compete as a fleet. They would like to wait till all boats finish before starting the second race
- > Fleet requests that the fleet be exempt from wearing life jackets when single-handed. This is a safety issue, so then they requested that the rule be enforce. If single-handed in the Sandpiper you must wear a life jacket.
- ➤ Fleet asked that a Masters Division be added. The age requirement would be 62 years. This information would be on the registration form. This would be in the first race of the day. This would be a division within the class for scoring. Fleet would ask some sailors who qualify as a Master not to participate this year to encourage others to race. Still working on details. Finish flags would be awarded to both fleets each week and an overall Championship trophy for each fleet also. The Sandpiper fleet would be willing to provide overall trophies, if the BBYRA is unable to.
- Also to encourage participation, the fleet voted to have an Upper Bay and Lower Bay Overall Trophy which will exclude BBYRA winners. The fleet will handle the scoring and trophies.
- > The fleet would like to present at the annual awards the BBYRA Sandpiper Championship Trophy. This trophy will list all the BBYRA Champions since the fleet began racing in the BBYRA. The Fleet must write a "deed of gift".
- > The BBYRA Sandpiper Fleet Class Rules have been amended and will be sent to the BBYRA

Sneakbox – Russ Lines had the following report:

- Fleet would like to express the sincere appreciation to the BBYRA and especially the volunteers that cover the S course for their tireless work and dedication to the BBYRA. Schedule will be looked at to make sure there are enough boats on the S course to cover the additional manpower needed.
- > Fleet would like to sail on eight weekend, see attached schedule request
- > If there was no trophy being given out, no one sailed. A request was made to go back to your club and trophies that are not being given out can be rededicated.
- > Fleet prefers to sail the Lavallette course as opposed to the "river" course
- > Scoring system was good

<u>Sunfish</u> – Wayne Bush had the following report:

- > Thanked the bay for having the juniors and seniors separate
- > Seniors like to mix the courses up with triangles and windward/leeward
- > Juniors like triangle courses
- > Juniors and Seniors would like a normal first race
- > Seniors would like the second race to be a barrel race
- > Juniors would like the course shortened on a light air day
- > Since there are smaller fleets, a shorter line

- > To encourage up bay sailing, consider using a trailer or towing. Maybe boats can be brought the day before
- ➤ No wind changes

420 - Roy Wilkens (for Donnie Burke) had the following report:

- > Fleet happy sailing in the river
- ➤ Move the course closer to OGYC and IHYC
- > Number of qualifiers down
- > Remind yacht clubs of the OCC lease program

Commodore's Announcements:

- > Committee will be formed for the 100th Anniversary in 2011
- > Get requests into Sailing Instruction Committee prior to their December meeting

New Business:

- > Register BBYRA logo
- > Form committee to sell articles of clothing


2010 Liaison Committee Schedule Reguest Chart for 2010 BBYRA Championship Dates Per the November 21, 2009 Liaison Committee Meeting

Dear BBYRA Committee,

As the liason for the Laser class, I would like to thank the committee for conducting another summer of great racing, though I only made a few weekends myself.

Participation: Participation was slightly down from 2008, with five qualifiers compared to 8. However, this number was consistent with 2006 and 2007, and we did have some new faces on the race course this year who will hopefully become full-time Laser racers on the Bay.

Schedule: While last year we had two off weekends to accommodate Laser Nationals and Masters' Worlds, which were both being held on the East Coast, there are no major national Laser regattas nearby this summer. I would suggest racing two races for the first nine weeks, with the traditional single race at Seaside. I have tried to build off weekends into the schedule to accommodate sailors making the effort to attend major events, but few BBYRA sailors actually do and I think encouraging local participation should be the priority in 2010. If the Bay does need Lasers to take an off weekend due to RC considerations, I would recommend it being a Downbay weekend, as the majority of today's fleet sails out of Lavallette.

Courses: Windward-leewards on the portable courses are still preferred. Olympic courses with reaches are fun when the breeze is over 12 knots. If patrol boars are scarce, triangles are the safest option for big breeze (20-plus knots) conditions, as they avoid the windward capsizes prevalent in heavy air running.

Representation: I have been seeking a replacement for my duties for several months as I did not qualify in Lasers last summer and do not plan to do so in 2010, as I have been focusing on the Flying Scot. I have asked the members of the fleet to step up and take over, but have gotten no response. I hope to have a new full-time liason in place by the next meeting in February.

Big-Picture Thought: I know the BBYRA has been seeking a representative for the Laser Radial class for several years, to no avail. Last year no one qualified in Radials, though one sailor did compete occasionally. As I suggested last year regarding the Sunfish class, I think the way to drive participation is to have all age classes compete together, and then award a separate junior prize if applicable.

In the Laser, this could be done by having everyone sail Standard rigs, particularly since most Saturday mornings feature relatively light air. Another possibility is to let sailors of any age freely alternate between Standard and Radial rigs from race to race, depending on the breeze conditions, as long as they maintain the same sail number. This is standard practice in Masters (35-years plus) Laser sailing, and allows lighter or older Master sailors to enjoy the control of a Radial in big-breeze conditions that they would otherwise be hesitant to race in. There is no competent Standard rig sailor who feels disadvantaged by this practice, though I can tell you that some savvy and physically fit older Laser sailors manage to do very well in Radials in big breeze against heavier, younger Standard

Rig competitors (For example, 72 year old Peter Seidenberg placed fifth in a 21-boat regatta in Rhode Island this fall, sailing a Radial against a host of much younger Standard rig sailors). Also, Radial Rigs are the only option for 65-year—plus sailors on the World level, and giving our local sailors the Radial option would only be fair and could only help participation.

Thanks again for running such great racing, and for hearing out my suggestions.

- 1) Please rescind Sailing Instructions 8.5 (recalled fleet will move to the end of the starting order). There were several near-misses between E- and M-scows, especially on leeward mark roundings. Keeping the E-scows at the beginning of the rolling start sequence should help alleviate this problem (or move them to another racing area?).
- 2) Please schedule 2 races for Beachwood race day. Therefore, M's would only like to have off Normandy Beach (same day as LEHYC's Down Bay Invitational).
- 3) We would also prefer more use of short leeward mark whenever possible. This also will help alleviate above-mentioned problem with rounding the leeward mark with E-scows and should help separate the fleets.
- 4) Last year's morning races were long and rarely over before 12:30. People scheduled to sail in the afternoon had trouble getting back to the launch club to get their boat out of the water and get back to the race course for the afternoon starts.
 - 5) As always, windward/leeward courses using the portable marks are preferred.
