### HISTORY

For many years prior to the inception of the Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association, yacht racing was the popular sport on the Bay. Commodore Herman Muller of the Seaside Park Yacht Club invited members of local yacht clubs to meet with him on February 11, 1914 to discuss the advisability of forming an association to foster and unify yacht racing on Barnegat Bay. Four clubs were represented at this meeting, Bay Head, Island Heights, Ocean Gate and Seaside Park.

After agreement as to the name and purpose of the Association, Commodore J.V.A. Cattus of the Bay Head Yacht Club was unanimously elected Chairman and to serve with him, Commodore E. A. Lloyd, Jr., as Vice Chairman, Commodore Herman Muller, Secretary and Mr. M.R.H. Crowell, Treasurer. The first regular meeting was held March 11, 1914 at the Bellevue-Stratford Hotel, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, at which time the original Bylaws were adopted and a racing schedule formulated, the first race being held at the Seaside Park Yacht Club on July 4 of that year. At this first meeting, the Association was enlarged by the election of the Mantoloking Yacht Club into its membership.

The first season's championships awarded by this new organization was in 1914. The first annual meeting was held on October 21 of that year and by this time, membership had grown to six Clubs by the addition of the Lavallette Yacht Club and an official Regatta Committee was appointed then known as "The Racing Commission." In 1922, the Toms River Yacht Club was elected to membership. The following Clubs were subsequently elected to Membership: Shore Acres Yacht Club (1941), Beachwood Yacht Club (1946), Metedeconk River Yacht Club (1946), Normandy Beach Yacht Club (1947), Manasquan River Yacht Club (1962), Pine Beach Yacht Club (1979), and Ocean County College Sailing Club (2005).

The BBYRA Delegates approved an extensive revision of the Bylaws in 1994. The organization applied for, and received, Federal and State status as a tax-exempt corporation 501 (c)(3) enabling contributions to the BBYRA to be tax-deductible based on individual limits. The impetus for change during the '90's did not stop at the Bylaws.

Significant changes have been made to the Racing Rules, Sailing Instructions, Course Configuration, scoring and methods of registration. An active web-site was introduced in 2000 which has provided timely communications between the Yacht Racing Association and the Clubs and Sailors.

The BBYRA horizons continue to expand beyond the Saturday Championship series. We currently serve as the umbrella organization uniting Junior Sailing Programs and YRA – sponsored instructional clinics and coordinated events. Our seminars providing Race Management and Judges training reinforce our commitment to provide the best venue possible for our sailing members.

The development of the Association has been gradual but sound. Each group of officers contributes their time, energy, and effort to continue the commitment to sailing and racing on Barnegat Bay.





### Edward W. Feirer Memorial Fund

The Lidward W Linime Memorial Fund (Feirer Fund) was created by the family of Ed Feirer. Mr. Feirer was an avid satilar, active in the BBYRA for many years, and a long time member of Beachwood Yacht Club (BYC). The purpose of the Feirer Fund is to enable skippers 'to pursue further competition beyond the BBYRA level' In UN Seiling National Cup Events and/or US Ofympic Qualification Events. As per the Deed of Gift, the Feirer Lund is to be placed in a separate interest bearing account of the BBYRA and maintained by the HIYNA. The interest of this separate account are the funds to be disbursed annually to qualified skippers. Any junction of the available funds is to be at the sole discretion of a committee consisting of a representative member of BYC, BBYRA Commodore and BBYRA Chairperson of US Sailing National Cup Events.

### **Disbursement of Funds**

- 1 All aligible registration forms submitted to the BBYRA Chairperson of US Sailing National Cup Events and approved by the Chairperson shall be considered an application to the Feirer Fund. The BBYRA Chairperson shall notify and forward a copy of each accepted application to the BBYRA Commodore and BYC Commodore simultaneously.
- BBYRA what pay the registration fee(s) for approved application(s) for those competitors who qualify for the finale of the National Cup Events and/or US Olympic Qualification Events from the BBYRA operating fund in consultation with the BBYRA Commodore and BYC Commodore (or their designees). Disbursement is limited to posted registration fee.
- 3. The BBYRA Commodore, BYC Commodore and BBYRA Chairperson of US Sailing National Cup Events shall meet in September of each year to review the disbursements for the Feirer Fund and the performance of the Feirer Fund. BBYRA is to be reimbursed for disbursement(s) made for posted registration fee(s) for National Cup Events and/or US Olympic Qualification Events up to the maximum interest earned. In the event BBYRA disbursements exceed the annual interest of the Feirer Fund for posted registration fee(s) for National Cup Events and/or US Olympic Qualification Events, BBYRA will be reimbursed from the Feirer Fund as future funds become available.
- 4. Any funds that are not disbursed shall revert to the Feirer Fund principal.

### BARNEGAT BAY YACHT RACING ASSOCIATION CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES 2010 NOTICE OF RACE

Organizing Authority: Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association (BBYRA)

#### 1. Rules

- 1.1 All races will be governed by the Rules as defined in the current Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2 The Regulations of the Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association Championship Series (BBYRA Regulations) will apply.
- 1.3 The Registration Instructions provided to potential contestants will apply.
- 1.4 Class Rules, except as altered by the Sailing Instructions, will apply.
- 1.5 The following modifications to the Racing Rules will apply to this Championship Series.
  - 1.5.1 All Club 420, Junior Sunfish and single handed competitors shall wear personal buoyancy at all times while afloat. This changes RRS 40 and the Part 4 preamble.
  - 1.5.2 The course to be sailed will be displayed by its Preparatory Signal. This modifies RRS 27.1.
  - 1.5.3 A boat starting later than four minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start. This changes RRS A4 and A5.
  - 1.5.4 Boats still racing (and that do not subsequently retire, get disqualified, or get redress) 20 minutes after the first boat sails the course and finishes, will be scored TLE.
  - 1.5.5 The time for the conclusion of morning races is 1230. Boats still racing after 1230 (and that do not subsequently retire, get disqualified, or get redress) will be scored TLE.
  - 1.5.6 A boat is required to inform the race committee finish boat immediately after finishing of its intention to protest another boat, and provide the sail number of the protested boat. This changes RRS 61.
  - 1.5.7 Progressive exclusion of a boat's worst scores as outlined in 8.1 & 8.2 below.
  - 1.5.8 The changes will appear in full in the sailing instructions. The sailing instructions may also change other rules.
- 1.6 The Organizing Authority reserves the right to change this NOR and the Registration Instructions by amendment posted on the BBYRA Official Notice Board. In the event of a conflict between the NOR, BBYRA Regulations and the Sailing Instructions, the Sailing Instructions posted on the Official Notice Board will prevail.

#### 2. Fleets and Eligibility

- A Cat, E Sloop (AM and PM), Ensign, Flying Scot, M Sloop, Full Rig Laser, Laser Radial Junior, Lightning, Sandpiper, Marshall Sanderling 18 ft. (B Cat), Sneakbox, Sunfish, Junior Sunfish, Club 420.
- 2.2 All skippers must comply with Section B (Eligibility) of the BBYRA Regulations.
- 2.3 Laser Radial Junior: Entrants are eligible if their 19th birthday will not have been reached by the last day of the calendar year 2010.
- 2.4 Club 420: The Club 420 will be sailed in collegiate mode, i.e., spinnaker and trapeze may not be used. There are no age restrictions on skipper or crew.
- 2.5 Junior Sunfish: Entrants are eligible if their 18th birthday will not have been reached by the last day of the calendar year 2010.
- 3. Registration
- 3.1 Boats may register for the season and optional lunches by mail before June 11, 2010 upon payment of the applicable pre-season registration fee. Season Registration Forms and Registration Instructions will be available no later than May 15, 2010 at the website (www.bbyra.org).
- 3.2 After June 11, 2010, boats may register for the season in person each race day at the Regatta Headquarters. Boats sailing the "Appendix S Course" may also register in person and pay applicable fees at either the weekly Regatta Headquarters, or prior to 0830 hours at: LYC on Upper Bay race days and TRYC on Lower Bay race days on its scheduled race day. Registration will be on forms available at the weekly Regatta Headquarters, and must be submitted with payment of the applicable season registration fees.

3.3 After June 11, 2010, arrangements for lunches must be made directly with the host club(s).
3.4 Daily race registration may be made on forms available each race day at the weekly

Regatta Headquarters, or on the water at a "Late Entry" boat. Daily race registration for boats sailing the Appendix S Course will also be available until 0830 hours at LYC on Upper Bay race days and TRYC on Lower Bay race days, or at the Start Boat. A-Cats and E Sloops sailing the Second Race Circle may register at the weekly regatta headquarters or on the water at the committee boat designated for that purpose.

4. Sailing Instructions: Sailing Instructions will be available no later than May 15, 2010 on the website, and each race day at the Regatta Headquarters and LYC or TRYC (as scheduled) and on the water at a "Late Entry" boat on the Primary Course or the Start Boat on the Appendix S Course or at the committee boat designated for that purpose for A-Cats and E Sloops sailing the Second Race Circle.

#### 5. Venue

- 5.1 "Primary Course" racing area: (1) Upper Bay will be north of the Mathis Bridge in the vicinity of Hankins Island and Green Island area; (2) Lower Bay will be south of the Mathis Bridge in the vicinity of the Wanamaker and Seaside Park area. Separate Course Charts will be provided for Upper Bay, Lower Bay and Seaside Park Yacht Club race days.
- 5.2 "Appendix S Course" racing area: (1) Upper Bay will be in the vicinity of the Lavallette Yacht Club;(2) Lower Bay will be in the vicinity of Toms River Yacht Club; (3) Seaside Park Yacht Club race day will be in the Seaside Park area on the Primary Course.
- 5.3 "Second Racing Circle" racing area: on Island Heights, Toms River and Beachwood race days will be in the vicinity of Seaside Park Yacht Club. On Lavallette race day the racing area will be on the Lower Green Island course.

#### 6. Schedule

6.1 The first warning signal in the morning is at 9:20AM. The first warning signal in the afternoon is at 1:30PM. See the attached schedule for each fleet's sailing dates.

7. Safety: All boats must carry equipment as specified by their class rules, the U.S.C.G and such additional equipment as is specified in the BBYRA Regulations Appendix 1.

#### 8. Qualification and Scoring

- 8.1 For boats not sailing the "Appendix S Course" the Low Point Scoring System of RRS Appendix A will apply with progressive exclusion of a boat's worst scores as fully outlined in the sailing instructions. RRS A9 Race Scores in a Series Longer than a Regatta replaces RRS A4.
- 8.2 Boats sailing the "Appendix S Course" will sail multiple races (maximum 5) on scheduled Upper Bay and Lower Bay race days. On each scheduled Upper Bay and Lower Bay race day, multiple races will be scored as a short series using the Low Point Scoring System of RRS Appendix A. No scores in the short series will be excluded. On each scheduled race day a boat's placement in the short series will be used for daily flag and trophy awards. For the Championship Series Scoring, the Low Point Scoring System of RRS Appendix A will apply with progressive exclusion of a boat's worst scores as fully outlined in the sailing instructions. RRS A9 Race Scores in a Series Longer than a Regatta replaces RRS A4.

8.3 Boats scored TLE will be scored points equal to the number of boats finishing within the time limit plus two points by the race committee without a hearing. This changes RRS A5, A9 and A11.

8.4 Qualification and scoring will be in accordance with the BBYRA Regulations Section E.

#### 9. Radio Communications

- 9.1 A boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications, not available to all competitors. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.
- 9.2 The Race Committee will monitor VHF Channel 68 and use this channel to communicate to the competitors.
- 9.3 Competitors may use Channel 68 to communicate (a) emergencies, or (b) their intent to withdraw from a race.

10. Prizes: Daily and season championship awards will be presented according to the BBYRA Regulations Section F (Administrative Rules). The host clubs provide additional trophies as listed in the Club Trophies List.







### REGULATIONS OF THE BARNEGAT BAY YACHT RACING ASSOCIATION CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES

### A. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. All races held under the jurisdiction of the Association shall be sailed under The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), the prescriptions of US SAILING, the Sailing Instructions and these Regulations. Inasmuch as no document can be devised to cover every situation, it shall be the duty of the Regatta Committee to decide all questions that may arise. In deciding such questions the Regatta Committee shall not act before satisfying itself that its action is as equitable as possible to all boats concerned.
- The Championship Series, held under the jurisdiction of the Association shall be conducted by a Race Committee appointed by the Regatta Committee of the Association and chaired by the Vice Commodore.
- 3. Each year the Regatta Committee shall adopt Sailing Instructions (SIs) that shall be provided to all entrants. The Regatta Committee shall also cause appropriate race information not contained in the SIs or these Regulations and required by RRS J1, "Notice of Race Contents", to be published on the BBYRA website prior to May 15th.

### B. ELIGIBILITY

- A boat entered for a race must be the bona fide property of a recognized yacht club or of the person in whose name she is entered, who must be a member of a yacht club of the Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association except as provided in paragraph B.5. A person chartering a boat shall be deemed the owner provided said boat has been chartered in good faith for a period of not less than thirty days.
- 2. Any class qualifying three or more boats in the previous year's Championship series will be eligible for competition. Each class shall be scheduled to compete at least two days in each BBYRA race venue (Upper and Lower Bay). Additional classes may be considered upon written petition to the Regatta Committee by at least six skippers representing a minimum of three member clubs. Such petition shall be submitted no later than November 15th of the prior year for which eligibility is being requested and shall include (as a minimum) the following information for consideration:

a) A commitment from each skipper stating his/her intention to qualify for the championship.

b) Identification of Class Liaison Representative (including pertinent contact information).

c) Listing of any and all racing preferences (i.e. morning or afternoon, bye weeks, preferred courses, etc.).

d) Proposed age limit or gender restriction (if applicable).

Any new class accepted shall be considered "provisional" for a period of at least one year with provisional status to be reviewed annually by the Class Eligibility Committee. Provisional classes are not eligible for championship awards. Those classes eligible for competition each year shall be designated by the Regatta Committee and published on the BBYRA website prior to April 15th.

- In junior classes with an age limit, a contestant will be considered eligible when his age limit birthday will not have been reached on the last day of the calendar year.
- 4. Except as provided in Paragraph B.5, skippers/helmsmen are required to be members of the BBYRA, a member Club of said Association, and their respective class organizations. Member Clubs are expected to furnish the Regatta Committee with a membership list and a list of BBYRA contributing members prior to June 15th of each year. Crews are exempt from this requirement.
- 5. A sailing instructor actively employed by a BBYRA member club may be permitted to enter and/or skipper a boat which is the bona fide property of a recognized yacht club or of the person in whose name she is entered provided he/she is a member of US Sailing and his/her respective class organization, pays a guest entry fee and the usual entry fees for the class in which he/ she is entered. Entry will be at the discretion of the Regatta Committee and shall be denied if not in the best interest of the Association.

### C. ENTRIES

- A member of the Regatta Committee shall supervise the receipt of entries and fees in all classes.
- 2. Entries shall be made as required by the Regatta Committee.
- An entry fee will be charged for the season or for each race of the championship series for all classes at rates established by the BBYRA. Entry fees are nonrefundable.

### D. RACING TRIM

- 1. All one-design and restricted classes must file with the Association Measurer a copy of their class rules and regulations which shall include restrictions, measurements and designations pertaining to the hull, mast, rigging, sails, and crew limitations as to weight and number, not later than two weeks prior to the date of the first championship regatta. These will remain frozen through the entire Championship series. No boat will be entitled to start in any race unless the boat meets the above mentioned requirements and conforms to these Regulations.
- A record of class restrictions and designations including sails, crew limitations, equipment, etc. will be maintained by the Association Measurer.
- 3. All boats must carry safety equipment as specified by their class, as may be required by the USCG and as set forth in Appendix 1. Deviations for any class may be granted by the Regatta Committee. The Penalty for violating this rule shall be DSQ, DNE, or DGM.

### E. QUALIFICATION and SCORING

- Each season the Association will award the championship to the boat in each class making the best score as prescribed in the sailing instructions.
- Only those races designated for points in the championship series will be considered in computing the record of each boat.
- In order to qualify for the Championship a boat must come to the starting area in at least 50% of race days scheduled for her class.

- Points shall be awarded to a boat and may not be transferred except by specific written permission of the Regatta Committee.
- No race shall be declared official unless two or more entrants come to the starting line.
- 6. Races abandoned will not be scored.

### F. ADMINISTRATIVE RULES

- The BBYRA may act to suspend the awards of a class's season championship series if the final outcome of its series is dependent on the outcome of an appeal.
- No new class shall be added to the race program for championship purposes after the schedule is posted on the official BBYRA website.
- A report of each championship race giving the identification of all boats registered therein and their order of finish shall be filed with the Scorer of the Regatta Committee and kept for two years.
- 4. A suitable Point Accumulation Sheet will be maintained by the Scorer showing in detail the record of each boat's activity for the current Championship Series. All scores shall be considered final eight days after they are posted on the official BBYRA website except that they shall be considered final at 0830 on the day of the final regatta and unless a decision on a valid protest or appeal is pending.
- 5. First place individual regatta pennants will be awarded for each race. Second place pennants will be awarded when there are at least four registered boats and third place when there are at least seven registered boats.
- 6. Season championship flags and trophies will be awarded to the winning boat in each class. Second place trophies will be awarded when there are at least four qualifiers, third place when there are at least seven qualifiers, fourth place when there are at least eleven qualifiers and fifth place when there are at least fifteen qualifiers.

### G. PROTESTS, REQUESTS FOR REDRESS, APPEALS AND HEARINGS

- Appeals, Requests for Redress, Protests and Hearings shall be in accordance with The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- The BBYRA Website and the appropriately designated pages shall serve as the official Notice Board of the Protest Committee.
- 3. All decisions of the Protest Committee shall be submitted in writing to the Scorer along with the original protest papers. The applicable Scorer, after noting any adjustments to the scores of the boat(s) involved, shall forward the original protest, the protest committee's decision, and all pertinent papers to the Secretary of the BBYRA who shall keep them on file for a period of two years.
- 4. Appeals shall comply with US Sailing Prescription Appendix F and be mailed to: RACE ADMINISTRATION DIRECTOR, US SAILING, PO BOX 1260, PORTSMOUTH, RHODE ISLAND, 02871. Additionally a complete copy of the appeal shall also be simultaneously forwarded to: BBYRA APPEALS COMMITTEE, P.O. Box 4237, BRICK, NJ 08723.
- The BBYRA Appeals Committee prescribes that the following fees be included with the initial filing of an appeal: BBYRA members \$25.00, non-BBYRA members \$50.00.

### BBYRA CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES 2010 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

### 1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) and the Regulations of the BBYRA Championship Series.
- 1.2 ADDENDUM S will apply to Club 420, Sneakbox and Junior Sunfish.
- Lower Bay & Lavallette ADDENDUM will apply to PM E-Sloop and A-Cat on 7/3, 7/17, 8/21 and 8/28.

### 2. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located in the vicinity of the registration desk at the regatta headquarters.

### 3. CHANGES IN SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted at least two hours prior to the scheduled AM or PM First Warning Signal.

### 4. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed at the regatta headquarters.

4.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 30 minutes' in the race signal AP.

### 5. SCHEDULE OF RACES

5.1 See CLASS SIGNALS AND STARTING TIMES. (see page 43)

5.2 When back-to-back races are scheduled for a class, the warning signal for the second race will be made as soon as practicable.

### 6. THE COURSES

- 6.1 The course chart shows the approximate location of marks, the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.
- 6.2 The Class placard and number of course to be sailed will be displayed by its Preparatory Signal. This modifies RRS 27.1
- 6.3 When courses 0 through 8 are signalled, the PORTABLE MARK COURSE

### ADDENDUM will apply.

6.4 No later than the warning signal, the race committee signal boat may display the approximate compass bearing of the first leg.

6.5 Any special course will be posted on the official notice board.

### 7. MARKS

- 7.1 Permanent marks will be drums painted orange and white with identifying letters in black.
- 7.2 Temporary marks will be as noted in paragraphs 7.3, 8.1, 9.2, 20, 22, AA on the Course Chart, ADDENDUM S, and LOWER BAY & LAVALLETTE ADDENDUM.
- 7.3 A missing mark will be replaced either by a black and yellow buoy or a buoy or boat displaying Flag M. Sound signals while displaying Flag M may be omitted. This modifies RRS 34(b) and RRS Race Signals.

### 8. THE START

- 8.1 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on a Signal Boat at the starboard end and a large orange cone at the port end.
- 8.2 Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area. After starting and before finishing, a boat may not cross the start line.
- 8.3 A boat starting later than four minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start. This changes RRS A4 and A5.
- 8.4 The race committee will attempt to hail and broadcast sail numbers of boats that are OCS on VHF Channel 68. Failure of the race committee to hail or broadcast any sail numbers; failure of a boat to receive the recall hail or broadcast; a boat's position in the sequence of hail or broadcast numbers; promptness of the hail or broadcast shall not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).

### 9. THE FINISH

- 9.1 For fixed mark courses the Race Committee will attempt to establish a windward finish and a patrol boat at the last turning mark may display a placard indicating the approximate bearing to the finish. Failure to do so shall not be grounds for redress.
- 9.2 The finishing line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on a Finish Boat and a large orange cone except as indicated in the PORTABLE MARK COURSE, S, and LOWER BAY & LAVALLETTE ADDENDUMS. This instruction does not apply when RRS 32.2 does.

### 10. PENALTY SYSTEM

Aboat that may have broken a rule of Part 2 may either take a penalty as prescribed in RRS 44.1 or a Scoring Penalty as prescribed in RRS 44.3.

### 11. TIME LIMITS

- 11.1 The time limit will be two hours.
- 11.2 Boats still racing (and that do not subsequently retire, get disqualified, or get redress) 20 minutes after the first boat sails the course and finishes, will be scored TLE (Time Limit Expired, see SI 13.4).
- 11.3 For morning races, no Warning Signal will be made after 1130.
- 11.4 The time for the conclusion of morning races is 1230. Boats still racing after 1230 (and that do not subsequently retire, get disqualified, or get redress) will be scored TLE (Time Limit Expired, see SI 13.4). This changes Instruction 11.1 & 11.2.
- 11.5 For afternoon races, no Warning Signal will be made after 1530.
- 11.6 Postponement signalled before 1200 does not apply to afternoon races. This changes RRS Race Signals.
- 11.7 Flag N over A means, "All races including those not started are abandoned

and will not be sailed." This signal made before 1240 does not apply to afternoon races. This modifies RRS Race Signals.

### 12. PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 12.1 A boat is required to inform the race committee finish boat immediately after finishing of its intention to protest another boat, and provide the sail number of the protested boat. This changes RRS 61.
- 12.2 Protest forms are available at the regatta headquarters, line, finish, and signal boats or online at www.bbyra.org. Protests and requests for redress or reopening shall be delivered within the appropriate time limit:
  - a) In person to the Protest Committee Chairman or Secretary, or a BBYRA Flag Officer, or
  - b) Electronically at www.bbyra.org
- 12.3 The protest time limit is 2000 on the day of the race in question, except on the last scheduled racing day when the protest time is 1 hour from the time the Signal Boat docks. This modifies RRS 62.2.
- 12.4 Notices will be posted as soon as possible after the protest time limit on the official Protest Committee notice board at www.bbyra.org. Hearings will be held at Regatta Headquarters commencing at 0700 on the next scheduled race day or at a location and time agreed upon by the protest committee and interested parties, except on the last race day when hearings will be held immediately following the races.
- 12.5 Breaches of Instructions 8.3, 14.1, 14.2, 14.3, 14.4, 15, 16, & 17 shall not be grounds for protest by a boat. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

### 13. SCORING

- 13.1 Qualification is described in the REGULATIONS OF THE BBYRA. The number of scheduled races is shown on the Class Schedule.
- 13.2. RRS A4.2 is replaced with RRS A.9, Race Scores in a Series Longer than a Regatta.
- 13.3 RRS A2 is changed so that:
  - (a) When fewer than 4 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
  - (b) When from 4 to 6 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
  - (c) When from 7 to 8 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.
  - (d) When from 9 to 12 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her three worst scores.
  - (e) When from 13 to 15 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her four worst scores.
  - (f) When more than 15 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her five worst scores.
- 13.4 Boats scored TLE will be scored points equal to the number of boats finishing within the time limit plus two points by the race committee without a hearing. This changes RRS A5, A9 and A11.

### 14. SAFETY REGULATIONS

- 14.1 Changes in registered skipper (person in charge) or sail number must be submitted in writing at the registration desk or a late entry boat prior to the boat's warning signal. The skipper need not be the helmsman but must be on board while racing.
- 14.2 Any registered boat sailing in the starting area between her warning and starting signals will be considered a contestant for the purpose of determining Championship Series qualification.

- 14.3 If a boat does not start or fails to finish, the skipper shall report personally or by radio directly to the Regatta Committee or a Patrol Boat flying a patrol flag before leaving the race course. VHF Channel 68 may be used by competitors to report withdrawal from a race.
- 14.4 All Club 420, Junior Sunfish and single handed competitors shall wear personal buoyancy at all times while afloat. This changes RRS 40 and the Part 4 preamble.
- 14.5 E Sloops shall deploy mainsail floatation at all times while racing. This modifies E Sloop Class Rules.

### 15. EQUIPMENT AND MEASUREMENT CHECKS

A boat or equipment may be inspected by the race committee at any time for compliance with the rules and the sailing instructions. On the water, a boat can be instructed by the race committee to proceed immediately to a designated area for inspection. When Flag L and a class signal are displayed at the finish line boats shall proceed immediately to a patrol boat flying the same signal in the vicinity of the finish line for a mandatory safety inspection. Boats must remain in the area until dismissed by the inspection team. While awaiting inspection, contact with other boats is prohibited. A boat that fails to comply with the rules or this instruction will be protested.

### 16. TRASH DISPOSAL

Boats shall not put trash in the water. Trash may be placed aboard support and race committee boats.

### 17. RADIO COMMUNICATION

A boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to cell phones, pagers, radios, etc. Transmission from these devices is only allowed for emergencies. The Race Committee will monitor Channel 68 for emergency transmissions.

### 18. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

### PORTABLE MARK COURSE ADDENDUM

The following instructions are applicable ONLY to courses 0-8:

### 19. THE COURSE

- 19.1 The diagrams show the courses, the approximate angles between legs, the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which the marks are to be left.
- 19.2 A gate may be employed on any windward-leeward course. When there is a gate boats shall sail between the gate marks from the direction of the previous mark and round either gate mark. Use of a gate will be signaled by display of placard "G" following the course number.
- 19.3 A short leeward mark may be used and will be signaled by placard "S" following the course number.

### 20. MARKS


Marks will be yellow tetrahedrons. New marks, as provided in instruction 21, CHANGING THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE, will be orange tetrahedrons. The Initial Mark (IM) will be a large yellow cone. The short leeward mark will be a yellow tetrahedron with a black band.

#### 21. CHANGING THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

A change of course after the start will be in accordance with RRS 33. When in a subsequent change of course a new mark is replaced, it will be replaced with an original mark. During the race, gate marks may be repositioned without signal for minor changes in the course. This changes RRS 33.

### 22. THE FINISH

The finishing line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on a Finish Boat and an orange ball to weather of the windward mark except Courses 7 and 8 that will finish between a Finish Boat and an orange ball in the vicinity of the leeward mark.

### LOWER BAY AND LAVALLETTE ADDENDUM TO THE BBYRA 2010 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS FOR E SLOOP AND A CAT

#### 1. RULES

The BBYRA Championship Series 2010 Sailing Instructions apply except as modified herein.

### 2. THE COURSES

- The sailing area will be in the vicinity of the Seaside Park YC or Lower Green Island Course.
- 2.2 Starting at 1300 hours and continuing through to 1320 hours, the Signal Boat will periodically announce on VHF Channel 71 the vicinity of the starting location.
- 2.3 The course(s) will be windward/leeward with the number of legs indicated.
- a.) Gate marks will be used in place of a leeward mark. Boats shall pass between the marks of the gate from the direction of the previous mark, prior to proceeding on the upwind leg of the course.
- b.) An offset mark will be employed at the weather mark. Boats shall round the offset mark to port after rounding the weather mark, prior to proceeding on the downwind leg of the course.
- c.) On July 17, 2010 the finish of the A Cat race will be in front of TRYC.
- 2.4 Class and the number of legs for the course will be displayed by flag signal and/or a placard.

### 3. MARKS

3.1 The turning marks of the course will be yellow balls.3.2 The offset mark will be an orange ball.

#### 4. THE FINISH

4.1 The finish line for downwind finishes will be the Start line.

- 4.2 The finish line for upwind finishes will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on a Finish Boat at the starboard end and a Large Orange Cone at the port end to weather of the windward mark.
- 4.3 The finish line for the A Cat race on July 17, 2010 will be between a large YELLOW cone and a staff displaying an orange flag on the TRYC club dock.

### 5. RADIO COMMUNICATION

With respect to SI's 8.5, 14.3, and 17, the channel used will be VHF71.

### ADDENDUM "S" TO THE BBYRA 2010 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS FOR CLUB 420, JUNIOR SUNFISH, and SNEAKBOX FLEETS

#### 1. RULES

1.1 The BBYRA Sailing Instructions will apply except as modified herein.

- 1.2 RRS Appendix S, Sound Signal Starting System will apply.
- 1.3 The Club 420 will be sailed in Collegiate Style (no spinnaker and no trapeze).

#### 2. SCHEDULE

- 2.1 On scheduled race days the first warning signal will be at 9:20. Subsequent races will be started as soon as possible after the end of the previous race.
- 2.2 A maximum of five (5) races per day will be scheduled for each fleet. No Warning Signal will be made after 11:30.
- 2.3 The starting order will be 420, Junior Sunfish, Sneakbox or as indicated by the race committee.

#### 3. THE COURSE

- 3.1 The Upper Bay sailing area will be in the vicinity of the Lavallette YC and the Lower Bay sailing area will be in the vicinity of the Toms River YC. The SPYC race will be held on the Main course.
- 3.2 The course(s) will be Triangle, Olympic, Windward-Leeward, the "N" course (see diagram) or some combination of same.
- 3.3 Courses may be described orally, by placard or by chalkboard.

#### 4. MARKS

The turning marks of the course will be yellow balls. The short leeward mark will be a yellow tetrahedron with a black band. The start and finish marks will be orange balls.

#### 5. THE START

The start line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on a Signal Boat at the starboard end and an orange ball at the port end.

#### 6. THE FINISH

The finish line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on a Finish Boat and an orange ball.

#### 7. CHANGING THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE


When there is a course change, marks may be relocated rather than replaced prior to the first boat rounding the preceding mark.

#### 8. SCORING FOR DAILY FLAGS AND TROPHIES


8.1 On each scheduled race day, multiple races will be scored as a short series using the low point scoring system of RRS Appendix A. No scores will be excluded. This modifies RRS A2.
8.2 On each scheduled race day a boat's placement in the short series will be used for daily awards.

### 9. CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES SCORING

RRS A2 is modified so that 70% of races completed are scored.



















### **BBYRA BY-LAWS**

### Adopted October 1, 1994 Last Revised April 5, 2008

#### **ARTICLE ONE - NAME**

The name of this Corporation is the Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association. (Hereinafter BBYRA)

### **ARTICLE TWO - PURPOSE**

The BBYRAis organized exclusively to foster amateur sailboat racing competition in yachts on Barnegat Bay and on a national and international level and to support and develop amateur athletes for the sport of sailboat racing, including for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations under Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (or corresponding section of any future tax code). It may provide training for candidates and their crews by organizing and/or holding competitive events and holding of meetings In the nature of seminars. The prescriptions of the United States Sailing Association, Inc., (hereinafter USSAILING) with respect to matters of race, color, religion, age, sex or national origin shall apply to the BBYRA.

#### **ARTICLE THREE - MEMBERSHIP**

 Membership in the BBYRA shall consist of three classes: Active, Associate and Individual.

a) The Active Membership class consists of Yacht Clubs, represented by delegates hereinafter described, and presently consists of: Bay Head Yacht Club; Beachwood Yacht Club; Island Heights Yacht Club; Lavallette Yacht Club; Manasquan River Yacht Club; Mantoloking Yacht Club; Metedeconk River Yacht Club; Normandy Beach Yacht Club; Ocean Gate Yacht Club; Pine Beach Yacht Club; Seaside Park Yacht Club; Shore Acres Yacht Club; and Toms River Yacht Club; and such additional yacht clubs located between Manasquan Inlet and Little Egg Harbor Inlet or waters tributary thereto as may be hereafter elected to membership as an Active member. No club shall be elected to Active Membership unless it has been an Associate Member for at least two years immediately preceding its application.

b) The Associate Membership class shall consist of Yacht Clubs which have been elected by three-fourths vote of the Executive Committee of the BBYRA, after submittal of a written application signed by an elected officer of the Club and by an elected officer of an Active club, which certifies the applicant has at least five yachts of a class or classes presently scheduled in the BBYRA Regattas. Yachts of Associate Member Clubs shall enjoy rights and privileges of yachts of Active Member Clubs, including representation on the Regatta Committee of the BBYRA. Associate Member Clubs will not be required to sponsor a Regatta. An Associate Member Club may apply for Active membership after two consecutive years of Associate Membership immediately prior to its application for Active membership. Associate Member Clubs shall not have voting rights. The Associate Membership class presently consists of the Ocean County College Sailing Club

c) The Individual Membership class consists of persons who belong to Active or Associate member Clubs of the BBYRA, and desire to assist in supporting the objects and purposes of the BBYRA by payment of the annual dues.

All members shall have the privilege of attending or being represented at all annual and special meetings of the BBYRA. All members shall receive such BBYRA publications as the Delegates shall from time to time prescribe.

3. Individual Members shall be eligible to hold office and serve on committees.

 The Delegates shall establish a schedule of annual dues to be paid by each class of membership.

The membership of any member may be declared forfeit by the Delegates for nonpayment of dues.

#### **ARTICLE FOUR - MEETINGS**

1. The annual meetings of the BBYRA shall be held on the first Saturday in October and notice shall be sent to each Active and Associate Member Club at least 30 days prior to such date. When practicable, the time and place of all routinely scheduled meetings will be published in the BBYRA's Year Book and on BBYRA's website.

 A quorum shall consist of twelve (12) delegates, provided they shall represent eight (8) Active Member Clubs.

3. At least (15) days notice of all meetings of the BBYRA shall be given, in writing, to each delegate and all others whose attendance is required.

4. Special meetings of the BBYRA or its Executive Committee may be held at the call of the Commodore, or upon request of the delegates of two (2) Active Member Clubs.

5. The delegates or any committee of the BBYRA may act without a meeting if, before or after the action, each delegate or committee member shall consent, in writing, to the action. The written consents shall be filed with the minutes of the meeting.

6. The death, resignation or removal of an officer shall be cause for an emergency meeting of the executive committee, as soon as the committee may deem it appropriate, for the sole purpose of filling the vacancy caused by such an event.

#### **ARTICLE FIVE - VOTE**

1. Active Member Clubs shall be represented at meetings by Delegates, who shall be Individual Members, and may be three (3) in number, one of whom shall be the Active Member Club's Commodore or Vice Commodore. The names and addresses of those delegates who shall represent the Club must be sent to the Secretary of the BBYRA not later than January 1 of each year. Delegates shall be equivalent to "Board" as defined in New Jersey Statutes Annotated (N.J.S.A.) 15A: 1-2b.\*

\* "Board means the board of trustees or the group of persons vested with management of the business and affairs of the corporation irrespective of the name by which the group is designated; "entire board" means all the trustees then in office. "L. 1983, c. 127, Section 15A: 1-2b, eff. Oct. 1, 1983.

Each Associate Member Club shall be represented by one of its members, who shall be an Individual Member of the BBYRA. Said representative will not be entitled to vote, but his or her views on any topic shall be given a reasonable opportunity to be aired.

Each Active Member Club shall be entitled to one vote. Voting may be done by proxy, which shall be filed with the recording secretary at the meeting.

 A majority of those present in person and by proxy shall determine all questions, except as may be otherwise provided herein.

#### **ARTICLE SIX - OFFICERS**

1. The BBYRA shall have the following officers: Commodore (who shall be President for purposes of the New Jersey Nonprofit Corporation Act), Vice Commodore (who shall be Vice-President for purposes of the New Jersey Nonprofit Corporation Act), Rear Commodore, Fleet Captain, Secretary, Treasurer, and Measurer, all of whom shall be elected at the annual meeting. The Commodore, Vice Commodore and Rear Commodore shall be elected from the Delegates; the Fleet Captain, Secretary, Treasurer, and Measurer

may be elected from the Individual Members of any Active Member Club.

The BBYRA'S Representative to the Council of Sailing Associations of the USSAILING., shall be appointed by the Commodore from the past or present officers of the BBYRA, and shall be a current Individual Member.

### **ARTICLE SEVEN - DUTIES OF OFFICERS**

1. Commodore (President): The Commodore shall preside at all meetings of the BBYRA and perform such other duties as may be delegated from time to time by the Delegates. The Commodore shall be an ex-officio member of all Committees. The Commodore shall be the chief executive officer of the BBYRA and shall have general charge and supervision over and responsibility for the affairs of the BBYRA. The Commodore may enter into and execute, in the name of the BBYRA, contracts or other instruments not in the regular course of business which are authorized, either generally or specifically, by the Delegates. The Commodore shall have the general powers and duties of management usually vested in the office of president of a corporation. From time to time the Commodore may delegate to any other officer any or all of these duties and authority.

2. Vice Commodore (Vice President): The Vice Commodore shall be responsible for the BBYRA's Regatta Program and shall assist the Commodore and preside in the absence of the Commodore. The Vice Commodore shall have duties and possess authority as may be delegated to the Vice Commodore by the Commodore.

3. Rear Commodore: The Rear Commodore shall be responsible for the equipment of the BBYRA and shall assist the Commodore and Vice Commodore, and preside in the absence of both and have the duties and possess the authority as may be delegated to the Rear Commodore by the Commodore.

4. Fleet Captain: The Fleet Captain shall function as an administrative assistant to the Commodore, shall be responsible for the Safety and Training Programs of the BBYRA and shall cause random safety equipment checks to be made of competitor's yachts during the BBYRA's summer Regatta season, reporting the results thereof to the Chairperson of the Regatta Committee and to the Scorer.

5. Secretary: The Secretary shall keep a record of all meetings of the Delegates, the Executive Committee, the Officers, the Regatta Committee, and the Class Liaison Committee and shall keep an accurate roll of all Active, Associate, and Individual Members, and of any written proxies of same. The Secretary shall conduct the official correspondence of the BBYRA, send out all notices and perform such other duties as pertain to the position of Secretary. The Secretary shall keep all delivered reports of the Scorer for two (2) years and then turn same over to the Historian. The Secretary shall keep copies of all delivered committee reports and turn same over to the Historian upon relinquishment of office. The Secretary shall have charge of the seal of the BBYRA, if any.

6. Treasurer: The Treasurer shall have custody of all the funds and securities of the BBYRA and shall keep or cause to be kept regular books of account for the BBYRA. The Treasurer shall perform other duties and possess other powers that are incident to the office or that shall be assigned by the Commodore.

7. Measurer: The Measurer shall receive and keep a record of all yachts as may be required to have measurement certificates by their fleet measurers, and maintain copies of each classes current scantlings as required by such classes association, if any.

8. Yacht Racing Association Representative: The Yacht Racing Association Representative of the BBYRA shall represent the BBYRA on USSAILING's "Council of Sailing Associations" (CSA); shall report to the Delegates at the annual meeting; and shall be reimbursed for duties performed as a member of the CSA while representing the BBYRA, and upon the presentation of a voucher to the Treasurer, approved by the Commodore.

9. All elected officers shall make or cause to be made, at the annual meeting of the BBYRA, and at such other times as the Delegates may direct, a written report of their activities and the condition of the affairs of the BBYRA with which they are charged, and coordinate the submission of budgets of committees over which they have appointing power, for the following year of the BBYRA.

10. The officers of the BBYRA, by virtue of their office shall be members of the Executive Committee.

11. No officer or member of the Delegates may receive a salary or compensation from the BBYRA, but nothing contained herein shall be construed to prevent reimbursement for expenses incurred for and on behalf of the BBYRA.

#### **ARTICLE EIGHT - DELEGATES**

1. The Delegates are the equivalent of the "Board" as defined in NJSA 15A:1-2\*, and shall consist of the following: Three (3) delegates (one of whom shall be the Commodore or Vice Commodore) from each Active Member Club, which Club, through those persons shall have one vote. \*(See Article Five, 1.)

The Delegates shall have general control and management of the affairs, funds and property of the BBYRA. As a body, they shall have full power and it shall be their duty to carry out the purposes of the BBYRA according to law and as provided in these By-Laws and the Certificate of Incorporation.

The Commodore shall preside at all meetings of the Delegates and in the absence of the Commodore, the Vice Commodore shall preside.

4. The presence of twelve (12) Delegates, representing at least eight (8) Active Member Clubs shall constitute a quorum and a vote by a majority of those present at any meeting at which a quorum is present shall be necessary for the transaction of its business.

5. Without in any way limiting the general powers of the Delegates, they shall, among other things: a) consider and act upon applications for membership in the BBYRA; b) approve dates and formulate arrangements for various championship events, with the advice and consent of the Regatta Committee; c) elect the officers of the BBYRA; and, d) adopt such regulations governing policy, organization, and procedural matters as they deem appropriate.

#### **ARTICLE NINE - DUES**

 The Delegates shall fix the dues for each class of membership and direct the Treasurer and/or Chairperson of the Membership Committee to issue receipts and/or membership cards to those making payment.

2. The dues of Active and Associate Member Clubs are due on or before May 1st of each year. Upon any such dues remaining unpaid as of May 31st in any year, written notice thereof shall be sent by the Treasurer. If such dues remain unpaid as of June 30th then said delinquent Club(s) shall stand suspended until restored to membership by the Executive Committee.

3. Sailing privileges in the Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association will automatically be accorded members in good standing of member clubs that have contributed a sum to the Association that equals the Individual Dues amount for 90% or more of their membership. Members of yacht clubs that do not contribute a sum covering 90% or more of their membership must pay Individual Dues either through their club or at the time of registration.

4. Non-payment of dues by an Individual Member who wishes to be a competitor in any BBYRA championship series shall bar such person from being scored and receiving any award for said series.

#### **ARTICLE TEN - TERMINATION OF MEMBERSHIP**

1. 1. The Delegates may expel or suspend any member of the BBYRAby a two-thirds vote of the entire Delegates for any violation of the By-Laws or for any conduct which in the opinion of the Delegates is improper and prejudicial to the welfare, reputation or best interests of the BBYRA. No member shall be expelled or suspended without having been given the opportunity to submit written answer to such charges. A proceeding similar to that contained in Article Fourteen of the By-Laws of USSAILING, shall be followed by the BBYRA in the resolution of grievances.

2. Any Club may withdraw from the BBYRA by giving written notice to the Secretary.

### **ARTICLE ELEVEN - COMMITTEES**

1. There shall be the following standing committees of the BBYRA: Executive, Nominating, Regatta, Financial, Appeals, Protest, Scoring, Class Liaison, Junior Sailing, Membership, Class Eligibility, Sailing Instructions, General Programs and Services, Safety, Historical, US Sailing National Cup Events, Training, and Equipment.

 All Committees and their chairperson shall be appointed and their duties delineated as herein provided.

Each committee shall be authorized to prescribe rules and procedures for the direction of the activities assigned to it, including budget preparation.

 All committee chairpersons appointed by the Commodore or Vice Commodore, shall serve for a term of one year.

5. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Executive Committee which shall be comprised of the following: The Officers; Past Commodores of the BBYRA; and the incumbent Commodore (or designee of said Commodore) of each Active Member Club. This committee shall have general executive powers of the BBYRA between meetings of the Delegates and shall be responsible for executing the policies set by the Delegates. It shall be presided over by the Commodore, and carry out such other duties as may be specifically set forth in these By-Laws. It may appoint such ad hoc committees (e.g., Finance), as may be necessary in the performance of its duties. It shall normally carry out its duties by telephone, correspondence or meetings as determined by the Commodore. It shall report all of its decisions to the next meeting of the Delegates for their review and ratification.

6. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRAknown as the Nominating Committee, appointed by the Commodore at the Spring Meeting of the Delegates, and consisting of the Past Commodores of the BBYRA. It shall be chaired by the most recent available Past Commodore. The committee shall propose a slate of nominees for Officers to the Secretary at least fifteen (15) days before the annual meeting of the BBYRA. Additional nominations may be submitted in writing by Delegates, provided the nominees also consent, in writing, to the Secretary at least fifteen (15) days before said annual meeting, and the Secretary shall notify all Delegates of such nomination(s) at least seven (7) days before said annual meeting. No other nominations shall be accepted at the annual meeting.

7. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Regatta Committee, which shall be appointed by the Commodore within one month after the annual meeting. "It shall consist of the Past Commodores of the BBYRA (who, collectively, shall have one vote), the Vice Commodore of the BBYRA, who shall act as chairperson, the Rear Commodore who shall act as vice chairperson, the Treasurer, the Secretary, the Fleet Captain and the Measurer (all of whom shall have no vote, unless they are also representing their clubs; in the event of a tie vote, the Vice Commodore, and in his absence, the Rear Commodore may vote); and three Representatives plus a number of

Alternate Representatives, the number of which will be at the discretion of the Commodore. designated by each Active and Associate Member Club." The Regatta Committee shall have entire control of BBYRA's Championship Series. It shall receive and pass upon requests for allotment of racing dates; sanction races; submit for approval, a schedule of proposed races for the next season at the annual meeting of the Delegates, which schedule shall be finalized no later than March 15 of each year for the ensuing season. It shall decide all questions relating to sailing instructions, courses, charts, signals, marks, measurements and allied subjects. It shall have charge of the actual conduct of the races and the selection of courses and the official scoring. It shall recommend changes in the racing rules governing BBYRA sponsored regattas which shall first be submitted to the Executive Committee for review and approval before submission to the Delegates for final action. BBYRA Regatta Committee membership representing eight (8) Active Member Clubs shall constitute a quorum. The Regatta Committee shall receive reports from the Protest, Scoring, Sailing Instructions, Safety and Class Eligibility Committees and the Vice Commodore will report important matters to the Delegates, without the need for debate and duplication of said committees reports by both the Regatta Committee and the Delegates.

8. There shall be a standir committee of the BBYRA known as the Financial Committee, chaired by the Treasurer, which shall include the Commodore, Vice Commodore, Rear Commodore and immediate Past Commodore. This committee shall be responsible for combining all budgets prepared by individual committees into an annual budget for presentation to and approval by the Delegates at the annual meeting. This committee shall monitor the financial condition of the BBYRA throughout the year and review and approve all expenditures within the budget of the BBYRA as approved at the annual meeting. This committee shall also be responsible for seeing that the financial condition of the BBYRA is in conformity with the guidelines of the Section 501 (c) (3) status under the Internal Revenue Code.

9. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Appeals Committee, whose members shall be appointed by the Commodore not later than March 1st each year and shall consist of a chairperson and at least four (4) members, all of whom shall be Individual Members in good standing, and preferably shall hold certification as a USSAILING Certified Judge. The committee shall elect, from its membership, a secretary, who shall serve for a term of one (1) year or until a successor is elected. Should the committee adopt any procedural rules which are not prescribed by the Racing Rules approved by USSAILING, said rules shall be published in the BBYRA's Year Book and on BBYRA's website, and/or be posted upon the official bulletin board maintained by the Regatta Committee and displayed at each race day during the BBYRA's series of championship regattas. In addition, the secretary of the committee shall cause to be mailed to each Active and Associate Member Club's Regatta Committee representative, a true copy of any such procedural rules. Said representative shall be responsible for the appropriate display or distribution of such rules to his/her club.

10. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Protest Committee, whose chairperson shall be appointed by the Vice Commodore within one month after the annual meeting of the BBYRA. The chairperson shall form a suitable composition of the committee from among the general membership of the association. Written results of protest hearing shall be delivered to the scorer. The Vice Commodore will be advised of the results of hearings. It shall be the responsibility of skippers or their representatives to be present at said time and place designated for the hearing of a protest. When possible, the chairperson of the Protest Committee hearing panel on a given race day shall cause said hearing(s) to be held on the date of the race out of which a protest arises.

11. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Scoring Committee,

whose chairperson shall be appointed by the Commodore within one month after the annual meeting, and whose title shall be Scorer. The Commodore may appoint one or more assistant scorers. Both the Scorer and any assistants shall be Individual Members In good standing, and they may be members of other committees. It shall be responsibility of this committee to maintain the BBYRA's computer and related software; to develop a suitable system of records for each of the championship series' regattas; to complete and receive the records of each such regatta and compute the championship score therefrom. The committee shall cause to be published on BBYRA's website or distributed to each Active and Associate Member Club, either directly or through said Clubs' Regatta Committee representative or alternate(s) for the appropriate display and/or distribution at each Active and Associate Member Club, a copy of the cumulative record of each classes competitors and their current standing in their respective classes championship series to that each competitor is able to learn of his/her current standing in the championship series of his/her class. All issues related to a particular competitor's standing should be directed to the Scorer.

12. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Class Liaison Committee, chaired by the Rear Commodore, which shall meet at least once a year with the representatives of each of the classes then being sailed in the championship series. The committee will receive the recommendations of the class representatives and report to the Regatta Committee their suggestions for the improvement of racing on Barnegat Bay, and other matters within the purview of the BBYRA's racing activities. The representatives of the classes may appoint, by majority vote, a person to attend at meeting of the Regatta Committee as an observer.

 There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Junior Sailing Committee, whose chairperson shall be appointed by the Commodore within one month of the annual meeting. Said chairperson shall be appointed from a list of persons recommended by the BBYRA's incumbent chairperson of the Junior Sailing Committee, and shall not be an Active or Associate Member Club's junior sailing coordinator for the ensuing sailing year; shall have prior junior sailing administrative experience and be a current individual Member of the BBYRA. The chairperson may appoint assistants, with the edvice and consent of the Commodore, who shall be individual Members of the BBYRA during their tenure. The chairperson shall: preside at all meetings of the committee; represent the BBYRA at US SAILING Junior activities; coordinate the BBYRA's and Area "C" calendars in cooperation with the BBYRA's chairperson of BBYRA sponsored US SAILING National Cup Events, e.g., O'Day, Sears, Bemis/Smythe, etc; report upon the junior sailing activities of the BBYRA to the Delegates at their annual and spring meetings; appoint a co-chair for the purpose of recording minutes and assisting the Treasurer in maintaining financial records of the activities of the junior sailing programs; develop programs for fund-raising activities by the committee in coordination with the Treasurer of the BBYRA and with the approval of the Executive Committee; and carry out such further activities in furtherance of the purposes of the BBYRA as the Delegates may deem appropriate.

14. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA, known as the Membership Committee, whose chairperson shall be appointed by the Commodore within one month of the annual meeting. This committee shall be responsible for promotion of the membership in the BBYRA of the class known as Individual Member. In addition, the Membership Committee shall keep an accurate roll of Individual Members, and issue annually either directly to each active and associate member club or through said Clubs' Regatta Committee representative or alternate(s) membership cards and decals, if any, to those making payment of dues.

15. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA, known as the Sailing Instructions

Committee, charged with the responsibility to annually update, as required, the published sailing instructions, and charts, to be proposed to the Regatta Committee, and published in the BBYRA's Year Book and on BBYRA's website. The chairperson shall be appointed by the Commodore within one month of the annual meeting, and he/she shall work in cooperation with the Class Liaison Committee and the Vice Commodore, in their race management functions.

16. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Class Eligibility Committee, whose chairperson shall be appointed by the Vice Commodore within one month of the annual meeting. The committee shall recommend and maintain guidelines for series eligibility, review the annual performance of each class and investigate the credentials of applicant classes. It shall make recommendations concerning old and new class eligibility to the Regatta Committee.

17. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the General Programs and Services Committee, consisting of at least three Individual Members, one of whom shall be a Past Commodore, all of whom, including a chairperson, shall be appointed by the Commodore within one month of the annual meeting. In addition, the Commodore shall specify those members of the committee responsible for the website and publication of the Year Book provided for herein. It shall be the responsibility of the committee to develop insurance programs for the BBYRA and its members, including coordination of the BBYRA's insurance programs and that of its Member Clubs, Delegates and Committees, with those services provided by USSAILING, and other organizations; to develop programs for the solicitation of funds for effecting the purposes of the BBYRA as spelled out in its BY-Laws, Constitution, and Exemption Letter dated February 28, 1992 from the Internal Revenue Service of the United States Department of the Treasury, determining the BBYRA's exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) and 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code; to solicit invitations from the various Active Member Clubs to host the annual fund raising Commodores' Ball, and to schedule the dates for future conduct of same; to develop a schedule of advertising fees for space in the BBYRA's Year Book, and to coordinate efforts with the Appeals Committee, Regatta Committee, Sailing Instructions Committee and Executive Committee for the publication of said Year Book: to publish said Year Book: and to be responsible for the public relations of the BBYRA including but not limited to a website. "The General Programs and Services Committee shall develop a Policies and Procedure Manual for the conduct of any fund raising activities to be undertaken by or on behalf of the Association, by any of its Active or Associate Member Clubs, or Individual Members. Said manual shall deal explicitly with fiscal responsibility for such activities."

18. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Safety Committee, chaired by the Fleet Captain. It shall be the function of the Safety Committee to implement an on-water and off-water safety program for regatta competitors and personnel. The Safety Committee shall be responsible for obtaining appropriate annual "Permit for Marine Event" from the Coast Guard and any permits required by the State of New Jersey.

19. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the US SAILING National Cup Events Committee, charged with the coordination of the BBYRA's elimination series for the US SAILING National Cup Events. The chairperson shall be appointed by the Commodore within one month of the annual meeting, and shall report to the Vice Commodore of the BBYRA on the progress of the US SAILING events BBYRA eliminations, and make recommendations for the improvement thereof.

20. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Historical Committee, charged with the preservation of the records and memorabilia of the Association and its members. It's chairperson, appointed by the Commodore within one month of the annual meeting, shall be known as the BBYRA Historian. The Historian shall submit a written

report of the committee activities to date in the current calendar year.

21. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRA known as the Training Committee, chaired by the Fleet Captain. It shall be the function of the Training Committee to provide training by organizing and/or holding competitive events and/or meetings in the nature of seminars.

22. There shall be a standing committee of the BBYRAknown as the Equipment Committee, chaired by the Rear Commodore. It shall be the function of the Equipment Committee to store and maintain the equipment of the BBYRA and to make same available to the Regatta Committee whenever and wherever requested by the Commodore or Vice Commodore.

#### ARTICLE TWELVE - PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

The rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order shall govern the BBYRA in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these By-Laws and any special rules of order the BBYRA may adopt.

#### **ARTICLE THIRTEEN - INDEMNIFICATION**

1. The BBYRA shall indemnify all corporate agents against all expenses and liabilities in connection with any proceeding involving the corporate agent by reason of his or her having been such a corporate agent other than a proceeding by or in the right of the BBYRA if: a) such corporate agent acted in good faith in a manner he or she reasonably believed to be not opposed to the best interests of the BBYRA; and b) with respect to any criminal proceeding, such corporate agent had no reasonable cause to believe his or her conduct was unlawful.

2. All terms used herein shall have the meanings attributed to such terms as set forth In NJSA 15A:3-4(a).

3. It is intended that the rights of indemnification provided hereunder shall be as broad as permitted under the laws of the State of New Jersey. Without limiting the foregoing, the BBYRA herewith adopts the provision of NJSA 15A:3-4 as though fully herein set forth; whenever said statute permits the Association to provide indemnification this By-Law shall be deemed to require such indemnification to be provided by the BBYRA.

#### **ARTICLE FOURTEEN - AMENDMENTS**

Any amendment in the Bylaws may be initiated by any Individual Member, circulated to the members of the Executive Committee.
