INQUIRER REGATTA RECORD-BREAKER FOR NORTH COAST

Mammoth Fleet of Motor and Sail Boats Compete

FAIR WEATHER FAVORED AMATEUR YACHTSMEN

Island Heights Club's Entries Won Five Firsts, Carrying Colors to the Front for Points Scored

ISLAND HEIGHTS, N. J., Aug. 21.—During a gala season, unparaled along the North Jersey coast for one and two decades, fifty-one motor and sail boats, the cream of the local racing yachtsmen of the Island Heights, Teaneck, Sea Side Park, Bayhead, Connetquot Yacht and Gun, Montrossing, Parked River, Lavallette and Cedar Cliffs, today were annually assembled in the mammoth Philadelphia regatta.

Through fair and Teaneck River currents were broken ahead in the course of the day as the speedy boats dashed about the lower bay in driving struggles for handsome gold silver cups and elaborate trophies, offered by The Inquirer and for the mastery of the sailing championship of the season.

Yachtsmen Had Fine Weather.
No better weather ever graced a regatta than that which greeted the yachting crowd, "Knights of the Engines" and "Fleet" of The Inquirer today. There was wind enough to suit the most racing sailor, and the bay, although rough at times, was just heavy enough to make all the pilots of power boats wish they might avoid the responsibility of the same were heaving over whelmingly. There was not an accident or mishap of any consequence, barring the snapping of a mast on Park, or the breaking down of an engine in the bay of the ocean races.

Single Center Board Cut Boats.—Won by Leo Pharis, Island Heights; second, Edward III, Island Heights; third, Mary E. De Leon, Cedar Cliffs and Heights; third.

Cabin Cruising Sloops.—Won by Hubert William Edson, Island Heights; Quaker, Albert Edson, Island Heights; second, Shagan, George Patterson, third.

Open Sloops.—Won by Teaneck, Island Heights; second, Connetquot Yacht and Gun Club, of Beach Haven; second, Marlborough, John Weaver, Sea Side Park; third.

The points won by each club follow: Island Heights, five firsts, four seconds, two thirds; Sea Side Park, one first, one third; Parked River, one first; Teaneck River, one second; Bayhead, one second, two thirds.
