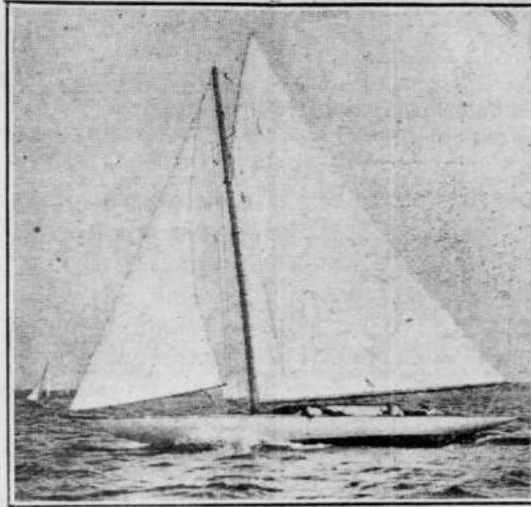

## NEW JERSEY COAST YACHTSMEN PLAN FOR SEASON'S BIGGEST DAY

The Inquirer's Regatta to Be Sailed on Barnegat Bay on Saturday Will Be Greatest Yachting Event of the Summer---Course Splendidly Selected

ISLAND HEIGHTS, N. J., Aug. 16.—Plans for the big all-day regatta on Barnegat Bay for Saturday of this week, August 21, have progressed so far that it is safe to predict it will be the biggest day of the summer for amateurs on the upper Jersey coast. In other words, The Inquirer's last Jersey coast regatta, and its first regatta on Barnegat Bay, will surpass in number of yachts entered, events sailed, and in general interest, all the races of the summer on this part of the Jersey shore.

The events scheduled by the Racing Committee of the Island Heights Yacht Club, under whose auspices the races will be sailed, are as follows:

### MOTOR BOATS

Speed Boat Class—Starting at 11 A. M.  
Cabin Cruiser Class—Starting at 11:05 A. M.  
Open Launch Class—Limited to craft with a speed under eleven miles an hour, starting at 11:10 A. M.

These motor boat races are all to be over a twenty-mile course, and to be conducted under the rules of the American Power Boat Association.

### SAIL BOATS

Smackpot Class—Twenty feet and under, time allowance based on over-all measurement, to start at 1:30 P. M.

Single Outboard Cabin Class—Measurement on overall basis, to start at 1:35 P. M.  
Cabin Cruising Sloop—Time allowance measured on over-all and water-line measurement, divided by two, to start at 1:55 P. M.

Open Sloop Class—Time allowance to be figured the same as in the cabin cruiser class, to start at 2 P. M.

As the races are to be sailed off Cedar Creek Point, some five miles below Barnegat Bay bridge, and as not a few of the craft that will participate will come from as far as Beach Haven to the south and Bay Head to the north, it is easily seen that The Inquirer's regatta will take up the full day.

The Racing Committee of the Island Heights Yacht Club, through a sub-committee consisting of Commodore John C. McAvoy, Chairman; Greg A. Laburn, of the Regatta Committee; and Professor Theodore E. Coggeshall, of Philadelphia, have sent invitations to all owners of boats in these various classes from the upper to the lower end of the bay. They have asked the owners of sailing craft to send with their formal entries their measurement, certified to by the official measurer of the club in which they belong. For power boats they ask all owners to have the yachts at the Island Heights Clubhouse dock on the day previous to the race (Friday, August 20) in order that The Inquirer's special measurer may make an official measurement for his handicap schedule, and save time on the day of the race.

All those who are acquainted with Barnegat Bay say that the best course possible on the Jersey coast has been selected for these races. Cedar Creek Point, a low sandstone point with a sandy beach, making natural barriers for small craft, and a rendezvous from which the race can be watched, is the starting and finishing point. And there is plenty of water for the larger boats, and the broad bay gives ample room.

The Regatta Committee expects at the earliest possible date to give a list of entries. Meantime they are busy answering inquiries and putting the yachtsmen of the bay ready with all points connected with the biggest day's racing of the summer—The Inquirer's cup day.
