Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association Delegates Meeting Minutes October 6, 2012 Bay Head Yacht Club

<u>Call to Order</u> – Commodore Ed Reardon called the Delegates meeting to order at 1:35 p.m. Commodore Reardon welcomed all and thanked BHYC for hosting today's meetings.

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Roll Call — All BBYRA Yacht Clubs were present except Mantoloking Yacht Club. Also present were BBYRA Officers Commodore Ed Reardon, Vice Commodore Bob King, Rear Commodore June Kingman Fleet Captain Ed Vienckowski, Treasurer James Maida, and Secretary Jennifer Alldian (missing was Measurer John Applegate). Also present were P/C Bill Scheyer, P/C Jack Heacock, P/C Bob Morrow, P/C Richard Proko and Committee Chairs Susan Proko (Junior Sailing), Jan O'Malley (Appeals), Eve Allison (Membership), Lara Walsh (100th Anniversary) and Lorraine Morro, (Yearbook).

Approval of Agenda – Commodore Rear Jon asked that the agenda by approved with the deletion of the Policy governing donations made by the BBYRA. Steve Foster made a motion to approve the agenda with that deletion, seconded by Nancy Kerr. Motion passed by unanimous consent. Ed Reardon also indicated that Fleet Captain Ed Vienckowski would make his Class Eligibility report after his Fleet Captain report since he needed to leave for the Barnegat Bay Sailing Hall of Fame Induction later that night.

<u>Approval of Minutes</u> – Since there were no changes to the March 31, 2012 minutes, Commodore Reardon asked for a motion to approve the minutes which was made by Steve Foster, and seconded by P/C Jack Heacock. Motion passed by unanimous consent.

Approval of Minutes – Since there were no changes to the August 6, 2012 minutes, Commodore Reardon asked for a motion to approve the minutes which was made by Steve Foster, and seconded by P/C Jack Heacock. Motion passed by unanimous consent.

<u>Correspondence</u> - The following correspondence has been received since the March Meeting:

- 3. A thank you note was received from Timmy Crann, Team USA 15122, thanking the BBYRA for their contribution for their trip to Finland for the Junior Lightning Worlds.
- 4. A Feirer Fund Application was received from Jack Gerli for the Chubb Sears Cup Quadruple Hand.
- 5. A Feirer Fund Application was received from Jack Gerli for the US Sailing Youth Championship.
- 6. Three thank you notes from the Job B. Gash family thanking the Bay for the flowers, notes and BBYRA yearbook.

OFFICERS' REPORTS:

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Commodore — Commodore Ed Reardon distributed copies of his report (a copy of which is attached to the original minutes and incorporated herein). Commodore Reardon noted the passing of three Past Commodores this year. Job B. Gash from SPYC 1988-1989; Don McNeil from BHYC 1996-1997; and Dave Loughran from MYC 1990-1991.

On June 23, MYC and Barnegat Bay Charities hosted the BBYRA Ball and raised \$25,000.

MCYC hosted the Championship of Champions on Friday, June 17th. We had a successful 2012 Championship Series, where the weather cooperated and we were able to sail all 10 weeks.

The BBYRA was able to help local sailors compete at the national and international level by making several donations in keeping with our mission statement and supporting our 501(c)(3).

 \$2,000 was donated to the Toms River High School South Sailing Team to compete in the 2012 Mallory National Championship in Seattle, WA.

- On an International level we donated \$200 to Timmy Crann (MCYC) and his crew for the 2012 Lightning Youth Worlds in Finland.
- Two Feirer Fund applications (for a total of \$2,700) were received from Jack Gerli (MYC) for the US Youth Sailing Championship in OR and the Sears, Bemis, Smythe in CA. Unfortunately the fund only had \$110.09 for disbursement. A donation of \$250 for each application was made after consulting with the Commodore of BYC, Neil Brooks, the BBYRA Chair of the US Sailing National Cup Events, P/C Bob Morrow, and BBYRA Treasurer James Maida. The BBYRA made up the difference of \$384.91 as we have done in the past when the Feirer Fund did not have the amount requested.

<u>Vice Commodore</u> — Vice Commodore Bob King (a copy of the VC's report is attached to the original minutes and incorporated herein.) thanked the Regatta Committee Members that volunteered their time. Vice Commodore King wanted to also thank the following clubs:

- TRYC for providing its launch as Line Boat for all Down Bay and Seaside race days;
- BYC for providing its launch as Mark Set Boat for all race days;
- IHYC provided Start Boats for the Green Course for the OGYC/PBYC Race Day, and a Finish Boat for all Down Bay race days and NBYC race day;

- LYC provided the Start Boat for the Rose Course for the entire season; and
- MCYC for hosting the 2012 Championship of Champions on June 17.

Vice Commodore King thanked Art Bailey (the new Sneakbox Liaison) for bringing back the Sneakbox Class, the oldest on the Bay. At the start of the season there were no Sneakboxes and we ended with four at SPYC. There should be four to six Sneakboxes competing in 2013.

A review of the season highlighted the following:

- Of the 189 races scheduled, 170 were sailed;
- The White course was discontinued and the Sneakboxes, 420's and Junior Sunfish sailed on the Green Course;
- For safety reasons, the A-Cats were moved from the Rose Course with the E-Scows to the Green Course;
- The E-Scows were able to sail two AM and one PM race Up Bay and one AM and two PM races Down Bay;
- To ease the congested AM Green Course, the Club 420 and Laser Radial started together;
- The Regatta Committee welcomed new members, while some longtime members retired resulting in a shortage of staff during some race days;
- The Regatta Committee will meet on November 17 at MCYC; and on February 16 at TRYC.

Vice Commodore King recommended that the Regatta Representative names given to the Secretary actually be members who would like to participate on Race Days. He also recommended that the Sailing Instruction Committee look at the finish procedures and see if they can be simplified.

Rear Commodore – Rear Commodore June Kingman submitted her report, a copy of which is attached to the original minutes and incorporated herein. Rear Commodore Kingman thanked all the volunteers who made racing possible by physically managing all the equipment. A thank you to OGYC member Roland Santomenna for being the weekly Green Course Equipment Manager; a thank you to LYC member Del Kusma who was the Rose Course Equipment Manager; a thank you to Commodore Reardon, Vice Commodore

King and Past Commodores Proko and Morrow for moving the BBYRA trailer (which stored all the Green Course equipment) from Host Club to Host Club each week; a thank you to LYC for storing all the Rose Course equipment in a locker. A detailed equipment list and full inventory report will be furnished at the Spring Meeting.

<u>Fleet Captain</u> — Fleet Captain Ed Vienckowski thanked everyone who helped make his first year as an Officer a success. (A copy of Fleet Captain's the report is attached to the original minutes and incorporated herein.)

Safety — We are fortunate to have two State Marine Police who are Flag Officers at MCYC making the permit process a lot easier. We replaced one base and four handheld radios this year. A safety issue arose during week 2 racing at IHYC with the overcrowding of the A Cats and the E Scows on the Rose Course in the heavy airs. Commodore Reardon is to be commended for his proactive response in transferring the A Cats to the Green Course. Another safety concern arose during the morning of week 8 (BYC) on the Rose Course when there were not patrol boats capable of dealing with capsized E Scows. A suggestion would be to require each club to provide the large Ribcrafts on alternate weeks, staffed with personnel able to assist.

Training — The two day US Sailing Powerboat Safety Training Course (was to be subsidized by the BBYRA) that was to be held at MRYC in the spring was cancelled due to lack of interest. The two day format seemed to discourage people from attending. New racing rules will be introduced in 2013, so we will look to have race management or other training opportunities. A very thorough report was recently released by US Sailing documenting the results of a three day on-water test program. This report was the result of the fatal sailing accident that occurred in Annapolis in 2011.

<u>Measurer</u> - Measurer John Applegate did not submit a report. He was being inducted into the Barnegat Bay Sailing Hall of Fame that night.

<u>Treasurer</u> – Treasurer James Maida distributed his Treasurer's report, a copy of which is attached to the original minutes and incorporated herein. The registration, titles, insurance and audit for

the ribs and trailers is \$8,800. The BBYRA will continue to register the ribs and trailers. Treasurer Maida suggests maybe the 2013 charter for the ribs increase from the \$1.00 charge to help offset the costs. P/C Proko suggested \$200 which should cover the registrations and the insurance. P/C Proko will look into the insurance on the ribs to see if it can be lowered since the BBYRA is the second insurer (each club must provide their own insurance on the ribs). BYC Commodore Neil Brooks asked if Mr. Kellogg's intent was for the clubs to have the boats. The BBYRA can't give the boats to the clubs because of the 501(c)(3). By using the boats for US National or International events we support our mission statement.

Eve Allison continues to deposit the registration fees and Lorraine Morrow deposits the Yearbook Ads which helps.

Unallocated donations were received from Bob Adams (\$500) and the Yetmans (\$200). The deed of gift states that only the interest can be paid out. P/C Bill Scheyer made a motion to allocate these donations to the Feirer Fund, seconded by Fleet Captain Ed Vienckowski. Motion passed by unanimous consent.

All non-officer expenses must be approved by an officer. All officer expenses must be approved by Treasurer Maida.

The BBC/BBYRA Ball donated \$25,000 to the BBYRA. They wanted us to use \$10,000 for operational expenses, to offset the shortfall for 2012. Treasurer James Maida would like to move \$15,000 to the Anniversary Fund Account. Steve Foster made a motion to move \$15,000 to the 100th Anniversary Fund, seconded by P/C Bob Morrow. Motion passed by unanimous consent.

The 100th Anniversary Project has raised \$11,732 with expenses for the trailer project at \$10,721.

The 2012 lunch checks will be mailed out next week.

A suggestion was made to not print the Yearbook, but the lawyers said that having the Yearbook strengthens our 501(c)(3) status. Also the yearbook does turn a profit. If we start selling ads that might jeopardize our 501(c)(3).

We will continue to have an audit because of the boats on the books.

Giving grants to individuals outside our organization also helps strengthen our 501(c)(3). Giving only to our clubs weakens our 501(c)(3) status.

Steve Foster made a motion to approve the 2013 budget, seconded by P/C Proko. Motion passed by unanimous consent. Steve also said a big thank you to James for the Treasurer report.

Standing Committee Reports

<u>Eligibility Committee</u> – Chair Ed Vienckowski submitted the following report:

- 1. The committee consisting of Jim Carson, Peter Sayia, Greg Parmele and James Maida will meet after the November Liaison meetings and the deadline for submitting applications for new classes has passed (which is November 15). To date no applications for new classes were submitted.
- 2. A summary report by class participation is attached. The report shows that there was a healthy 9.4% increase (13) in season qualifiers.
- 3. There was continued growth in both the AM (2) and PM (3) E-Sloop class.
- 4. There were gains nearly across the boards, including Laser and Laser Radial Jr. which had been stagnant the last few years. Sunfish and Sandpipers also increased.
- 5. The only drop in participation was the Sneakbox class which has already indicated that there will be more coming back next year.
- 6. There was also a lack of growth in the Junior Sunfish, and I will await the class input at the November meeting.

Executive Committee - Commodore Reardon reported that most of the topics discussed at this morning's Executive Committee session have been mentioned in officer reports; Ribcrafts and budget. The issue of OCC qualifiers will be worked on over the winter. At the August Delegates meeting a question arose as to whether Past Commodore's can vote. Commodore Reardon has appointed Fleet Captain Ed Vienckowski and P/C Harry Foote (one other person will be added to the committee) to review the by-laws by our Spring

Meeting. So there will be no discussion or debate on who gets to vote at our next meeting.

Commodore Reardon asked the BHYC Delegate Jim Cadranell if there was going to be any problem with BHYC hosting the BBYRA 100th Anniversary Ball if the clubhouse will be closed for construction. Jim said that BHYC would make alternate arrangements, maybe the Dale Building.

A motion to approve the calendar was made by Steve Foster and seconded by Rear Commodore June Kingman. The motion passed by unanimous consent.

During the Executive Committee Meeting this morning there was discussion on the money that we give out. Commodore Reardon believes that there should be a committee that reviews the requests and then makes the grant. The officers will work on this over the winter with the involvement of the Finance Committee to formalize the process and report on this at the Spring Meetings. The Commodore has to sign all grant requests. The Feirer Fund has a grant application that may be utilized. Chair Jan C. O'Malley mentioned that the Jersey Shore Youth Sailing Team (JSYST.org)

gives a grant to a shore sailor each year. The grant application is on their web site and can be used to come up with our grant application. Treasurer Maida said we have to be very careful of who gets the grants. The IRS looks at this information and we want no conflicts of interest, so no grants will be given to any Officer or Past Commodore.

<u>Appeals Committee</u> — Chair Jan O'Malley, wanted to thank the SI Committee and the Regatta Committee and the net result has been that there have been no appeals.

Protest – Chair Tom Sollas – No report

Scoring Committee - P/C Jack recommends that we continue with the same program and procedures for next year. He would like to recognize Assistant Scorer Eve Allison for her work with registration and membership. (A copy of the report is attached to the original minutes and incorporated herein.) As previously mentioned there were more boats sailing this year. Areas for improvement would be accuracy, completeness, order of information and speed. Commodore Reardon thanked Jack for all his time associated with scoring.

<u>Junior Sailing Committee</u> – Chair Susan Proko reported that the Junior Coordinators from the 13 clubs met four times last year. (A copy of Junior Sailing Chair's report is attached to the original minutes and incorporated herein.)

- She did not attend the US Sailing National Sailing Symposium this past January, but did obtain information and handouts, which were passed along to each club.
- > The Coach's Code of Conduct was adopted, by all clubs, and the committee.
- Two Sailing Level 1 Certification courses were held at MYC over the Memorial Day Weekend.
- ➤ A mandatory training (Positive Coaches Alliance) hosted at MRYC was scheduled for all instructors for June 26, funded by a grant from the IHSF. The training was cancelled when the US Sailing Vendor was an hour and a half late. The 100 instructors who attended were given pizza and soda and sent home. The grant will be used in the spring with a training session lead by Clay Johnson.

- Packets for the BBYRA NORs and other information were distributed on June 16.
- ➤ BHYC hosted the BBYRA Midget Eliminations, two participants went onto the finals in CT in late August.
- > TRYC hosted the Bemis & Smythe eliminations for Area C in early July. There were 26 laser radials and 20 420s. The Sears eliminations were hosted by MBC.

<u>Membership Committee</u> - Chair Eve Allison reported that it was a very good year and wanted to thank all the yacht clubs that provided an alphabetized list of members.

Sailing Instructions Committee — Chair Rich Kerdock submitted the following report which was read into the minutes by Secretary Jennifer Alldian. The summer is a quiet time for the SI Committee. The season's SI's and RC guidelines appeared to work OK. The SI Committee did consult with the BBYRA RC Officers regarding the change in sailing venue (Rose to Green) for the A Cats. When the smoke cleared the change was managed well. The SI Committee will meet after the Liaison I meeting.

US Sailing– Chair P/C Harry Foote submitted the following report which was read into the minutes by Secretary Jennifer Alldian. P/C Harry Foote will attend the 2012 annual meeting which will be held in San Francisco from October 31 – November 3. There are two items which will consume the majority of the meeting. First will be the election of a President and three Board members (one is Jim Walsh). Voting is open online. The second item is a major structuring of the organization. Major changes could include: doing away with the House of Delegates; doing away with the CSA as it presently exits; and changes in the election process and term limits.

<u>US Sailing National Cup Events</u> – P/C Bob Morrow reported that the US Sailing perpetual trophies were given out at SPYC Awards. The YRA eliminations were done away with and the trophy was renamed and given to the Best Bay Sailor. The Ida Lewis and Leiter Cup flags were given out, but there were no trophies. To be consistent with other US Sailing Events a trophy and flag should be given in the future.

General Programs & Services -

<u>Insurance</u>: Chair/PC Proko said that he would look into the insurance on the ribcrafts, since we are the second policy holder, to see if it can be decreased. We still maintain 11,000,000 (eleven million) in coverage.

Yearbook: Co-editor Lorraine Morrow reported that the book included an ad from every club this year (a first) and from every fleet (except laser and sunfish). A complimentary book is sent (\$3) to everyone who takes an ad and is not an active sailor. The book made a profit of \$250.00. Co-Editors Lorraine Morrow and Mimi Dimon having been doing the Yearbook for seven years, new to the committee next year will be Bridget Doran and Beth Hummel.

<u>Website</u>: Webmaster/PC Heacock reported that in addition to supporting the BBYRA the website supports the Barnegat Bay Sailing Hall of Fame and the Toms River Seaport Society. (See report on file.)

Historical /100th Anniversary — Chair Lara Walsh said that the Historical committee increased in size this year in anticipation of the 100th Anniversary in 2014. Each club has a representative to the historical committee. For the 100th Anniversary we began a book and film project to celebrate the past, present, and future of the BBYRA. The book and film will be written by native sailor Gary Jobson. The project is privately funded and includes donations from member clubs. The committee has been working to collect photos and other historical information from each club. There have been four days of filming. A short film trailer has been completed and will be shown today and then later tonight at the Barnegat Bay Sailing Hall of Fame dinner. The film will be ready in the spring of 2014. There will be a need to protect both the trailer and film since they are the property of the bay.

New Business

1. P/C Proko said that the annual lease on the Ribcrafts is from June 18 to June 17. The boats have been used consistent with our mission statement and will continue to do so. P/C Proko will recommend that the \$1 fee increase in 2013 to cover some of the costs that the BBYRA incurs to insure and register the boats and trailers. A thank you to all the Downbay clubs who provided their boats to TRYC to use for the Smythe and Bemis regatta. Next year the ribcrafts will be asked for again as TRYC

- will be hosting the Ensign Nationals in the middle of the summer. The boats should be winterized again this season and after 100 hours the motors need to be looked at.
- 2. Steve Foster thanked June Kingman for organizing the trailer. He suggested that a crab net be purchased so that registrations can be taken on the water easier.
- 3. Bridget Hoey Sunfish Award was given to her YC.
- 4. Midget Double-Handed flags were presented to Jack Heacock (MCYC) on behalf of Abby Kardek.

New Business

- 1. The 2013 budget was approved earlier in the meeting.
- 2. Vice Commodore King presented the 2013 Championship Series Race Schedule. P/C Bob Morrow made a motion to accept the schedule, seconded by Eve Allison. The schedule was approved by unanimous consent.
- 3. Vice Commodore King said that the 2013 Championship of Champions will be hosted by TRYC on Friday, June 14. The competitors will sail in tech dinghies.
- 4. The BBYRA/BBC Ball held in June 2012 raised \$25,000. As previously discussed, \$10,000 will be used to cover the shortfall in the 2012 budget and \$15,000 will be transferred to the 100th Anniversary fund.
- 5. The 2013 BBYRA Ball will be held on Saturday, June 15 at SPYC.
- 6. The policy governing donations made by the BBYRA was eliminated from the agenda. There will be a committee formed over the winter to determine guidelines which will be presented at the spring 2013 meetings.
- 7. P/C Proko made a motion, submitted by the Nominating Committee, regarding the creation of a special committee charged with responsibilities related to the 100th anniversary celebration. Commodore Reardon stated that the Commodore should be on all committees. P/C Morrow stated that the Commodore is an ex-officio member of all committees.

The following motion is made...

- 2014 Annual meeting of the Delegates and shall autodissolve at the adjournment of that meeting. This committee shall report directly to the Delegates submitting periodic (quarterly) reports directly to the Delegates.
- ...That this committee will have the authority to assess all matters associated with the 100th anniversary book and video and submit all recommendations to the Delegates (or Executive Committee between meetings of the Delegates) for their action.
- ...That this committee shall have authority to:
 - 1. Develop all special commemorative articles.
 - 2. Develop commemorative logos.
 - 3. Print and distribute anniversary related materials.
 - 4. Develop additional materials and take additional actions to celebrate the BBYRA's anniversary.
- ...That at no time is any cost to be accrued by this committee to exceed the budget or special restricted account balance previously approved by the Delegates at its 8/6/12 meeting.
- ...That there shall be five (5) members of this committee
 who shall be approved by the Delegates at its 10/6/12
 meeting. They shall remain on this committee through its
 existence. No additional members shall be added to this
 committee. If a seat on this committee is vacated by a
 member, the Nominating Committee shall appoint a
 replacement as deemed necessary.
 - The Commodore shall be an ex-officio member of this committee.
- ...That the Nominating Committee is recommending the following BBYRA members be approved to comprise the BBYRA 100th Anniversary Committee:

Stan Switlick, Chair Lara Walsh Brigitte Hoey P/C Jack Heacock Treasurer, James Maida A motion to approve the amended motion was made by Steve Foster and seconded by Jim Cadranell. The motion passed by unanimous consent.

P/C Rich Proko presented the 2013 BBYRA Slate of Officers that was approved by the Nomination Committee on September 2, 2012.

Commodore – Edwin Reardon Vice Commodore – A. Robert King Rear Commodore – June Marie Kingman Fleet Captain – Edward Vienckowski Measurer – John Applegate Secretary – Jennifer C. Alldian Treasurer – James R. Maida

There being no further nominations, Steve Foster moved for the Secretary to cast one ballot approving the slate. Secretary Alldian cast the ballot making the nominations official.

Other Business – Commodore Reardon reminded everyone of P/C Dave Loughran's Memorial Mass on Tuesday, October 16 at Sacred Heart Church in Bay Head at 11:00 AM. The officers should wear their uniforms. A reception will follow at MYC.

Steve Foster said that he respects people that donate trophies to the BBYRA, but that Mr. Fester wanted the Len Egee trophy to be the number of junior sailors, not boats. IHYC won the trophy, though a junior skipper sailed a boat in the morning and another boat in the afternoon and this counted as two juniors. The SI Committee was charged with this over the winter and determined it would be the number of junior skippers registered. This discussion was tabled until the spring meeting, after we have seen the deed of gift.

The SI Committee would like to make a change to the skippers form. That when the "yellow flag" is flown, you must check in by the start boat.

Adjournment - With no other business to come before the Delegates, Commodore Reardon asked for a motion to adjourn the meeting. A motion was made by P/C Proko and seconded by Steve Foster. The meeting was adjourned at 3:37 p.m.

BBYRA Jr. Sailing Committee Report 10/6/12

As Chair of the Junior Sailing Committee, I report:

- ➤ The Jr Sailing Coordinators from the 13 BBYRA clubs met in November, 2011 at TRYC, February, 2012 at TRYC, June, 2012 at SPYC, and September, 2012 at BHYC.
- > I did not attend the US Sailing National Sailing Symposium this past January, but did obtain information and handouts, which in turn were passed onto the coordinators from each club.
- > Coach's Code of Conduct was adopted, by all clubs, and the committee.
- ➤ Two Sailing Level 1 Certification courses were held at MYC over Memorial Day weekend 5/27-5/30/10. Jimmy and Susan Kellogg of BHYC provided housing for the two Instructor Trainers. Twenty-four students attended, and all achieved certification.
- A mandatory training hosted at MRYC was scheduled for all instructors for 6/26/12, funded by a grant from the IHSF. Positive Coaches Alliance was secured for the training, a US Sailing vendor, the trainer was over an hour and half late therefore the training cancelled. Dinner of pizza and soda was provided for the 100 instructors who attended the scheduled meeting. The grant will be used in the spring with a training session lead by Clay Johnson. Details to be determined at future committee meetings.
- ➢ Packets of BBYRA NORs, registration forms, and additional BBYRA information were distributed to each of the 13 BBYRA clubs plus OCC at the June 16th packet meeting. Packets were also mailed to the NJYRA and MAYRA.
- ➤ Host club was secured for the BBYRA Midget Eliminations; BHYC hosted and ran the regatta. Two participants went onto the finals in CT in late August.
- > TRYC hosted the Bemis & Smythe eliminations for Area C in early July; 26 laser radials and 20 420s participated from Area C. The Sears eliminations was hosted by MBC, with 2 teams represented from the BBYRA.

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➤ The 2012 Jr. Sailing Program highlights are:

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- 957 junior sailors were enrolled in programs an increase of 22 over 2011
- 100 instructors were employed by the 13 clubs an increase of 10 from 2011

The 100 instructors were supported by 95 club boats – an increase of 1 boats over 2011

89+ instructors held Level 1 Certification and 7 held Level 2 Certification

- 12 regattas were held, an decrease of 2 over 2011 –Juniors from 9 clubs participated in the BBYRA an increase of 1 club over 2010
- Instructors from 8 clubs participated in the BBYRA a increase of 1 over 2011
- 11 of the 13 clubs have coordinators in place for 2012

On a personal note, it has been my distinct honor to serve the Barnegat Bay Yacht Racing Association as Chair of the Junior Sailing Committee. Thank you!

2012 Scorers Report

Eve

The scoring committee recognizes **Ave Allison** as Assistant Scorer and Registration / Membership, along with all those who recorded starts and finishes along with all the other information required.

- 1. This year we continued using race session Check-in records as the source for series qualification based on number of 'day' check-in records missed.
- 2. Checkin records were often missing or incomplete, so thay had be be faked from the finishes loosing that audit check!
- 3. Fleets scheduled AM/PM in the same 'day' require manual overrides to merge the records to get a correct checkin count.

This season had 16 race sessions split among the 'Morning 'Green' and 'Rose' races, and Afternoon 'Green' and 'Rose' race venues. There were a total of 1982 race records (1640 last year) input to the scoring program in addition to the 199 boat registration records up from 183 last year.

The number of boats 'qualifying' for the series increased to 152 from 138 last year, with the major increases in the E-Sloop, M-Sloop, and Sunfish classes.

Areas for improvement:

- 1. Accuracy morning races on days with a secondary PM race area seem to have higher than normal recording error rates. Some reports had finishes partially seperated by fleet, despite instruction to record information in the order it occures, resulting in results based on the audio recording only.
- 2. Completness Critical information (like registration sail number) not passed to the scorer. Audio recorders returned one out of three most weeks.
- 3. Order of information available for input. Normal order is Registration, Boat Check-in, Start, and then Finish. Note OCS boats were often not discovered until the recheck and audit on Monday!
- 4. **Speed** Reports often not received until boats return to the host club leaving no time to input and check information and generate the flag bags. One set of Rose area race documents were not received until the following Sunday

New areas this year include:







Graph Fleet - Total Entry Counts







Graph Fleet - Qualification Counts



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


